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Introduction

William B. Fitt and Company Auctioneers was established by William Burkitt Fitt c.1840 and was the longest established auctioneering firm in Limerick until its closure in 2002. The business operated for most of this period from 46 O'Connell Street and from the mid 1980's from number 4, the Crescent.

William Gabbett acquired the business in the 1930's, as prior to this he was a partner in the firm. On his death in 1946 his wife ran the business until their son Alec with other family members took over the business in 1948-1950. Until its closure the firm remained in Gabbett family ownership.

The collection includes mainly Auction Grazing books containing details of weekly markets held at the Paddocks, Rutland, dealing in mainly cattle, sheep and pigs and annual sales for Bulls and Pedigree animals. The annual bull sale was the oldest annual bull sales in the country. As these also contain details of grazing sales- the rent of grass for grazing purposes, the collection provides an insight into agricultural practice and land use in county Limerick.

Some volumes also contain details of auctions and other sales handled by the business including furniture sales, clearance sales and property sales. As the firm handled the sale of some of the largest properties in Limerick and Munster, these volumes reflect economic and social trends relating to the transfer of wealth in Limerick and surrounding areas.

Auction Grazing Books (1905 – 1977)

Auction Grazing Books containing details of weekly markets held at the Paddocks, Rutland Street, dealing in mainly cattle, sheep and pigs including annual sales for bulls and pedigree animals. These also detail grazing sales- the rent of grass for grazing purposes. Some volumes also contain details of auctions and other sales handled by the business including furniture sales, clearance sales and property sales. It also contains sales related to the Munster Fair (P47/2 – P47/5) All volumes include an alphabetical index
