To attend to the Limitations of Truth in their pursuit after Wealth —

To be careful to place out Children, of all degrees amongst those Friends whose Care & Example will be most likely to conduce to their Safety, and not to demand exorbitant apprentice fees, lest they frustrate the Care of Friends in this respect; and to prefer such Servants & Apprentices as are Members of our Society —

To endeavour to make way for their Servants to attend Meetings, and to encourage them therein —

To guard carefully against the Introduction of pernicious Books into their Families —

To refrain from being concerned in Lotteries which this Meeting considers as all species of Gaming —
