At a Monthly Meeting of Women Friends held in Limerick 11th month 1793.

The Proceedings of last Meeting with those of last Quarterly Meeting have been read. In pursuance of a Minute made at a foregoing Meeting, Deborah Alexander is with the Unity & Concurrence of this Meeting appointed to succeed Rebecca Murphy in the Station of Overseer, whereby the latter is released from that Service.

The Rules laid down by the National Mens Meeting 1787 for our direction in conducting the Discipline, together with an Epistle from the National halfyears Mens Meeting 5th Month 1772 to the Yearly Womens Meeting held there the same time hath been revised by reading at this time, we hope to edification. A Certificate hath been handed us by Men Friends from County Tipperary Monthly Meeting on behalf of Samuel Reeves his Wife & Nine Children, who have some time since removed thence to reside in this City which was read, & in consequence whereof this Meeting appointed Anna Taverner & Rebecca Harvey to join Men Friends in visiting said Family, to inform ^{them} thereof & communicate any advice that in the freedom of Love may appear suitable.

At a Monthly Meeting of Women Friends held in Limerick 10th of 12th Month 1793.

The Proceedings of last Meeting were read. Account is returned that the visit appointed at last Meeting to be paid to Sam^l Reeves's Family was postponed owing to the indisposition of one friend under the appointment, & the absence of another - it is therefore thought expedient to nominate Sarah Fisher in the room of our friend Anna Taverner (who still continues indisposed) to join Rebecca Harvey in said visit & return account thereof to our next Meeting.

The last Epistle from the National Yearly Womens Meeting held in Dublin, with one from the Yearly Meeting of Women Friends held in Philadelphia last Year have been read at this time, & it is hoped that we may be enabled to profit thereby.

At a Monthly Meeting of Women Friends held in Limerick 1st of 1st Month 1794.

The Proceedings of last Meeting, with those of last Quarterly Meeting held in Waterford have been read. Rebecca Harvey returns account that she joined Men Friends in paying a visit to Sam^l Reeves's Family in consequence of a Certificate received; the other friend appointed at last Meeting was prevented accompanying them by indisposition.

The four Queries ~~read~~ with the answers annexed thereto were read, & answers to the former drawn up to the ensuing Quarterly Meeting intended to be held in Cork; & Mary Taverner Rebecca Harvey & Deborah Alexander having expressed their intention of attending said Meeting if nothing happens to prevent: We therefore nominate any two of them our representatives from this ~~Meeting~~ Deborah Robinson having (by her Marriage with Joseph Robinson) removed from hence to reside within the compass of County Tipperary Meeting — Rebecca Harvey & Deborah Alexander are therefore requested to prepare a Certificate on her behalf & bring it to our next Monthly Meeting for approbation & signing.

At a Monthly Meeting of Women Friends held in Limerick 11th of 2^d Month 1791.

The proceedings of last Meeting with those of last Quarterly Meeting held in Cork were read. The Certificate desired at last Meeting on behalf of our friend Deborah Robinson has been handed us & being read & approved in this Meeting was sent to Men Friends for their approbation which was returned to us approved & signed by their Clerk. & being now signed by our Women Friends it is (by desire of Men Friends) to be again returned to their record & forward — An Epistle from the

Yearly Meeting of Men Friends held in London 1792 addressed to the Quarterly Meetings of Friends in Great Britain & Ireland & one from said Meeting last Year to the half-Year Meeting of Friends in Ireland, together with the proceedings of last National Men's Meeting held in Dublin which were sent us by Men Friends have been read at this time & by desire of Men Friends this Meeting adjourned to this day two weeks.

25th of 2^d Month — Friends met pursuant to adjournment — The Epistles from England with the proceedings of the National Meeting which were read at a preceding sitting of this Meeting, have been again reviewed amongst us at this time — It is earnestly desired that the weighty instructive advices communicated to us thereby may make profitable, lasting impressions on our Minds individually.

account to our next Monthly Meeting

At a Monthly Meeting of Women Friends
held in Limerick 15th of 1st Month 1794

of last Quarterly Meeting held in Cork were read.

pay a visit to Susanna Newitt, returns account that

Queries have been read, & written answers drawn up
