Supporting the Youth Sector



- Updated <u>Statutory guidance to Local</u>
 <u>Authorities</u> on their responsibility to ensure sufficient youth services in their areas including a <u>peer review</u> programme.
- Over £500k for Local and Regional youth sector infrastructure (Local Youth Partnerships and Regional Youth Work Units)
- £800k for more than **500 bursaries** for youth work qualifications

More support for those that need it most





- Building Futures Programme 5,000 young people will receive intensive mentoring and careers coaching through and allocation of £15 million dormant assets funding to Youth Futures Foundation
- Summer Jobs Programme partnering with the Youth Endowment Fund to deliver a three-year Summer Jobs Programme providing six-week employment placements for 2,600 young people at risk of involvement in crime:
- UK Year of Service nine to 12-month paid work placements for at least 100 18-24 year olds.





THE DORMANT ASSETS SCHEME

WHAT ARE DORMANT ASSETS?

The 2008 **Dormant Bank and Building Society Accounts Act** provides for dormant funds to be pooled together in a Reclaim Fund and spent on addressing social challenges. These accounts hold less than £100 on average and won't have been touched for at least 15 years.



No transactions for 15 years, and attempts to trace owners and reunify funds have been unsuccessful




Firms **voluntarily transfer** their dormant assets in bulk to the Reclaim Fund. Customer data remains with the bank or building society



Customers can reclaim their funds at any point from their bank, who is then reimbursed by the Reclaim Fund. Since the beginning of the scheme, reclaim rates have held at only 5%

Overview of distribution





- Expansion on the scheme in 2022 to include a wider range of financial assets
- Consultation on the causes leading to a fourth cause -Community Wealth Funds
- Secondary Legislation being debated on 4 causes presently

Big Society Capital and the Access Foundation have worked since 2011 to tackle challenges such as homelessness and access to community energy using social investment. Two new, independent organisations were established in 2019: Youth Futures Foundation and Fair4All Finance. Youth Futures Foundation tackle youth unemployment, while Fair4All Finance support the financial wellbeing of individuals in vulnerable circumstances.

Dormant Assets Scheme: Key Points

Key Principles



- Voluntary Participation
- Reunification First
- Full Restitution in Perpetuity
- Additionality

Dormant Assets Funding



The Scheme offers a type of **long-term funding** that is not typical of other grant agreements, enabling independent and expert-led solutions to long-term strategic challenges in England. Funding must adhere to the principle of **additionality**, ie for projects, or aspects of projects, for which funds would be unlikely to be made available by a government department or devolved administration.

c.£350m available 2024 - 2028



The Dormant Assets Scheme is expected to release £350 million for England over 2024 and 2028. The government intends to allocate this equally between the four causes meaning £87.5 million for the provision of services, facilities or opportunities to meet the needs of young people. £15m has already been allocated for Building Futures Programme in 2023.

Statement of Intent 2024 - 2028



Engagement with sector on setting broad parameter for youth spend rather than the mechanism of delivery. Already engaged with sector and young people identifying 3 key areas for further exploration: Mental Health, Youth (Un)employment, Nature/Environmental based learning. Intention to publish Statement of Intent for 2024 - 2028 next year.
