



2. CAREER CONFIDENCE

Despite a large proportion of respondents feeling confident about entering the workplace and securing their dream job, there is a lack of confidence in their skillset generally, with 63% saying their skills (or lack thereof) will be what holds them back when looking for graduate employment.



3. EMPLOYER= UNIVERSITY COLLABORATION

Students are looking for more opportunities to engage with employers while at university. 78% want more work experience opportunities from employers, and 57% are keen to attend more face-to-face events on campus.

Based on the data we have collected, we believe that students will be more likely to attend employability events if employers were also present.

THE SKILLS DISCREPANCY

When asked to rate their skills, communication scored lowest amongst students and graudates, with teamwork and problem solving also in the bottom three.

This creates a discrepancy between what we see in our mock assessment centre data. Over the course of the previous 12 months we've analysed over 3,000 student scorecards and found that communication is the skill students demonstrate best.
