

Current practice to lessen transmission risk - Heliport

Ref.	Measure Description	Date published
1	Pre-mob communication carried out with all personnel intending to travel offshore before they mobilise from their home location	
2	Conduct pre-mob COVID-19 screening where possible – anyone testing positive or showing symptoms given appropriate advice and support	
3	Heliport staff are subject to daily temperature screening upon arrival for work	
4	Flight departure times arranged to reduce the number of passengers in heliport at the same time	
5	Signage to encourage social distancing practices	
6	Ground markings to encourage social distancing at check-in	
7	Increased cleaning and sanitisation regimes in place	
8	Tanoy announcements reminding passengers of social distancing guidance	
9	Personal security searches will continue with use of wands where available Security checks to be confirmed with CAA	
10	Security personnel will use hand sanitiser between searches	
11	Passengers to stand with back to security officer during body searches	
12	Security and check-in staff to wear disposable gloves when checking Vantage cards	
13	Notice board dedicated to COVID-19 information available for passengers	
14	Single-use, disposable cups etc to be used in passenger canteen	
15	Social distancing during safety brief where practicable	
16	Check-in staff to be separated from passengers by screen or face shield	
17	Virustatic snoods issued to all passengers for during transit to and from installations – issued for each trip but also to be worn in heliport	

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
