CONFERENCE '86

BLGC together with Black workers from LAGER/LER, GALOP, Waltham Forest Blacklesbian Group, individuals, and the EMU of the GLC co-ordinated a one day Conference entitled "Black Communities: Living & Struggling together". The Conference took place on Sunday 16th February at Brixton Recreaction Centre. "All too often we are too caught up in activities to stop and discuss how we relate to one another. The results are often disastrous." At this Conference we had an opportunity to confront some of the things that divide us, as well as reaffirm the links and solidarity that already sustain us. Between 100-125 people attended. Workshops examined "myths" and "cultural differences" around our sexualities, and relationships: lovers, friends, and family. REPORT BACK FROM ST. LOUIS (USA!)

The National Coalition of Black Lesbians and Gays held their first National Conference in St.Louis, Missouri at the end of November 1985. The theme was "Black Pride and Solidarity: the new movement of Black Lesbians and Gays". BLGC sent two representatives, one of our women workers, and a man from our management committee.

The Conference was held over two and a half days, at the Sheraton Hotel, Downtown, St.Louis. An introductory 'Keynote address' was given by Henry Chinn, under the title "Under the Shroud of Colonialism will we choose Death or will we choose Life?". After a short break the entertainment for that evening began with Irare Sabasu - a poet from New York City, George Bellinger - a dancer, and Gwen Avery - a well-known singer from the West Coast.

Workshops covered included "Spirituality as a liberating Force" (- this was an exciting and stimulating talk given by Myrna Bain; and "Black Lesbian and Gay Oral History" - wich gave us the opportunity to talk with Mable Hampton.

Another keynote address was made by Gwendolyn Rodgers. Gwen had attended the confrence in Narobi, Kenya that marked the close of the United Nations Decade for Women, and re-confirmed 'our' presence at 'that' conference and in that part of the world.

A banquet was held to honor Mable Hampton who is an 83year old Blacklesbian. Ms Hampton was presented with a special award, which is named after her and will be awarded annually for contributions to the struggle. Entertainment after the conference included a fantastic line-up of one of our Reps., personal SHEroes, and the opportunity to experience an evening of Blacklesbian and Blackgay talent. There was poetry reading/performance, excerpts from plays, and singers. It was at the banquet that our Rep's., introduced themselves, and briefly outlined recent events in London re: Black Peoples' March and surrounding events.

The Sunday workshop on "Black Lesbian Leadership" was inspiring and exciting, with input from various sistahs on the herstory of organizing and maintaining groups. In the plenary session, we had an opportunity to thank the conference for their warm welcome, and deliver messages of solidarity.

Once again we would like to thank those who supported the fundraising events which helped to pay air fares and expenses.

So far articles covering the conferences have appeared in "Capital Gay"; and will be in " WE ARE HERE: Black Feminist Newsletter"; "OUTWRITE" and hopefully other publications.

ILIS COMFERENCE

International Lesbian Information Service is holding its eighth annual conferenc in Geneva, Switzerland on 28-31 March 1986. They have informed us that there will be Lesbians from Mexico, Chile, the Dominican Republic, Brazil, Kenya, Nigeria, Thailand and Blacklesbians from the U.S.A., as well as Blacklesbians from London and hopefully Liverpool.

The workshop "Lesbians in the 'Work'-World" will be facilitated by a Black woman, as well as one on "Inter-relationship of 'ism's" (e.g. Racism, Anti-semitism, Heterosexism and Classism etc.)

There will also be a workshop "on Third World Lesbians, following the proposition of a lesbian from Thailand.". BLGC is not involved in anyway with this event other than that we have been circulating information as we've received it to groups in London as well as Sheffield, Leicester, Liverpool and Manchester. We are organising a meeting, in London for sistahs planning to attend, to share information and to co-ordinate our presense and impact. For further info contact Dorothea/Savi at BLGC (project).
