

BLGC CONNENT

We envisage that there will be a huge contingent of Blacklesbians and Blackgay men marching together under the Black Lesbian and Gay Centre bannner which will be ready at the rendezvous point in Hyde Park. Don't forget to bring your cameras with enough film to produce a movie! We would like to produce a slide show so if you are taking slides (movie?) or stills, please help us to document this event. Please try to be around at 1.30pm for a huge group photograph near Speakers Corner where we will all be assembling.

Who is documenting your history for posterity? BE THERE - OR YOU'LL BE A VERY BORING PERSON if you don't phone us with an excuse for us to challenge.

We here at BLGC don't feel that there is anything wrong with commemorating the Stonewall riots in this way. There were Blackgay men involved in the defence of that pub /bar in New York City's Greenwich Village in 1969 which was being defended with honor under a police seige, - threatening the very liberty of the patrons gathered there (of whom we are now very proud). It was this event that triggered uprisings in many European cities and gave visibility to an extant people who were once isolated by silence in bustling communities. Never again.

If you (in error) are choosing to avoid the Lesbian and Gay Pride March from Hyde Park to Jubillee Gardens (GLC); via Park Lane, Piccadilly, Haymarket, Trafalgar Square, Duncannon St, Strand, Waterloo Bridge, ...then please attempt to be

at one of those points waiting to wave to us as we all walk by. At approxmiately 2.30pm we should be in Trafalgar Square. (If in doubt ask a policeman.) It is a huge event and you can always say to friends who spotted you "it wasn't me" - especially if you are wearing dark glasses.

We each have difficulties with our own Black community at large who choose to believe that we have been brainwashed by white people 'into this thing'.

As we continue participating and becoming visible in Pride marches or campaings and initiating our own Blacklesbian and Blackgay forms of protests; Be it "ROOT" magazine October 1985, BBC's Ebony programme which was eventually screened on 13th March 1987 (- after we were promised the programme would be broadcast in November 1986), Haringey Black Action - a National Demonstration against bigotry, and homophobia Racism, (2.5.87),Peckham Black Lesbian Group's lobby of Southwark Borough Council's Labour group in support of a Lesbian and Gay Unit (17.6.87), ...we must always bear in mind that our siblings need special attention. We live in a hostile society and every bit of visibility counts. You can help by being there on the Pride March this year!

Blackgay Men's Support Network is coming together! It is planned that there will be a phoneline operating at least one evening each week with Blackgay men manning the line. The operation will be based in Lambeth for the time being and there will be an application to the Council for setting up and running the project. The BGMS Network will publish its findings twice yearly, and ensure that the experience of isolated Blackgay men has a voice. The project will not deal with enquries from 'agencies' as its sole purpose will be a facility for individuals. The project will attempt to contact the Black young men who write to boxnumber ads in the 'gay' press who may become 'lost' in a totally white scene. BGMS Network will have its own mail-box and telephone line. If you are interested in being involved and doing some volunteer work then you should attend the first public meeting being organized in Lambeth to look at the draft constitution on Tuesday 21st July 1987. *******THE HBA DEMO THAT WAS******

The HARINGEY BLACK ACTION NATIONAL DEMONSTRATION (Sat 2nd May) was highly successful. A very meaningful event which was probably the reason that Bernie Grant (MP) got elected by the Labour party voters. The people of Tottenham wittenessed our presence and we have no doubt were won over by our peaceful demonstration. A special mention to Dolly Kiffin who gave a speech at the rally rousing emphasising the commonalities between the experience of Black people and the experiences of gay people. The Broadwater Farm Youth Association accompanied the march with dubstyle music. Some of us audiophiles turned a blind ear to some of the tunes which were suspect if not downright offensive.

There were between 3,000 to 5,000 of us with a happy contingent of Blacklesbians and Blackgay leading the 'parade' as if we were in one of those Deep South Mardi Gras.

PACIE 2 COL 2 There was also six or seven 'Parents Rights Group' demonstrators. I heard that one policeman told them that they had better get their together! This they tried to do. The day before the National Elections here, there was some £100,000 worth of advertising spent by a group calling themselves The Committee for a Free Britain which placed adverts in The Star, The Sun, and the Mirror. "Hello my name is Betty Sheridan. I live in Haringey and I am scared". She goes on to indicate that she is scared because if Labour gets in they will teach her two kids gay and lesbian lessons instead of giving them proper lessons? Basically what she was revealing was her own lack of a (dare I say it) 'a basic heterosexual education'. Bearing all that in mind, what ever happned to the National Front? How come there were no 'out Front' candidates? Which party do you think is hoarding those horrors? Are those characters given a welcome in the Labour party now? Is it that they are entertained by the policies of the Liberal Alliance? The fascists don't wear the red rose. I would contend therefore that another political party is giving a haven to those offensive and racist policies on repatriation. I hope siblings, none of us made a mistake on the ballot paper by voting for a party which had no positive reference to lesbian and gay rights. We are with it for a dynamic five years. We may not be here as an due to funding organization imposed restrictions by government during this next five years. Just be sure siblings, your vote is not wasted at the time of the by-elections opportunity next arises for us to make an audible shout from our quiet collected voices. It is not our current policy to put someone on the mailing list without their consent. We take it that all our 500 names and addresses are held with addressees consent. It is a simple matter to have your name and address deleted from the mailing list if your home becomes situation at 'complicated' by relatives visiting. We have the ability to suspend your mail-out for any particular month upon request.
