DISABILITY The first ever national conference for lesbians and gays with disabilities is being organised for Spring 1988 in Manchester, A group of disabled lesbians and gays got together as a result of a fringe meeting at the National Legislation for Lesbian and Gay rights Conference held in May this year. Lesbians and gays with disabili-ties felt tired of being excluded from lesbian and gay activities because of lack of access to buildings, transport and informaabout the events. The conference planning group call on able-bodied lesbians and gays to actively support this initiative. They desperately need three things: Firstly, money - for things like interpreters, and transport. Secondly, they need maximum publicity in lesbian and gay magazines, Thirdly, "they need help, "We can't do this by ourselves, the world in which we live is organised to suit able-bodied people, not us." The conference planning group is organising meetings for heterosexual disabled people and able bodied lesbians and gays who want to support them in this initiative. STRANGE GOINGS-ON

Housing Association Stonewall houses young lesbians and gays, On 4th September 1987, a Blackgay worker there was called to a meeting with four members of the management committee and suspended without pay, On 24th September, he went to a disciplinary hearing, He and a union official were given just one hour to read through and prepare responses to a pile of papers containing accusations, was then sacked, Before dismissal, the ACTSS 1/1111 branch had passed a resolution which read in part: "This branch notes that a black shop steward, Alex Owolade, a worker at Stonewall Housing Association, was suspended without pay and without any prior verbal or written warning on 4th September.
