We are proud this year to host the very first Europride, an international celebration of lesbian and gay culture being held in the last two weeks in June.

Europride is being held in a time of rapid political change some of it good some of it bad. The recent decriminalisation of male homosexuality in the Isle of Man after a long difficult struggle is an example of success in the campaign to equalize the civil rights of gay men, lesbians and bisexuals. The cost has been high and we must never forget that decriminalisation is far from full equality; in the Isle of Man already it would appear that the authorities are carrying out vendettas against people prominent in the campaign. In its rush towards further integration, the European Community, although it does have potential for positive action, may end up aggravating these problems with it's exclusive "Fortress Europe" plans. And Europride, although being inaugurated in 1992, is about celebrating our lives, loves and cultures not celebrating EC single markets.

In this light we invite you to join us in London on June 27th standing shoulder to shoulder celebrating and sharing our cultures and experiences. Europride will operate on every level social, political, cultural and sexual, but it will only happen by your participation, it will only become what you want it to be if you are involved.

So once again welcome to Europride. Join us.

EUROPEIN THE PINK

A guide to Lesbian and **Gay Rights** to Europe

ne total population of Europe, including all the ex-Soviet republics, is about 800 million people. Of these, an estimated 80 million Europeans are predominantly or exclusively lesbian or gay, and further 120 million are estimated to be bisexual for all or part of their lives.

Almost every European country has, at some point in its history, decreed a total ban on homosexuality. In most cases, the ban solely to sex between men. Only seven countries have also had a complete prohibition on lesbianism - Austria, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Finland, Hungary, Romania and Sweden. The first European countries to decriminalize homosexual relations were France in 1791, Belgium and Luxemburg in 1792, the Netherlands in 1811 and Spain in 1822.

Today, the overwhelming majority of European countries have at least partially legalized same-sex relationships. Only seven countries still have a total ban on male homosexual acts -Cyprus, Estonia, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, and the former Soviet Union except the Ukraine (plus the former Yugoslav republics of Bosnia-Herzegovina, Macedonia and Serbia). In the sole case of Romania, the proscriptions against homo- sexuality also explicitly render lesbianism

Ages of Consent

Seven countries have repealed the complete ban on homosexual contacts, but still enforce a discriminatory age of consent which is higher for homosexuals than for heterosexuals (on average it is 18 years for same-sex relationships compared with 15 years forsex between men and women)-Austria, Bulgaria, Finland, Hungary, Iceland, Luxemburg, and the United Kingdom (plus the ex-Yugoslav republic of Croatia and the western half of Germany). the UK has the highest age of consent for homosexuals anywhere in Europe: 21 years. The discriminatory ages of consent also apply to lesbians in three of these countries -Bulgaria, Finland, and Hungary.

Seventeen countries have equal ages of consent for heterosexuals and lesbians and gay men, with the average age being 15 years - Albania, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Greece, Italy, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, and the Ukraine (plus the ex-Yugoslav republics of Slovenia and Montenegro and the eastern half of Germany). Spain has the lowest common age of consent at 12 years. The Netherlands doesn't prosecute sex with 12-15 year olds unless there is a complaint. In Albania and Italy, the age of consent is 14 years for heterosexuals and homosexuals alike. The legal codes of the most countries do not specifically refer to lesbianism. In practice, the age of consent for sexual relations between women is usually deemed to be the same as that for heterosexual women.

Equality & Protection

Anti-discrimination protection for lesbians and gay men is enforced in five countries - Denmark, France, Netherlands, Norway and Sweden. The judicial interpretation of the constitution of the Netherlands, and specific laws in the other four countries, variously make it an offence to discriminate against lesbians and gay men in employment, the provision of goods and services, and access to public facilities. Similar comprehensive anti-discrimination legislation is currently being proposed to the Belgian and Dutch parliaments, and is also included in the draft constitution of the eastern German state of Brandenburg.

V Laws against public insults and incitement to hatred on the grounds of a person's sexual orientation exist in three countries - Denmark, Ireland and Norway. The introduction of comparable legislation is under consideration in Belgium and the Netherlands.

V Political asylum has been granted to lesbians and gay men, on the grounds that they were at risk of persecution in their home countries because of their sexuality, by six states - Austria, Denmark, Germany, Netherlands, Norway and Sweden (though asylum is granted at the government's discretion, on a case-by-case basis, and not as a statutory right).

▼ Lesbian and gay partnerships are officially recognized in two countries: Danish homosexual couples have the right to civil marriage at a registry office and enjoy all the legal rights of married heterosexuals, except for child adoption. Swedish lesbian and gay lovers who live together enjoy the same substantial legal rights as cohabiting heterosexual couples. Additionally, although not explicitly recognised in law, Dutch same-sex partners who confirm their relationship by legal contract are eligible for some of the rights granted to married heterosexual people. Italy, there is a "de facto" legal recognition of homosexual couples at the level of municipal administration (though this recognition grants no legal rights to the partners concerned), France, Netherlands, Norway and Sweden are now looking at Danish-style civil marriage legislation that would allow lesbian and gay partners to register their relationship and enjoy legal status similar to married heterosexuals.

- V Immigration and residence rights on the basis of a committed homosexual relationship are available. at the discretion of the authorities, to the foreign partners of lesbians and gay men in four countries - Denmark, Netherlands, Norway, and Sweden,
- Membership in the armed forces is open to homosexuals in eleven countries - Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Finland, France, Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland - providing sexual

> relationships take place outside of barracks during off-duty hours. In the German armed forces, however, homosexuals are barred from officer rank.

Discrimination

The promotion of homosexuality is banned in three countries -Austria, Finland, and the United Kingdom. In addition, the Turkish government bought charges of

'spreading homosexual information' against gay activists in 1989.

The UK has laws which explicitly, or in practice, discriminate against homosexuals than any other European nation, East or West. More gay and bisexual men are

prosecuted in the UK for consenting homosexual behaviour than in any other country in Europe.

- The UK is the only European country to have introduced new antigay laws (Section 28) in the last decade. The enactment of this legislation goes against the liberalising trend towards greater legal equality for homosexuals throughout the rest of the continent.
- There are only three places in Europe where anal intercourse is still punishable by life imprisonment - Ireland, Gibraltar and the Isle of Man. In all three cases, the anti-gay laws were originally introduced by the British during the period of colonial rule. In Gibraltar and the Isle of Man, Britain still has ultimate responsibility for their observance of international human rights agreements. So far, it has declined to intervene to ensure their compliance with agreements such as the European Convention on Human Rights which has been interpreter as requiring states to decriminalize homosexuality.
- V Denmark, Netherlands, Norway and Sweden are the most liberal countries in Europe with regard to recognizing and protecting the human rights of their lesbian and gay citizens. These countries provide concrete examples of the progressive and practical legislation that can be enacted to ensure homosexual equality.

a threat to be taken seriously

ascism and the threat it represents to the lesbian and gay community needs no introduction. For the best part of the last 12 years organised fascism has not been very visible in Britain, the various groups having spent most of their time fighting each other rather than trying to spread their poisonous ideas.

Recent events in Europe however require us to seriously reappraise our own situation. In France and Germany the neo-nazism which has long fed on wide spread racism and antisemetism, sadly present in almost all societies and now strengthened by the "Fortress Europe" mentality, is increasingly turning its attention towards the lesbian and gay community. A glance at almost any lesbian and gay publication's world news section will testify to the increasing attacks on gay bars and meeting places by neo-nazis.

Up to the present Britain has clearly been an exception, the British National party, the largest and best organised of the neo-nazi groups here, has nothing like the support that the National Front had in the late seventies or that of it's counterparts in the rest of Europe. It is important when looking at the growth of fascism that we are neither alarmist nor

complacent; but we must never forget that when the conditions are right, things can change, and change very rapidly.

It is clear that the nazis though small in number in Britain are attempting to gain confidence from their counterparts successes in Europe. The most obvious example being the recent visit of Jean Marie Le Pen, leader of the French national front.

Nazis have never succeeded in Britain; this is not because fascism is somehow alien to the British character, fascism is as British as roast beef; their lack of success has been due to the unification and mobilisation of a wide variety of groups against them.

Stopping the rise of fascism will not be easy, it will require a lot of determination, a lot of hard work. It will mean building an anti nazi movement with the broadest possible appeal, similar to that formed in the seventies. But this time the movement must cut across national boundaries, Europe and the rest of the world must unite to purge this abomination. The alternative, brought about by apathy and in action, does not bear thinking about.



- Remove or conceal all valuables, including driving documents and personal correspondence.
- Lock all doors, boot/tailgate.
- Set immobiliser/alarm if fitted.



Of course, you're not into are you ?

so maybe you're just a little interested in some slap and tickle, but nothing serious. And perhaps you've wrestled with your partner during a sex session, even held him/her down and forced a kiss on

But no, you're not into SM. And anyway some of the lesbian and gay papers have said its now illegal.

The police Operation Spanner did bring to trial fifteen gay men involved in consensual SM with some receiving convictions of up to 4 years in jail. But those papers that said SM is now illegal are wrong

The judge's ruling is clear that fantasy sex, role playing and dressing up in leather/rubber/fetish gear are outside the scope of the law. Bondage falls outside of the judgement too, if there are no lasting marks and no severe pain is caused. It's likely that mild corporal punishment (spanking), where there is no injury, is ok too.

What is likely to be considered illegal (even if you consent, even plead for it) is heavy beatings which leave lasting marks, anything which might be deemed to be torture or the infliction of more than momentary pain; any activities which leave scars, bruises, etc (Careful with those love bites!).

I don't want to encourage you to break the law as it now stands. However, no prosecution can take place without evidence against you. Evidence in the Spanner case was a video and the men's own statements, (they didn't think they were doing anything illegal). Other evidence might be photographs or letters. So avoid these.

A Pride

Europride 1992 presents us with a unique and entirely new experience. For the first time ever, we, lesbians, gay men and bisexuals from all over Europe and beyond, are invited to take part in a common celebration and festival of our lives and sexuality.

This great opportunity can help us today to realise the richness diversity and similarities of our "trans-boundaries" community. Meeting together is a first and necessary step which will lead us to greater common consciousness, larger exchanges, and


may be more developments and concerted actions.

There could be a slight paradox in the fact that this first European gathering is taking place in a country which is not exactly perceived as the most progressive both about lesbian and gay rights and European co-operation. But it's just an apparent one, because Britain has probably the most important and active gay community in Europe, and London looks very much like its real gay capital.

A first attempt to broaden a nation-

al Pride out to a

European level was made in Antwerpen on May 5th 1990. Three thousand people from Germany, The Netherlands and Belgium took part in this event. I recalled this to members of the London Pride Committee, when I met them in August of the same year. And I added that the London Pride, having become in the late eighties the biggest and the best organised pride celebration in Europe, was in the ideal position to host a truly pan-European Pride. I attended the European ILGA conference the following winter in Copenhagen where Europride 92 received the backing





of this international gay organisation. Eighteen months later, the work of hundreds of dedicated volunteers has made this bright, great day possible.

Throughout Europe the rights of gay men and lesbians vary so much, from none to a plethora of rights. That will obviously have to be fought for and rectified. But decriminalisation or legalisation of sexual acts between sexual acts between people of the same sex does not guarantee social acceptance and recognition of homosexuality. We, lesbians and gay men, cannot accept just to be tolerated. We form an essential part of society and deserve more. This simple and important fact has not been fully acknowledged by any European country, no matter how "progressive". We want to be accepted as full citizens with full equal rights. We want also our differences to be recognised and respected, and our

specific needs properly addressed. That's certainly an important common goal shared by us all, despite our national disparities.

Pride Day gives us the immense pleasure of being ourselves together freely expressing our affection, love and care. It also gives us the most enjoyable occasion of increasing our self-confidence, strength and visibility.


Let's rejoice, celebrate and party now. But be careful. Such a great powerful event could alter our lives a great deal. That's what I'm hoping.

Sources of Information

Buy Time Out or City Limits weekly magazine (available in newsagents). Both feature a lesbian and gay section which describes a selection of the main bars and clubs as well as day by day listings of various events. The monthly Gay Times (also from newsagents) and the community newspapers Capital Gay, Pink Paper and Boyz (free in most Pubs and Clubs) are also very good sources of information

Getting Around

You will need a a street finder map to get around A-Z is easy to buy and use. Remember street names are often repeated in the London area so you will need to know the postal district (e.g. SW1, EC1 etc)

London's black cabs are reliable but can be expensive. Minicabs are plentiful but can be unreliable. Be especially careful of minicabs waiting outside clubs always agree a price in advance and try not to travel alone. The best way to get around is on the Underground and London Buses: the network is neither cheap nor wonderfully efficient but it does work! Ask for free bus and tube maps at central

underground stations. Also ask for details about Travelcards which can be purchased on a daily or weekly

Somewhere to stay

It is likely that the few genuinely gay hotels in London will be booked out during EuroPride. If you need assistance with hotel or bed and breakfast accommodation, the London Tourist Board can help with advice and a booking service from 09.00 to 18.00 hrs on 071-730-3488. EuroPride has some cheap accommodation negotiated call on 071-733-2902.

Where To Go






The lesbian scene in London is pretty fast moving, but Klio disco at the Lesbian and Gay Centre is a popular choice for a Saturday night, and the Orchid Bar in the same venue is women only Tues-Sun eves. Look out for Venus Rising held the first Wednesday of every month at the Fridge in Brixton: this is Europe's largest women only club. Call in at Silver Moon women's bookshop in WC2 or Sisterwrite in N1 both of which have an excellent range of lesbian publications. For sunbathing, swimming and a sisterly time the Women's Pond at Hampstead Heath is always popular in fine weather. Topless sunbathing is acceptable at this public venue, but rather strict standards of behaviour otherwise apply. Don't stand up and jiggle about!

Dancing

Heaven is still the biggest and is mixed on Wednesdays and gay men only on Saturdays. The Bell is mixed lesbian and gay dance pub, whilst Bang and Copas are the "original" gay discos. Look out for the one-nighters, one of which is likely to be the hottest venue at any one time. Try Trade, the FF Club or the Gardening Club and watch the press for the latest hype.

Food, books, film, theatre

Try First Out for vegetarian food. Village Soho, The Angel and The Edward are all bars which also offer food in a cafe atmosphere. Roys and Stephs are popular gay restaurants.

For lesbian and gay reading, there is nothing to beat Gay's the Word although most good bookshops now have lesbian and gay sections, as do some of the public libraries. The Ritzy, The Scala and The Rio are all independent cinemas which regularly have seasons of lesbian and gay films, and the theatre fringe venues which most often feature lesbian and gay drama are the Drill Hall and the Oval House: see press for details.

The main cinemas and theatres are usually presenting at least one major production of direct interest to lesbian and gays, even if not all of the people involved are out! Check the listings.

Living with HIV and AIDS

The lesbian and gay community in London is proud of the excellent services which it has created in response to the challenge of HIV and AIDS, and visitors will all be made welcome by following: Body Positive provides a range of drop-in and







There has always been enterainment on Pride; even before it was called Pride as such, the picnics, "be-ins" and marches of the early 1970s were accompanied by buskers, sing-alongs and street theatre. And by and large those entertainers, in turn were part of the communities which were demostrating.

Although Pride itself is no longer geared to a set of political demands, I try in the cabaret programme to preserve some of that sprit and those roots. I think of the Cabaret Tent as the lesgay equivalent of ENSA; we're there to entertain the troops. Most of the year you will find them performing for womens' centres, gaysocs, other local Pride programmes, or in "alternative" music or comedy venues, but always as openly lesbian and gay performers exploring themes which are directly relevant to our lives.

For this reason I try to emphasise as much as possible original acts using their own material. I also try to find room for the avowedly "amateur" (not a derogatory word in my book), the one-off and the distinctly quirky.

I also try to give an opportunity for performers from outside London to "show their wares" before a wider audience than they might otherwise find; largely unacknowledged and unrewarded, up and down the country.

At the time I'm writing this, the Cabaret Programme has yet to be finalised. But I can promise you performers from Newcastle, Leeds, Birmingham, Nottingham, Brighton and Norfolk. I can promise you a few things which draw on all these things but defy categories.

Oh yes – and Viv Acious to compere as usual; we couldn't keep her away!

International cooperation is what Europride is all about. It's the latest in a long line of lesbian, gay and bisexual initiatives reaching across the restrictions imposed on us by national boundaries and, like many of them, started in Britain. Is it because of our own relative level of repression that we reach out to others? Perhaps that leads us to value contact with other countries' lesbians, gay men and bisexuals.

One of the first, and most successful, cross-country lesbian and gay coalitions is the International Lesbian and Gay Association (ILGA). founded in Britain fourteen years ago. It's grown to a world-wide federation of all kinds of lesbian, gay and bisexual groups, with almost 300 member groups in nearly fifty countries. Associate membership, open to any group supporting our human rights, has been taken up by cities, trade unions and civil rights organisations of all

ILGA works to support the growth of the lesbian and gay movement in each member country and also to represent our concerns at international level, with bodies like the United

Nations, the World Health Organisation and Amnesty International. It takes action at all levels, from street demonstrations against executions in Iran or Section 28 to regular attendance at the UN in New York. Annual World Conferences bring together several hundred activists from Argentina to Zimbabwe to share strategies, plan campaigns and just have fun together. Regional conferences in Latin America, Asia, Eastern Europe and all of Europe have helped strengthen ties in those areas.

ILGA has always been strong in Europe, where there is the longest tradition of lesbian and gay activism. The Scandinavian groups are coming up to their 50th birthdays soon- an enviable record. The past few years has seen a huge growth in groups in the Eastern countries- Poland. Czechoslovakia and all the countries of the old Soviet Union. Old and new activists join together to lobby the European institutions, such as the council of Europe, the European Community and the new Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe, to defend and promote our rights. We meet annually around New

Year in the all-European conference: in 1992/3 it will be held in Brussels and the year after that, it will come to London for the first time. And anyone passing through Paris in the third week of July should drop in on our 1992 World Conference and get to know the widest assortment of lesbians, gay men and bisexuals you're ever likely to find.

ILGA has supported the concept and growth of Europride from the start. We support any chance for

lesbians, gay men and bisexuals to celebrate our diversity and to break down the barriers between countries; we support any initiative that encourages people to learn about lesbians and gay men and their lives elsewhere; and we support it as a demonstration of our visibility and our love of life in the face of hatred and bigotry. In a world of AIDS and

queerbashing, of legal oppression and social repression, we need every chance for a positive celebration, a reaffirmation that our love and our lives are important and worthwhile.

ILGA members from many countries will be in London for Europride and we hope that many Londoners and other Britons will, in turn, travel to the Europrides that follow throughout the continent in the years to come. And we welcome other British groups into membership, alongside Pride,







Celebrate the lives we've made for ourselves

It's an amazing time to be involved in the Bisexual Movement. Over this year we've had new publications in the UK (BIFROST and BI US) and in the US (ANYTHING THAT MOVES, and the ground breaking collection BI ANY OTHER NAME); where once there was only the annual National Bisexual Conference, this year has seen a flourishing of sites of bi-activity: a weekly bi nightspot in London, over twenty local bi groups around Britain, the first annual NUS Bisexual Conference, two Bisexual Quaker Forums, two one-day conferences on Bisexual Political Activism - and more to come. Last October I was in Amsterdam at the First International Bisexual Conference, and this year the Second will be held in the UK.

There's been a long- and sad- history of friction between lesbians and gay men, and bisexual people. Nobody ever said working together would be easy. But now as much as ever bisexual people recognise the importance - and the history - of our involvement in lesbian and gay communities. An involvement that goes hand-in-hand with building our own communities as well. Of course, that's the bi way : not one or the other, but always BOTH. For us, freedom means not freedom to choose between options, but freedom for all people to enjoy all options.

For me, Pride has always been the most powerful and moving symbol I have for a willingness to be together, whatever the differences. Here you have people, often with little in common, and much to separate them. But we all march together to celebrate the lives we've made for ourselves, to declare our love of our own sex, and to affirm our lesbian sisters and gay brothers as lovers, friends, allies, and comrades in the struggle for liberation.

Bisexual people haven't always been as visible at Pride as we will be this year. And everyone's heard that bisexuals aren't really committed anyway, so maybe nobody expected us to come in the first place. After all, unless we had made ourselves badges or T-shirts (when did you last see bisexual merchandise on sale?) people have probably assumed we were lesbian or gay.

But we've always been there. (If you've been on Pride before, we marched beside you, chanted with you, served you food, announced you at the platform, helped set up your stall, talked with you over a drink, staffed the creche...)

For many lesbians and gay men this will sound like infiltration and deception. But if we've been hidden it's been because of other people's assumptions about who we were, and if we've kept quiet it's been because we haven't always felt safe and welcome. Now bisexual people are feeling prouder than ever, with more than ever to celebrate. We'll be out there to celebrate our differences along with our solidarity. And that means both the differences between lesbians, gay men, and bisexual people, and the differences amongst ourselves.

We're celebrating our involvement in the communities that lesbians, gay men and - whether it's been recognised or not - bisexual people have built together across Europe and the world. We're also celebrating the growth of our own community and the future it's rushing towards.

And that's why we'll be at Europride with you, marching together, singing together, living it up - and maybe even going home together afterwards.



speech, she will vaporize in the air"
"Did Dangerella cast a spell on Los
Angeles as well?"

"No sugar, I extrapolate. I've never been in such a bad mood since the day Dangerella kidnapped Catherine Deneuve."

"And what did she do then?"

"I don't know. That's why I was in a bad mood." She disappeared again.


"Congratulations, Dykie you broke the spell. Thanks for all."

Lesbian & gay in dights in times of AIDS: the European Experience

or more than a decade now, lesbians and gay men have been on the forefront to minimise the impact of AIDS on individuals and society at large. Uncountable lesbians and gay men felt that they could not wait until their government would start responding to the devastating effect of the HIV epidemic. Instead, lesbians and gay men initiated a large number of programmes targeting different aspects of the epidemic. These projects yielded valuable information and experience to the interest of the population at large. In addition, lesbians and gay men turned out to be the best educators and care providers of a population disproportionate affected by HIV (in Europe the group of "homo/bisexual men" rank highest with 41.7% of all AIDS cases as of 31 December 1991).

Thanks to this early community response lesbians and gay men are now amidst the internationally praised AIDS experts. Some governments and international organisations even hold the lesbian and gay communities' response to AIDS as an example for other communities.

One of the outcomes of the second European Conference on Homosexuality and HIV (Amsterdam, February 1992) was that lesbian and gay liberation is conditional to an effective HIV policy. Lesbians and gay men that experience discrimination, are subjected to unequal ages of consent and cannot freely develop their own lifestyles are hard to reach with HIV prevention messages and are unlikely to get the form of counselling and treatment they need.

After 10 years of massive investment in HIV work, often to the detriment of other work to be done, the lesbian and gay movement cannot accept a simple " thank you" and leave all other things as

they were. As said, the process of liberation urgently needs to continue be it alone now that there are still some important action points on the lesbian and gay agenda. It was recommended that lesbians and gay men should not refrain from using

AIDS as an instrument to press their legitimate demands. Such may provoke some resistance now that this savours of exploiting the HIV issue at the expense of those who are personally affected by HIV. In an attempt to allay the often felt hesitance to "profiteer" from the HIV epidemic, the Austrian conference participant Kurt Krickler posed the rhetorical question "Don't we owe all people who died of AIDS to make all the best out of this crisis so that their death is not totally meaning-

On the other hand, however, a strong appeal was made emphasising the

importance of a lesbian and gay movement that is inclusive and offers all its members the security and sympathy they need. Without this condition being fulfilled using AIDS to further lesbian and gay demands could indeed be classified as profiteering, and can thus not be accepted.

Agenda for the future

AIDS has generated the birth of new lesbian and gay communities, better organized and more visible than ever before. To a large extent this reflects dissatisfaction with the tardy official responses to the HIV epidemic and the obligations felt towards those living with HIV and AIDS. People with HIV and AIDS themselves have often

been in the forefront in setting up lesbian, gay and HIV advocacy groups, both within and outside the lesbian and gay movement. From a retrospective perspective one can see that concerted communities' actions, that is to say activities jointly prepared and supported by a broad coalition of lesbian, gay and AIDS service organisations, regularly harvested most success. The networks formed within the context of the ILGA and the European Council of AIDS Service Organisations (EuroCASO) turned out to be instrumental in this respect.

One can conclude that despite the new waves of homophobia, the HIV epidemic in general has not resulted in a further deterioration of the legal climate for lesbians and gay men in Europe. To the contrary, at the expense of too many lovers, relatives and friends struggling against this unfair disease called AIDS, the legal position of lesbians and gay men has even improved. That is not to say that all lesbian and gay demands have now been fulfilled. With respect to the


major claims of the lesbian and gay movement, protection against discrimination, securing equal ages of consent and full respect of the right to individual self-determination, disparity is greater than ever before, with some countries stubbornly rejecting to adopt more enlightened views.

Before the newly formed coalition of lesbian, gay and AIDS service organisations starts a new offensive towards the most backwards European governments, there should be a momentum to reconsider the respect for equality within the lesbian and gay movement itself and the impact this has on its work.

- ▼ Women and men should start an open dialogue and seek new and better ways of collaboration. In this respect discussing means respecting, learning from each other and eventually helping each other in achieving the goals set.
- ▼ The lesbian and gay communities should not accept any form of discrimination against those living with HIV or AIDS. To the contrary, people with HIV and AIDS should remain fully integrated and have a say in the strategies of the movement.
- ▼ More attention should be paid to lesbians and gay men from Black and ethnic minority groups. The fact that people from these groups less frequently identify as lesbian or gay is not valid reason to exclude them from the movement.
- ▼ International collaboration needs strengthening, particularly in view of the unification of Europe. Lesbians and gay men should not react upon the European processes but instead develop a proactive attitude in an effort to influence the political agenda from the very beginning.

With these conditions being fulfilled it is hard to imagine anyone who can stop the success of the European lesbian and gay movement.





The Sisters of Perpetual indulgence are an international order of gay male nuns whose professed mission is the promulgation of universal joy through the expiation of stigmatic guilt. Stigmatic guilt is best described as the guilt which is attached by authority to an individual's acts and beliefs, often in order to limit or modify personal behaviour. It is most insidious because the individual is brought to believe that they are bad, and become an accomplice of their own oppression. The Sisters alleviate this guilt by claiming for all

people (not just lesbians, gays and bisexuals)a perpetual indulgence from guilt, and destroy the disempowering concept of "sin". The result is a world abounding in universal joy. The Sisters are in effect a revolutionary group dedicated to personal liberation of the most fundamental kind.

The Sisters are located In San Francisco, New York, Paris, Sydney, Melbourne, Edinburgh, Leeds and Canterbury as well as London. The main element of their work is the creation of rituals which acknowledge and strengthen the pride and diversity of the gay community as a whole: from canonisation to ice skating; from playing football to raiding Bennetton shops.


