Entry, English language and visa requirements

Consider one of our pathway programs if you require an alternative method of entry into your chosen course.

Entry requirements

To study a degree at Torrens University, you must satisfy the general entry criteria and meet any additional course requirements where specified.

We recognise qualifications from other countries and education systems (eg. GCE A-Levels, International Baccalaureate and SAT) and assess students who have completed Australian equivalent qualifications.

If you don't meet the entry requirements for direct admission into our courses, you can apply for a pathway program (see next page for more details).

Students who have partially completed a degree can apply for direct admission with a credit transfer. You may see this referred to as "advanced standing", "exemptions" or "recognition of prior learning".

English language requirements

Entry to all courses calls for proficiency in English under the English Language Proficiency Requirements. Torrens University Language Centre (TULC) provides a pathway towards a higher education course. After successfully completing English for Academic Purposes at TULC, you can progress to your chosen degree.

Some courses may require a higher overall score/sub-score(s) for entry. These requirements are shown in accordance with the IELTS academic test requirements. We also accept other English tests. Students will generally need to have achieved one of the following for entry into their chosen course:

- International English Language Testing System (IELTS) minimum score 5.5
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) minimum score 46
- Cambridge English: Advanced minimum score 162
- Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE Academic) minimum score 42

Visa requirements

As an international student, you can apply for a student visa once you have:

- Confirmation that you have been accepted to study at Torrens University
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)
- Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)

Online courses

International students must not enrol in more than one-third (33%) of online subjects over their course and must study at least one face-to-face subject each study period. Please note that due to COVID-19, authorities have provided exceptions to the usual face-to-face learning requirements. For more information, visit: studyaustralia.gov.au

International students on a student visa are required to study full time, ie. the student must complete a minimum of 1.0 EFTSL of study per year.

Students under 18

If you are under 18, have an offer to study with Torrens University, and plan to travel to Australia on a student visa, you will need to have formal arrangements in place for accommodation and welfare before the Department of Home Affairs will process your visa. 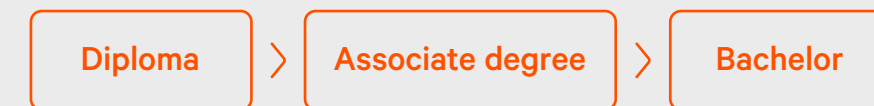

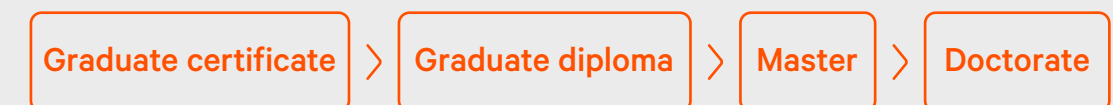

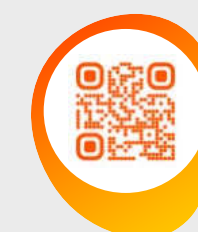


Qualification pathways

If you have already completed a qualification, you may be able to credit this against your degree with us – even if it's from another institution. We will carefully review the learning gained from this qualification to ensure we provide you with credit towards our degrees whenever appropriate.

Recognition of prior learning

Learning as the result of work or life experience, self-tuition, hobby or leisure activities (ie. informal learning) or a structured course that does not lead to an officially accredited qualification (ie. non-formal learning) may be credited against your degree with us. Each application is assessed individually, and your experience matched to the learning outcomes of the subjects covered in your course. All claimed work experience must be relevant to the qualification being applied for, and you must provide evidence to support an application for credit based on informal and/or non-formal learning.

You will need to attach supporting documentation with your application form. This can include certified copies of academic transcripts, English language proficiency and your passport. Be sure to also include a statement of purpose, CV and credit transfer application if required.



4. Submit your application

We accept applications throughout the year. International students can apply directly at apply.torrens.edu.au/apply-now or through one of our Education Agents.



5. Accept your Letter of Offer

Once your application has been assessed and if you're successful, we will provide you or your nominated Education Agent with a Letter of Offer and Written Agreement via email. You need to check that the details are correct, complete the payment section and provide any other documentation if requested, before you sign and send the documents back to us.



6. Prepare for your studies

After we have received your signed offer and confirmed your payment, we will secure a place in your chosen course and issue an Electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE). When you receive the eCoE, you will be able to apply for a student visa. Once this visa is granted, you can prepare for your Orientation session and select your subjects. Our International Student Advisors will help you prepare for your first trimester of study.

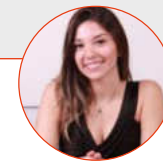
