




Purpose








From Chaos Comes Creativity by Punit Kavia

Our students keep creating every day – through good times and tumultuous periods that inspire change. Here, graduate Punit Kavia explores how music has given him and others a voice, a platform, and power during turbulent episodes and fractious world events. He also looks at how disruptive moments in history have affected Afrobeat music, hip-hop, and grime – and the continuing importance of music as a creative outlet.

We are always encouraging our students to share their experiences of music and its relationship with the world around them. After all, music has made us who we are – as an Institute, as a creative collective, and as individuals. It's guided us, shaped us and sparked endless creativity. And no two stories on what music means to people are ever the same.

To the general public, music is nothing but noise about sex, love, or sadness, and what chart number that particular song reached that week. But it is so much more than that – music is a medium that transcends languages, countries and cultural boundaries.

Musicians are tastemakers, influencers, and vocal activists taking a snapshot of society at a particular time and creating a social commentary to dissect what they experience. Taking a look back through musical history, it is clear that the most impactful albums often coincide with large-scale sociocultural movements.



However, what is more interesting is how those same musical styles return to combat the same injustices some decades later.

For example, Fela Kuti, the pioneer of Afrobeat (a blend of traditional Nigerian Yoruba music with jazz, West African highlife and funk) used his musical movement to congregate citizens and speak out against Nigeria's military dictatorship. Half a century later and Kuti's influence and movement still run strong with global star Burna Boy taking up the mantle in the fight against oppression and corruption.

Some 6,613 miles away from Fela Kuti, another musical movement began its infancy in the "great and free" US of A. A child was born a decade after the end of the first civil rights movement in America. This is a child who will eventually become the most consumed and culturally influential genre since the flower-power movement of the 60s.

Hip-hop has its five pillars: lyricism/the MC, DJing,

breakdancing, graffiti, and most importantly, the knowledge. Hip-hop formed in the ruins of a post-industrial and demolished South Bronx, where the mayor and the government economically motivated landlords to burn their buildings down to push out the largely African-American and Latinx residents in those neighbourhoods. This violent form of gentrification marginalised these urban communities, leaving them alienated and voiceless.

Hip-hop culture was born from two decks; a mixer, and DJ Kool Herc mixing the breaks of two identical vinyl to create one cohesive breakbeat. This, along with a wordsmith or 'MC', meant that the youths of the Bronx had a sound and a voice where they could self-express in confidence. Bronx block-parties became a place where inner city youths got to form and create their own culture, whilst openly rallying against oppression and having fun.

Afrika Bambaataa and the Universal Zulu Nation is one of my favourite examples of this

organisation of youth culture. They're an international hip-hop awareness group that promotes 'peace, love, and unity' whilst also educating about the struggles of black people in America. The Nation organised and mobilised marginalised urban youths to educate themselves about the racist and imperial history and present of America.

And this philosophy transcends across the decades. Ten years later, Rodney King is brutally beaten by officers and the evidence is caught on camera. The resulting riots and demonstrations were soundtracked by N.W.A – once again, a musical movement soundtracking a societal one – with people taking to the streets in chorus rapping lyrics from *Straight Outta Compton* in protest and anger.

This is mirrored 31 years later in 2020. Whilst the movement has a different name, and the artists and music have evolved, the message remains the same: black lives matter. Fight for equality and justice – end systemic racism.

Taking to the streets for the Black Lives Matter protests in London, we all rally and sing in chorus Kendrick Lamar's 'Alright' – our generation's civil rights anthem. This is a comforting anthem that people of colour and other oppressed communities need, to remind us that, despite the ever-growing injustice and discrimination, in the long run, we gon' be alright.

In my lifetime – and especially post 9/11 – our voices were not accounted for, our music wasn't



allowed on the airwaves, and our criticisms of the government and policing bodies were unheard. However, this sparked a new culture, spearheaded by inner city youths in the early 90s. The era of pirate radio gave birth to so many distinctly UK genres such as jungle, garage, and grime.

Grime is now a household name. However, in the early 00s, it was still an underground movement. Grime reflected the harsh realities of inner city life, and vividly described what it meant to be a black man in London during a time of over-policing and racial scapegoating. This voice thrived until the government introduced Form 696. This gave the authorities the power to shut down events and revoke licenses on the grounds of suspected violence.

As tensions continued to rise during the 00s, it was 2011 when the UK really turned into the U.S. The shooting of Mark Duggan by the police (who claimed he was in possession of a handgun) sparked riots across the UK. We took to the streets fighting for justice. And the music that unified and energised us? Grime.

Nine years later, the grime movement takes centre stage at Glastonbury and establishes its platform to incite the youth to create change. Campaigns such as Grime4Corbyn connects with my generation to go out and vote, no matter who you vote for, whilst Kano's *Hoodies All Summer* asks the youth to put down their knives. A movement which was vilified less than ten years ago is now creating substantial change.

However, the greatest driving force behind change is you – the artist. Petitions are great, and all, and so are protests. But, as a musician, your creativity can have real power and impact that will change generations to come. You, the creative, have the power to change the views and opinions of the greater public whilst they consume your art. And perhaps post-COVID, your perseverance to do what is right and just will create a movement and a legacy of your own.

Power to the people.

Lee is lead guitarist in punk rock band IDLES. Since forming, IDLES have recorded and released two critically acclaimed albums, with the second reaching No.2 in The Official UK Albums Chart. Lee is a lecturer on Performance in Context where he helps our students gain experience and knowledge as part of their performance studies. Lee also guests in any modules where his impressive performance background can enhance students' performances and careers. He has a First Class BA (Hons) degree in Media and Journalism and runs a filmmaking evening class in the college to help students expand their skills.

Inspired by the likes of Miles Davis and legendary jazz guitarist Wes Montgomery, Femi came to the attention of the music world when Soweto Kinch asked him to join his quartet. A Mercury Music Prize nomination soon followed, as did MOBO Awards and a BBC Jazz Award for best new band.

Femi has had great success as a solo artist, working as Amy Winehouse's musical director and guitarist, as well as playing with the likes of Courtney Pine, The Roots and George Benson. He's also set up his own record label and dabbled in broadcasting.

Award-Winning Alumni



Ella Mai

Grammy Award winner, Billboard Music Awards winner and BRIT Award nominee, Ella Mai joined our BIMM London Vocals course in 2014. Since leaving BIMM, Ella has become the first British artist in 26 years to score a No.1 single on the US R&B chart. She was also handpicked by Bruno Mars to join him as a support act on his 24K Magic tour finale.

Her No.1 single 'Boo'd Up' knocked Drake's 'Don't Matter to Me' off the top spot in the US R&B chart before winning Ella a Grammy Award for Best R&B Song in 2019.

Shortly after the release of her self-titled debut album in late 2018, Ella signed a global record deal with Sony/ATV. Today, she is a major musical force to be reckoned with across the globe.



George Ezra

George Ezra joined BIMM Bristol in 2011. He studied Songwriting and was signed to Columbia Records less than a year later. The BRIT Awards winner was also responsible for the biggest-selling album in the UK in 2018.

His debut single 'Budapest' reached No.3 in the charts and attained platinum status. Plus, his debut album *Wanted on Voyage* hit No.1 and sold over one million copies in the UK alone.

His second studio album, *Staying at Tamara's* (which features the No.1 single 'Shotgun'), reached No.1 in the UK.



Fontaines D.C.

BIMM Dublin graduates and alternative post-punk quintet Fontaines D.C. have been riding a wave of success – most recently bagging the No.2 spot in the Official UK Albums Chart with their second album *A Hero's Death*.

Since graduating from BIMM, they've toured internationally extensively. Their first album *Dogrel* charted at No. 9 in 2019 and received critical acclaim, winning album of the year from both Rough Trade and BBC Radio 6 Music.

Speaking on behalf of the band, drummer Tom Coll described the importance of the band's experience at BIMM Dublin: "Our time at BIMM was a really formative one in that we felt like we had the authority to call ourselves musicians and be confident in that identity."



Jon Beavis (IDLES)

BIMM Bristol drum graduate Jon Beavis is the drummer for IDLES – and one of Music Radar's '13 Best Rock Drummers in the World 2018'. He features alongside Queen's Roger Taylor, Foo Fighters' Dave Grohl and Smashing Pumpkins' Jimmy Chamberlin. Beavis and IDLES have released not one but two critically acclaimed albums (*Brutalism* and *Joy as an Act of Resistance*), with the latter peaking at No.2 in The Official UK Albums Chart.

IDLES were nominated for Best Breakthrough Act at the 2019 BRIT Awards and later won the 2019 Kerrang! Award for Best British Breakthrough Act. Most recently, IDLES were on the shortlist for the prestigious Mercury Prize 2019, alongside the likes of Cate Le Bon, The 1975 and fellow BIMM graduates Fontaines D.C.



Napsugár Bardócz

Hailing from Budapest, Napsugár completed her Event Management degree at BIMM Brighton in 2018 and is now working as an Assistant Artist Manager at Everybody's Management, whose roster includes Jack Garratt, Keane and Gretta Ray, amongst others. She also independently manages Brighton based singer-songwriter Miles Goodall and has been a promoter representative for Sziget Festival Ltd in Hungary for three years running.




Gaetan Judd







Holly Quin-Ankrah

Antony Greaves, College Principal


Antony Greaves is our College Principal at BIMM Institute Birmingham and

It sounds cliché, but I think the people I've met and worked with have been the best thing about BIMM for me. Just being taught by, working with, and simply knowing some of the most interesting and engaging people I've ever met has helped me become a more well-rounded person.

It was such a comforting feeling knowing that I had people who had my back and were rooting for me to find my true passion within this industry. I don't think I could've done it without them.

Straight after graduating from the Event Management course, I accepted a job offer and became the coordinator of the UK & European Guild of Music Supervisors. In September 2019, I joined the Everybody's Management team as an Assistant Manager. I primarily work with Jack Garratt, but also assist across the whole roster, which includes the likes of Keane and Melbourne-based pop artist Gretta Ray. I also independently manage a fellow BIMM Brighton graduate: singer-songwriter Miles Goodall. During the past three summers, I have also been working as a promoter representative for the four major Hungarian festivals run by Sziget Ltd (Sziget Festival, Balaton Sound, VOLT Festival and STRAND Festival). This has seen me look after the likes of Dua Lipa, Foo Fighters, Blossoms, Slash, and Bastille, amongst many other international artists.

What I enjoyed most about BIMM was that the extracurricular activities were just as important as academic learning. I put myself to the test as a gig promoter in first year, and ran a stage at 2000trees, Y Not and Elderflower Fields festivals with the BIMM team, met some of the coolest people in the industry and heard their inspiring stories at the weekly Masterclasses. Finally, I landed an interview with the iconic 13 Artists booking agency, which led me to a six months internship with them.

I met so many inspiring, interesting and wonderful people because of BIMM – most of whom are still some of my closest friends to this day.





Postgraduate Courses (UK Applicants)

So, what are the benefits of an MA for prospective postgraduates? An MA qualification adds significantly increased employment potential within specific fields of the music industry, such as:

Following this, the Admissions Team will get in touch with you to arrange a phone or online interview.

- For Joint Honours Courses
If you're not able to visit us in person, you'll receive thorough guidance from our Admissions Team on alternative methods.

Step 4: Contract Confirmation
After your audition or audition-alternative, you'll be debriefed by a member of the Admissions Team and told whether or not we'll be offering you a place.

Visas

If you are a national from outside the EU/EEA, you will need a Tier 4 (General) Student visa in order to study at BIMM Institute.

CAS

Auditions, Interviews and Personal Statements

We couldn't be more excited about welcoming the next wave of students and guiding you through your BIMM Institute journey. However, before you walk through the doors, you'll be required to write a personal statement as part of your UCAS application. You might also have to complete an audition, interview, or submit a digital portfolio.

The application process at BIMM Institute is designed to capture a variety of elements — technical ability, academic skills, passion for your subject of study and an understanding of the course you have chosen to apply for. We want to make sure all applicants enrol onto a course that best serves their specific career aspirations, current skill set and academic growth.

Many applicants submit their UCAS application first and then have their audition or interview booked in. Your audition or interview can be arranged via an invitation from our Admissions Team. Alternatively, you can

contact us in advance and have your audition or interview in place for when we receive your application via UCAS. However, if you're unsure of which course you might want to apply for, you can book your audition or interview before submitting your UCAS application. The audition or interview might be helpful in terms of your decision-making.

Whether you'd like to book your audition or interview before or after submitting your UCAS application, we're here to help and happy to arrange your preferred approach.

Personal Statement

Whichever course you're applying for, you'll have to complete a written personal statement as part of your UCAS application. This is your opportunity to tell us about your career goals, why you'd be suitable for the course and outline any relevant experience.

We recommend that you take your time with your personal statement as what you submit will form a

significant part of your application. There are guides on how to write a personal statement available on ucas.com or you can view BIMM's Applicant Guide on our website which offers helpful tips and advice on how to successfully capture your passion and skills on paper: bimm.ac.uk

Auditions

If you've applied for a course that requires an audition, our Admissions Team will send you guidance on how to prepare within your booking confirmation.

The auditions are conducted on a one-to-one basis by a BIMM entrance assessor. These can be completed either in person at one of our colleges or remotely via online platforms.

The auditions and interviews take approximately 45-60 minutes. At the end of your audition or interview, you'll have a good indication of your impending offer from BIMM Institute.

Our auditions and interviews provide the perfect opportunity to ask questions about the course during your time with your assessor, as well as discuss any feedback.

BIMM alumni will receive a tuition fee discount of £1,000 on full-time courses or £500 for part-time courses.

Postgraduate fees will be covered by Student Finance England on behalf of the UK Government and paid directly to students in regular instalments.



Student Loans

We're continually committed to ensuring the best value music education possible. In fact, we've recently registered with the Office for Students (OfS) – the new regulator of all Higher Education Institutions in the UK.

This has several implications for our institution and affects the loans that students at BIMM Institute in the UK can receive in respect of their tuition fee.

This means that BIMM Institute students can now apply for a student loan to cover the full amount of their tuition fee (£9,250). Previously, the maximum loan available was £6,165.

Repayments

Your loan repayments are linked to your income. You only make repayments when your income is above £25,700 a year. If your income drops below this amount, repayments stop.

Each month you pay back 9% of any income over £25,700 – this would work at approximately £32 per month if you're earning £30,000 per year.


The Fair Access Fund
