

Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements for programs may be eligible for mature student assessment.

In order to be eligible to write the mature student assessment, students must:

- > Be 19 years of age or older
- Not possess an OSSD or equivalent (usually)
- > Be out of school for at least one year





Money matters and the cost of attending college can be a little daunting. We want you to gain the education you've been dreaming of – that's why each year we give out over \$1M to students to help cover the costs of attending college.

Financial Aid opportunities are available for a wide variety of students and each award is unique.

Lambton College believes that engaging students in applied research activities provides the best platform to reinforce their educational programming, connect them with relevant industry and organizations, help them develop new skills, and enhance their employability.

Since 2007, our College has hired over 1,300 student researchers. Students participating in applied research activities increase their level of employability, which has resulted in more than 90 per cent of our research students finding jobs in their related fields following graduation. In fact, many of our students are hired directly by our project partners due to their experience and knowledge gained while working with the company's processes and products.

Continued strength in research while fostering a culture of innovation for students has repeatedly landed Lambton College one of the top spots on the list of Canada's top research colleges. We've found ourselves on the top 5 list for the past 5 years!
