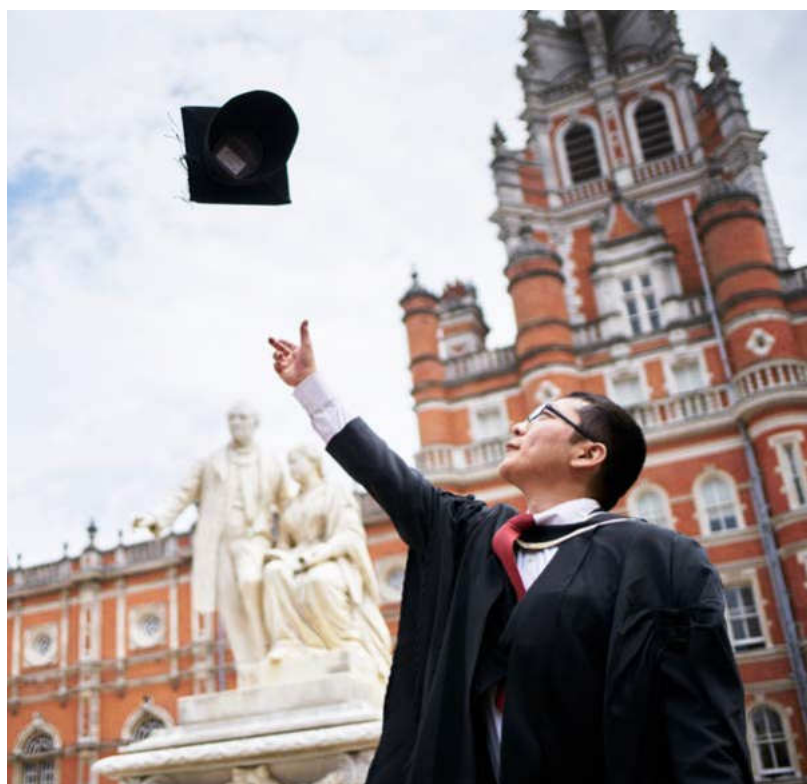

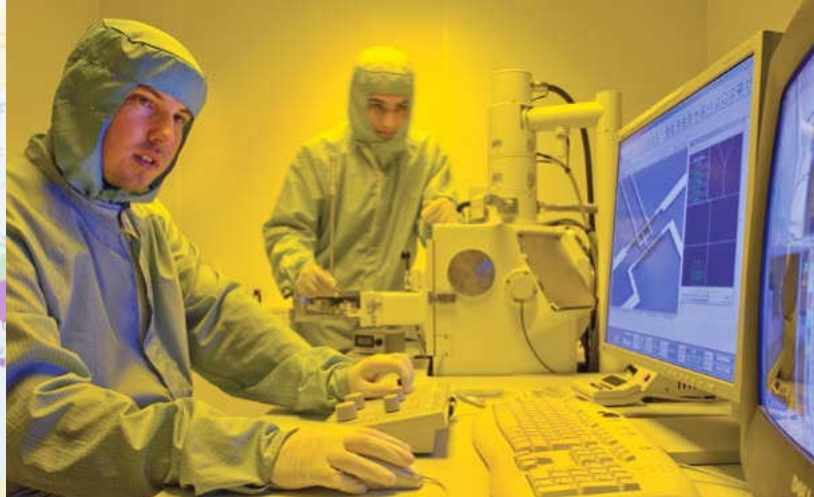

Living in halls is a big part of the student experience. A dedicated team of residential staff will look after you, ensuring you are provided with a secure and comfortable home throughout your stay.

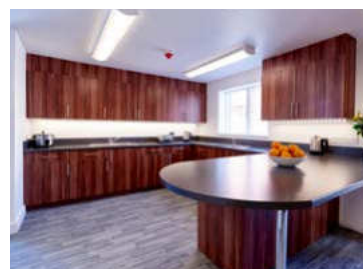
There are several options, depending on your budget and needs, ranging from a shared room with a washbasin, to a private room with its own bathroom.

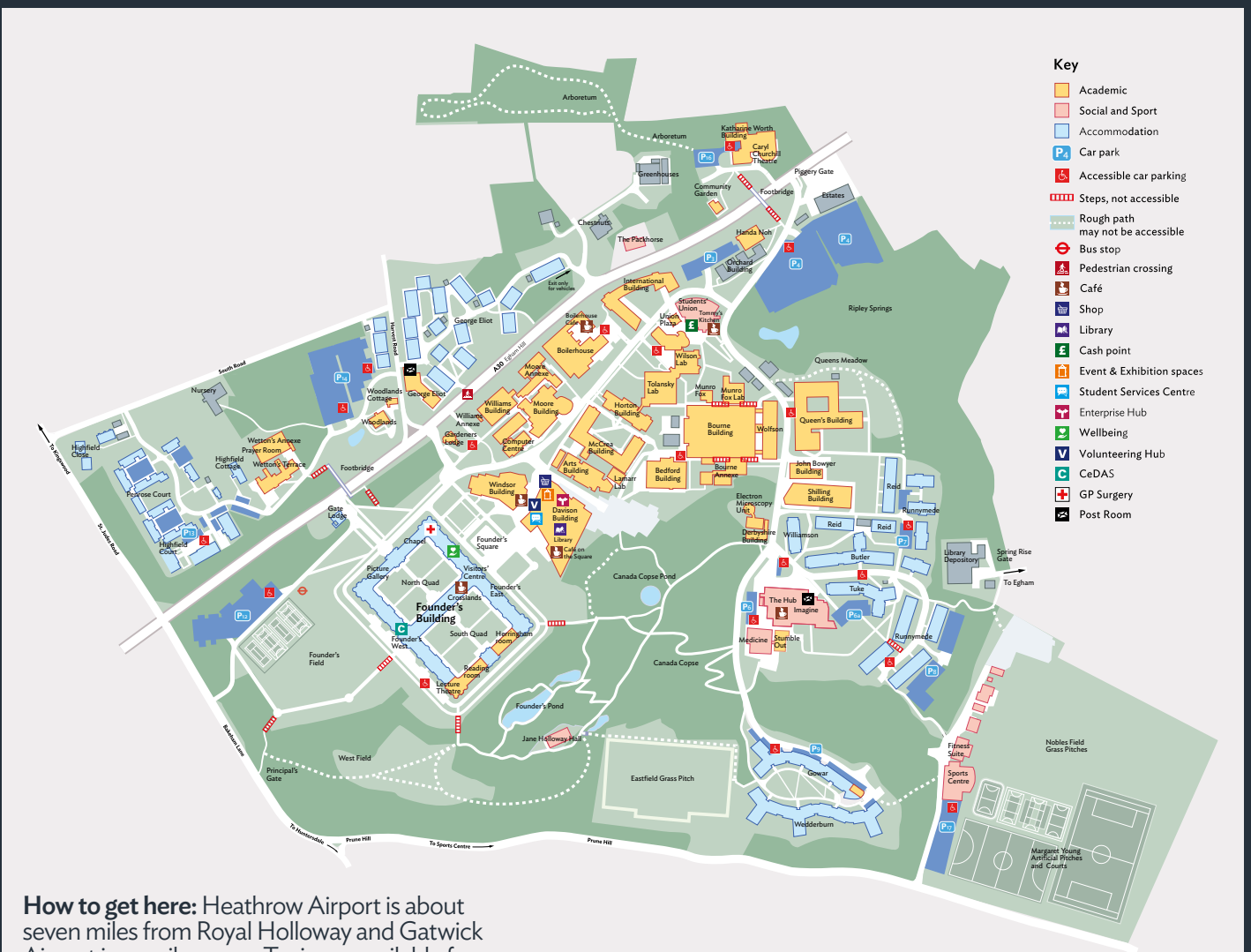
All study bedrooms in halls are equipped with necessary furniture, including a desk, chair and bed. Please note that some halls may not be available for all intakes.
