Reflection for the Blessed Virgin Mary


Whenever I read the words of the Magnificat, I try to imagine them being spoken by a teenage girl. It's an extraordinary piece of writing; feisty and defiant from someone whose life has been turned upside down by the revelation that she is to become the mother of the Messiah.

Mary begins by recognising her own part in history but quickly transfers her attention to the wonder and majesty of God. God's engagement with his people throughout history and his seemingly topsy-turvy values are recounted. Perhaps this was a spontaneous outburst yet, as I read the words from Isaiah, I recognise that Mary had a rich heritage on which to draw. Alongside the words of Samuel's mother, Hannah, there are other women in scripture who speak directly to God in equally poetic and passionate terms. I wonder if you recognise any of Mary's words in those of Hannah:

'My heart exults in the Lord; my strength is exulted in my God. My mouth derides my enemies because I rejoice in my God...the bows of the mighty are broken but the feeble gird on strength' (1 Samuel 2. 1, 4).

As you read scripture, listen out for words which seem to call to you; they may be inspiration for the days ahead!
