Reflection Luke 22:24-30

Today is the Feast Day of St Bartholomew, but who was he? He is mentioned once in Matthew, once in Mark, once in Luke and once in Acts. The verses leading up to today's Gospel is Luke's account of the Last Supper, but our reading records a dispute among the Disciples, as to who will be the greatest. Bartholomew we know would be there, being one of the 12. Did he join in the argument? We don't know, but Jesus points out to them, that people in authoritv out "there" in the secular world like to exert power over those who are under them. Jesus reminds those around that table, that "greatness" in Jesus' world "The Kingdom" is not about exerting authority and power, but is about service...the level of what is being done for the benefit of others.

Perhaps Bartholomew took Jesus' words to heart, we don't know, there is no record yet been found of what he ever did, but let us believe that he was an obedient servant of the Church.

Isaiah 43: 8-13

Bring forth the people who are blind, yet have eyes, who are deaf, yet have ears! Let all the nations gather together, and let the peoples assemble. Who among them declared this, and foretold to us the former things? Let them bring their witnesses to justify them, and let them hear and say, 'It is true.' You are my witnesses, says the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me. Now many signs and wonders were done among the people through the apostles. And they were all together in Solomon's Portico. None of the rest dared to join them, but the people held them in high esteem. Yet more than ever believers were added to the Lord, great numbers of both men and women, so that they even carried out the sick into the streets, and laid them on cots and mats, in order that Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he came by. A great number of people would also gather from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing the sick and those tormented by unclean

spirits, and they were all cured.

Luke 22: 24-30

A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves. 'You are those who have stood by me in my trials; and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Almighty God, who on the day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit to the apostles with the wind from heaven and in tongues of flame, filling them with joy and boldness to preach the gospel: by the power of the same Spirit strengthen us to witness to your truth and to draw everyone to the fire of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
