Reflection for Christ the King

I wonder what abiding memories you have following the death of Oueen Elizabeth II? I recall the long queues of people wishing to pay their respects and the sight of her grandchildren processing into Westminster Hall, which seemed to me to be a complicated mix of formality and family grief. Of course, this was followed by the ceremony surrounding the coronation of King Charles last May. For those who had lived through the reign of Queen Elizabeth for their whole lives, this was the first change of monarch they had experienced. For some, this resulted in a National Anthem asking God to save our gracious 'Qu - ing'!

Today's readings assure us that there will no end or transfer of authority for Jesus, who sits on his throne for all eternity. His work on earth is completed and 'to him be glory and dominion for ever' (Revelation 1.6). Whatever our views on the earthly monarchy, we know that Jesus' rule is 'an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingdom is one that shall never be destroyed' (Daniel 7. 14b). The question for us is how we should respond to this truth.
