Reflection: Luke 9: 28-36 Feast of the Transfiguration

Lord Darlington, a character in Oscar Wilde's play *Lady Windermere's Fan* (1892) utters lines which have become almost immortalised: 'We are all in the gutter, but some of us are looking at the stars'. While in the context of the play he seems to be talking about different men's attitude to women, this quotation has been applied much more widely and generally to the whole human race.

In the frame of the Transfiguration, it's a reminder for all of us, wherever we are, to develop, hold to and enjoy a vision of God and of Jesus – of how things can be better or different.

Luke's reading is all about the transfiguration of Jesus – how his face dazzled and so on – but we should not restrict our imaginations just to the Messiah. It is we too who can be, even ought to be, changed, transformed, transfigured. We too, not just Jesus, who hear God the Father calling us beloved and chosen sons and daughters.

To plagiarize the terrible L'Oreal advert on the TV: 'Because you're worth it'. Phrased slightly differently and better from another French source (Leon Bloy in *La Femme Pauvre*) 'The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint'.

Daniel 7: 9, 10, 13, 14

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne; his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousand served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. The court sat in judgement, and the books were opened. As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

Psalm 97

The Lord is king: let the earth rejoice; let the multitude of the isles be glad.

Clouds and darkness are round about him; righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.

Fire goes before him and burns up his enemies on every side.

His lightnings lit up the world; the earth saw it and trembled.

The mountains melted like wax at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth. The heavens declared his righteousness, and all the peoples have seen his glory

Confounded be all who worship carved images

and delight in mere idols.

Bow down before him, all you gods. Zion heard and was glad, and the daughters of Judah rejoiced because of your judgements, O Lord.

For you, Lord, are most high over all the earth; you are exalted far above all gods.

The Lord loves those who hate evil; he preserves the lives of his faithful and delivers them from the hand of the wicked.

Light has sprung up for the righteous and joy for the true of heart.

Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous, and give thanks to his holy name.

2 Peter 1: 16-19

For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.' We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

Luke 9: 28-36

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwell-

ings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.
