Mass time Changes.

This week there are many changes:

The only Mass at Holy Cross will be at 6.55am Mon- Thurs. (i.e. there will be no 10am or 5.30pm Mass). This is due to the roadworks being carried out at Holy Cross Priory.

There will be no Mass on Friday at either Christ the King or Holy Cross Priory as I will be in Lourdes.

The following week there will be no weekday Masses, except on Thursday at 10am at Holy Cross Priory.

Eucharistic Adoration:

Holy Cross Priory Sunday evening 5.30 – 6.30pm.

Communion under both kinds.

Before the pandemic we had Holy Communion under both kinds, that is both the body & blood of Christ. However, we are taught that the usual way for Catholics to receive Holy Communion is through the Sacred Host & that receiving the Chalice only makes the sign more complete but isn't a necessity.

In John's Gospel Jesus says: anyone who eats my flesh & drinks my blood has eternal life & I will raise them up on the last day. That being so, receiving the chalice is a better sign than just the Host alone. So, on Sunday Masses we will try to reintroduce Holy Communion under both kinds. That will require recruiting & training a sufficient number of Eucharistic Ministers. Because the Sisters are at the 4.30 Vigil Mass we will probably begin there. Because I am prone to infections, the Eucharistic minister will need to purify the chalice after Communion. Hopefully we will be able to begin this in the next few months. But remember that receiving under one kind is completely sufficient & receiving the Chalice as well is purely a personal decision.
