


Identify locations where people are interested in constitutional reform issues.

- Introduce voter id for all elections
- Scrap the right to vote in two separate constituencies at local elections
- Give the electorate a referendum on the abolition of the House of Lords
- Automatic by-election if an MP resigns membership of their political party
- Change the general election voting system to one of proportional representation
- Halt all efforts to introduce ID checks at polling stations

N002 Left of centre consensus


