## <u>Guidance for pupils - posted on Year Group Teams pages</u>

You will probably be aware that due to strike action, the school will be closed on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> September, Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September and Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> September. This means you should not come into school on those days. Instead, you should you log onto Teams and work with your teachers through your normal timetabled lessons on each of these days. The timings for the online learning days are set out below:

You are expected to be online in the right Team page for the start of each lesson and get involved in all planned learning activities. Your teachers may ask you questions directly and you will be able to ask questions of your teacher, either directly or through the Chat function. The same high standards of behaviour and effort we would expect in school, are expected when learning online. We know this is not the same as learning in class – however we want you to keep progressing with your learning.

The school will be open to pupils on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September and Friday 29<sup>th</sup> September. You should be in school as normal on those days.

There are no school-college classes running on these days. If you have a college class at some point in your timetable you should this time to carry on with your general studies.

If you have a timetabled consortia lesson, the teacher from the delivering school will lead the learning for that period on Teams at the normal timetabled times.
