DISCUSSION	ACTION
1. WELCOME	
E McCallum welcomed to all the meeting and announced received apologies. Introductions were made.	
2. PREVIOUS MINUTE	
The previous minute was agreed as correct.	
3. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES	
Staffing I Livingstone gave the Committee an update of the staffing issues at present as follows:

School Maintenance I Livingstone confirmed that all ongoing maintenance within the school corridors is completed.	
4. ONLINE DELVERY OF ADVANCED HIGHER HISTORY	
F Malcolm spoke about the progress of the online delivery of Advanced History. The course is progressing well although there were some initial IT issues which are now being addressed by Education Services. Pupils from the participating schools all met with F Malcolm at the start of the course. Course work instructions are put online for pupils and each school has a key teacher assigned to support their pupils and be a point of contact. A future update on progress of the course will be given to the Parent Council.	

5. AUTHORITY VISIT

I Livingstone spoke about the recent Authority visit and will update the Committee of the outcome at the next meeting on 4 November.

6. SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT INSIGHT DATA

I Livingstone presented a slideshow of the recent Insight Data as follows:

- In S4, S5 and S6, the achievement of both Levels 4 and 5 in Literacy and Numeracy by Braes pupils is above what would be statistically expected.
- In S4, the average attainment of pupils from all attainment levels is above what would statistically be expected.
- In S5, the average attainment of pupils from all attainment levels is above what would statistically be expected.
- In S6, the pattern is less clear, with some Braes pupils outperforming what would statistically be expected.
 Although not significant statistically, there is evidence that indicates that S6 pupils can, on average, attain further in their final year of school.
