Elspeth McCallum opened meeting and welcomed all in attendance

Previous Minutes

The minutes of previous AGM (18th September 2018) were approved. Proposed by Wendy Macpherson and seconded by Alison Mitchell.

Updates from School

lain Livingstone thanked everyone for their attendance and advised that there would be a slightly different approach to this meeting as it is the AGM. Iain delivered his presentation on pupil progress, pathways and attainment following the SQA exam results. (presentation attached)

Update on SQA Diet

Iain noted the following

- Testament to the work of the pupils, parents and staff
- Measuring attainment by each stage as they go through their educational journey.
- Year Group Data important.
- Exit Data matters most

S4 Attainment - Key Points

- Percentage of pupils gaining at least 5 NQ's increased to expected levels (58%)
- Sizeable amount of pupils gaining more than this due to Scottish Studies and double maths qualification
- 5 at level 4 rose to 90%
- 5 at level 3 or more rose to 98%

S5 Attainment – Key Points

- Record High equalling performance in all measures with the exception 3 x higher percentage which is a new record high
- S5 did exceptionally well (5 at level 6 rose to 24%)
- 3 at level 6 or more rose to 46%
- 1 at level 6 or more rose to 65%
- 12 pupils gained 5A's
- 15 pupils midway through a Foundation Apprenticeship
- Accurate Estimates from Teaching Staff

S6 Attainment – Key Points

- Amongst the level 7 attainment are 6 pupils doing HNC's
- 126 pupils completed S6 (65% of Group). Based on cohort size when in S4
- Trend of approximately doubling 5 x H performance from S5 into S6 continues
- Reducing number of presentations at AH level (2017 was 81, 2018 was 70, 2019 was 53)
- Pupils now undertaking alternative pathways

- Parent (Tim Gollins) asked for Digital skills to be included.

Note to members as agreed at meeting

During the meeting it was noted that analysing S6 performance on the basis of the cohort size when in S4 does not give the full picture, given the multiple pathways young people follow. As a follow-up to the meeting the following observations can be made:

When considering the performance of young people based on the number of pupils who completed S6, the percentage of pupils who gained at least one SCQF Level 7 award moves from 19% to 27%, the percentage of pupils who gained 5 or more awards at SCQF Level 6 moves from 31% to 47% and the percentage of pupils who gained 3 or more awards at SCQF Level 6 moves from 47% to 72%.
