Last Month's Highlights

The Ladybird Room have enjoyed a wide variety of mini beast sensory trays, collecting items for the bug house and lots of mark making bug pictures. They have also been learning to sing and sign the rainbow song, helping them to learn their colours.

The Caterpillar Room have been using magnifying glasses to look at the details of the replica bugs in the tray, finding and counting different features. They also assisted the Ladybirds in creating Millwood Bug Motel. The Caterpillars also

made some buzzing bees and scary spiders using their hands.

From firefighters and police officers to doctors, nurses, postal workers, and even the friendly faces in our local shops—our children will begin to understand the important roles these people play in our lives. We will talk about how they help us, what tools they use, and how we can show appreciation for their work.

WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS MONTH IN THE LADYBIRD ROOM




The Ladybirds will be learning about the dentist and oral hygiene. They will use mirrors and open their mouths to look inside. They will talk about teeth and keeping them clean using toothbrushes.

They will explore treasure baskets filled with safe medical supplies such as stethoscopes, foil blankets and bandages. The Ladybirds will play with emergency vehicles and use words like Stop, Go and Wait. They will also become postal workers, mark making and posting letters and unwrapping parcels that we deliver.

On Tuesday 30th September the Ladybirds are having a "Relaxation Day". The children can attend in their pyjamas. They will enjoy relaxing music, gentle exercises, sensory experiences and a massage.

Caterpillar book of the month will be: A Focus on People Who Help Us.




WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS MONTH IN THE BUTTERFLY ROOM



The Butterflies will be changing their home corner weekly between a doctor's, vets, police and firefighters. They will be talking about how to keep safe and who to call in an emergency. The Butterflies will also be talking about oral hygiene and how to keep our teeth healthy.

The Butterfly book of the month will be: You Can't Call an Elephant in an Emergency.



SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD AT HOME

Talk About Everyday Helpers

Point out people in your community who help—like the postman, shop assistants, bus drivers, or bin collectors.

Use simple language to explain what they do and why their job is important.

Read Together

Choose picture books that feature helpful characters like firefighters, doctors, nurses, or police officers.

Ask questions like "What do they do?" or "How are they helping?" to encourage conversation.

Role Play at Home

Set up a pretend hospital, fire station, or shop using toys and household items.

Let your child dress up and act out different roles—this builds empathy and imagination.

Create Art Projects

Draw pictures of people who help us or make thank you cards for local helpers. You could even create a collage using magazine cut-outs of uniforms, vehicles, and tools.

Go on a Helper Hunt

During walks or errands, play a game spotting people who help-like lollypop people, delivery drivers, or community workers.

Talk about what they might be doing and how they help others.
