# Life in the Spirit Prayer Group

45 years 1980-2025



Parish of St Joan of Arc,

On 13<sup>th</sup> September, the "Life in the Spirit" Prayer Group based at the Parish of St Joan of Arc Farnham celebrated its 45th anniversary. It has been meeting weekly with almost no breaks since 1980. Around thirty five present and past members of the group and their guests gathered first of all in the Church for Mass celebrated by Fr Paul Leonard from St Joseph's Basingstoke.



After Mass, everyone went through to the Parish Centre for talks, a shared lunch and a chance to catch up with each other.



Alastair Emblem, who has coordinated the group since 1992, led a time of joyful praise and worship and gave a quick history of the group since its foundation, followed by greetings from former members and others from the Catholic Charismatic world who have helped the group over the years. This was followed by an inspiring talk from Charles and Sue Whitehead, who have been at the forefront of renewal for around 50 years, starting with a prayer group in their home. Charles worked closely with Pope John Paul II as chair of the International Charismatic Renewal Office in the Vatican for 11 years. And in 1994 Charles and Sue launched the popular Celebrate conferences for families.



### **FORTY-FIVE YEARS OF PRAYER**

These are some brief highlights of this prayer group over the last 45 years. This will be a nostalgia trip for some of the oldies, and hopefully an interesting history lesson for newer people.

The group was started approximately 45 years ago by former PP Fr Michael "Smiler" Albon PP here from 1978 until his untimely death in1981 at the age of only 53. He was greatly loved by parishioners, was very saintly but full of joy.


The priest who was sitting with him in hospital just before he died of cancer said he suddenly opened his eyes and exclaimed "Hurrah! Hurrah! I'm so happy!"

He apparently had a sign on his study wall reading "JOY" – Jesus first; Others second; Yourself last. Joy has always been a foundation of our group, with a strong emphasis on praise in all our meetings. We were delighted that Joy was such a strong theme of Pope Francis over the last few years.

After Fr Albon's untimely demise, the group moved out of the Presbytery to Madeleine Fowler's House until 1984.

From early 1984 the group was hosted and led by Peter and Margaret Lloyd till 1991.

In summer 1984 Alastair & Jenny Emblem moved to the Parish and joined the group

The group formed the prayer support for the Parish participation in the Diocesan Renew programme 1988-90.



In Autumn 1991 Fr Jim Martin became Parish Priest and allowed the group to use the Church Sacristy for meetings.




April-May 1992 we ran the first Life in the Spirit Seminars jointly with Holy Family parish at Heath End.

Around that time, Alastair took over leadership.



In 2001 Canon Tony Whale became Parish Priest and allowed us to meet in the Presbytery sitting room. In 2009, thanks to Fr Tony, the new Parish Centre opened and at first our regular weekly meetings were in the Foyer room.



In 2012 Fr Niven arrived and around that time the growing numbers in our meetings meant that we were allowed to move into the main meeting room. He sent us a message for today saying: "Congratulations to you all. Many blessings to you all. Love to you all."





Numbers have fluctuated constantly over the years. A couple of times we have reached a high as 21 but currently we seem to average out at between 9 and 12. For a long time we simply referred to ourselves as the Parish prayer group, because we were the only one. And although at heart we have always been a charismatic prayer group, for many years we were a bit shy about being too overt, for fear of putting people off.



But recent years have thankfully seen the development of a Rosary Group, a Mothers Prayers group, Healing Ministry and a Christian Meditation Group. When Fr Niven came we were encouraged to be more forthcoming about our charismatic nature. Around that time we started calling ourselves the Life in the Spirit prayer group. And of course we are delighted that Pope Francis is so enthusiastic about charismatic renewal.

We have had a number of messages from former members and other people associated with the group over the years, so I will now read these out and add a few comments.

A couple of our former members have gone on to distinguished careers. **William Newton** was with us for a year or two in the 1990s and is now Professor of Theology and Chair of Theology department at the very prestigious Franciscan University of Steubenville.

He writes: I remember with real gratitude the time that I spent in Farnham and the most important element of that time was definitely the formation and fellowship that I received through the parish and particularly the prayer group. So I could say that basically the prayer group and the community were absolutely essential for me at that time in my life to foster me in my faith. (Full message in appendix)

Carol Ann Harnett, who was with us 1993-2016 and went on to be a trainer of catechists first with the Maryvale Institute and now with the School of the Annunciation. God has a different plan for each of His children, and I thank him for every single person who has had any connection with this group and whatever help we have been able to give them on their pilgrimage through life.

The Prayer Group is affiliated to CHARIS, which is the International body set up by Pope Francis in 2018 to unite and foster the charismatic renewal, which he described as a current of grace for the whole church.



The "Life in the Spirit" Prayer Group at <u>St Joan of Arc Catholic Church</u> in Farnham celebrated its 45th anniversary on Saturday 13 September. The group marked the important milestone with an uplifting Mass in the church, celebrated by Fr Paul Leonard from Basingstoke, followed by praise & worship in the Parish Centre, a talk about the history of the group from current leader Alastair Emblem, and a presentation from guest speakers Charles and Sue Whitehead, who founded the <u>Celebrate</u> Family Conferences.

The "Life in the Spirit" Prayer Group has convened weekly (with almost no breaks) since 1980, when it was founded by former Parish Priest, Fr Michael Albon (d. 1981). Speaking in a recorded message to the group, Bishop Richard said:

"Congratulations on [your] 45th anniversary... I remember Fr Albon very well since he taught me at the seminary, I know that he would have been a great inspiration... The prayers of the group over so many years will have brought many blessings to members, and the wider community alike, and I assure you of my prayers for the future."

As well as gathering every Wednesday evening for prayer, praise, teaching and discussion, the group has run a range of "faith deepening" courses for the wider parish and beyond over the decades, including Life in the Spirit seminars; Alpha and Café courses; Healing Ministry Training; and two Parish Missions in 1996 and 2013. They have also offered Taizé evenings, Holy Hours and Healing services for the parish.

Originally known as the "Parish Prayer Group" - as they were the only such group for many years - they later changed their name to the "Life in the Spirit" to distinguish themselves from other prayer groups which later started up including: Mothers' Prayers, Fathers' Prayers, the Meditation Group, the Rosary Group, and the Bible Study Group.

The high point of Saturday's celebrations was Charles and Sue Whitehead's inspiring presentation. Charles worked in leadership in charismatic renewal for many years, including eleven years as chair of <u>CHARIS</u>, the International Catholic Renewal Organisation in Rome, under Pope John Paul II.

Speaking to attendees, Charles and Sue recounted how their faith had come alive through the Holy Spirit, their involvement running a Prayer Group, and working in charismatic renewal – a movement described by Pope Francis as "a current of grace of the Spirit for all the Church."

The celebrations concluded with a shared buffet lunch and lively fellowship – renewing old friendships and making new ones. One participant remarked: "[It] was such an uplifting day! It answered so many questions I had." Reflecting after the anniversary, Alastair, who has led the group since 1992, said:

"Our founder, Fr Michael, was apparently a very joyful character and we have always tried to emphasise the Joy of the Gospel in our prayer and praise. Numbers attending have fluctuated over the years, ranging from a handful to over 20... One of our former members became a professor of theology and another is a trainer of catechists. As well as St Joan's parishioners, we welcome attendees from other local parishes and denominations."

### Full message from Dr. William Newton, former member of Prayer Group

I remember with real gratitude the time that I spent in Farnham and the most important element of that time was definitely the formation and fellowship that I received through the parish and particularly the prayer group. At that time in my life I had had an adult conversion just a year or so before and the prayer group became a real home for me and in a sense it was like a greenhouse protecting me as a little sapling. So I could say that basically the prayer group and the community were absolutely essential for me at that time in my life to foster me in my faith.

I had no idea of course at that time where Providence would lead me. I remember Alastair once you giving me a word in the prayer group which related to what our Lord says to Peter at the end of John's Gospel concerning somebody leading him where he would rather not go. In many ways living abroad is a difficult thing - I think that's particularly the case since we moved to the US. I certainly believe that I'm doing what the Lord wants but there is a sense in which I do think now and then of the word you gave me then and wonder whether it relates to the current experience of living away from home.

Anyway, I do thank you greatly for your kindness to me during those important years. I have no doubt that the prayer group has done great good over the many years for many people that it has existed. What is so striking is that it is a manifestation of deep fidelity to the Lord. In my limited experience prayer groups ebb and flow and they can easily peter out if there aren't people with deep conviction and fidelity to keep them going. I'm sure that my experience with the prayer group is the experience of many people who perhaps have moved on to different places, but who at one time received essential graces for the rest of their life through that prayer group.

Words that come to my mind are: 'well done good and faithful servant. enter into the joy of the master.'
