Reflection for the Feast of St Thomas

When I was a fulltime teacher, I set aside a few days each term to hold 'Maths Hospital'. Any child could suggest an area of maths where they felt baffled or uncertain and we would go back to the simplest steps and build back up. Occasionally a subject would be requested by a very capable mathematician and I would say quietly, "You get every question right," and they would wail, "But I don't understand!" and I would hear the turmoil of feeling out of their depth.

Wherever we are on the journey of faith, from confirmed saint to hardened sceptic, feeling a sense of doubt is normal. Maybe explaining our faith feels like too great a challenge so we don't mention it. Perhaps life is complicated enough without taking a risk on an invisible God.

Today we remember St Thomas. He is sometimes called Doubting Thomas, but I see his questions as courageous and honest. None of us has all the answers but (thankfully) we are not called to spout watertight arguments. Christian faith is about relationship with Jesus and the testimony of his love in our lives. That is what we are celebrating as Carys joins us as Deacon and that is what we hold to on St Thomas' feast day.

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side. I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with vou.' Then he said to Thomas. 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'
