I wonder what the attraction is about Carol Services? The glitter can wear a bit thin if you are involved in guite a number, and I did used to get tired of singing about Santa being stuck up or down the chimney, but they are definitely part of the cultural landscape; even if, perhaps especially if, you are not a regular churchgoer.

They almost speak of a different age when the Church was part of the warp and weft of social life, and we have a nostalgia for that - a bit like for banks and butchers on every high street. Life seemed simpler and safer then, and we hark back to it, slightly reluctant to admit that on-line banking is very convenient and the supermarket cheaper for meat.

For me and many others, they also contain something of childhood, an age of innocence when letters were written to Father Christmas and presents received and stockings filled. It's enough to hear the first notes of some carols and the opening lines of some of the Old Testament readings from Isaiah to take us straight back there; or the sonorous tones of a headmaster intoning "In the beginning was the Word" to be school pupils again.

The wonder, joy and delight of a childhood Christmas are nourishing and wholesome, provided we're not stuck there. Can we use these as a springboard to something more adult: the light that cuts through the darkness, the value of vulnerability, God's desire to be human because God love us so much.

Baruch 5: 1-9

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on for ever the beauty of the glory from God. Put on the robe of the righteousness that comes from God; put on your head the diadem of the glory of the Everlasting; for God will show your splendour everywhere under heaven. For God will give you evermore the name, 'Righteous Peace, Godly Glory' Arise, O Jerusalem, stand upon the height; look towards the east. and see your children gathered from west and east at the word of the Holy One, rejoicing that God has remembered them. For they went out from you on foot, led away by their enemies; but God will bring them back to you, carried in glory, as on a royal throne. Luke 3: 1-6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth; and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."
