Reflection for All Saints Sunday

November 1st and 2nd are important days in the Christian calendar, with celebrations of All Saints Day followed by All Souls Day (see front page for how we are marking these days at St Thomas this year). The first gives us an opportunity to focus on all the holy women and men through 2000 years of Christian history who have been outstanding examples of the faith - apostles, teachers evangelists, martyrs - but still flesh and blood human beings. We might also give God thanks for those who have been saints for us on our journey of faith, but who are not recognised institutionally. The second, All Souls Day, is a day of remembrance for the dead especially those who by their friendship and love have nurtured us in the past; it is an opportunity too to pray for those who have died unmourned and with no one to pray for them.

I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give water as a gift from the spring of the water of life.

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying:

'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
