

Who Can Look At My Appraisal?

Information Governance:

The security and confidentiality of personal and sensitive information, such as that contained in a doctor's appraisal portfolio, are very important. The principles of Information Governance that apply are well-covered in the NHS England Medical Appraisal Policy Annex H: Information Governance.

Essentially, this covers the safe storage and transmission of the appraisal portfolio as well as defining and limiting those who have access to the information provided by a doctor.

I find it helpful to think of this portfolio in a similar way to clinical notes, which are confidential but which need to be accessed by particular people for specific purposes. It is important not to include third party-identifiable information in the portfolio.

So, who can see your portfolio?

Those who have permission to look at your appraisal portfolio include:

- Your appraiser
- Your Responsible Officer (and his/her designated deputies who are involved in preparing the information that the RO needs to make a revalidation recommendation)
- The Wessex Appraisal Service Leadership Team - who provide quality assurance for the individual appraisers. This includes the Senior Leads (currently Dr Sue Bowen, Dr Samantha Davies, Dr Karen Gregory, Dr Majid Jalil, Dr Shehla Jamil, Dr Ed Sheridan, Dr Andie Siggers), the Deputy Service Lead (currently Dr Stephanie Hughes), and the Service Lead (currently Dr Susi Caesar)
- The Wessex Appraisal Service Quality Assurance Team - who provide quality assurance to the Area Team that the appraiser statements and advice accurately reflect the content of the appraisal portfolio. This is currently Dr Susi Caesar, Dr Stephanie Hughes, Dr Sue Bowen, Dr Samantha Davies, Dr Karen Gregory, Dr Majid Jalil, Dr Shehla Jamil, Dr Ed Sheridan, and Dr Andie Siggers
- The Wessex Appraisal Service Administrative Team – who deal with the administrative support of the appraisal process

- The GMC (for the purposes of making a revalidation recommendation or investigating a case of failure to engage)
- Anyone that you give permission to see your portfolio. Remember that you are not obliged to share your portfolio with anyone else, although you may choose to do so.

As you can see, the purposes for which each group of people have access to your portfolio are clearly defined and relatively restricted. All Health Education England Wessex Appraisal Service employees have very explicit confidentiality clauses in their contracts, and annual training in Information Governance.

When would we need your explicit permission to look at your portfolio?

Our policy clearly states that if we wish to use your appraisal information for any other purpose than those covered above, we need to ask for your explicit permission. We are grateful to those doctors who are prepared to share information so that research can be undertaken but you should never feel under any pressure to do so.
