#### Laura Murphy

Surrey Association of Cricket Officials

Laura helped set up the Surrey Association of Cricket Officials in 2007 alongside the then Chairman, David Edwards, and Treasurer, John Smith. Laura has worked tirelessly and efficiently as the Secretary under a number of Chairmen until she stepped down in March 2017 due to family commitments. Laura has been extremely efficient and always cheerful as she has served through a period of great change and development in the recruitment, training and development of cricket umpires and scorers. Cricket surveys tell us that players get much more enjoyment from the game when they have competent match officials. Laura has made an immense contribution in making sure Surrey has some of the best organised and trained umpires in the country. The Surrey Association of Cricket Officials feel she richly deserves the OSCA award for her many years of loyal service.

#### **Howard Cohen**

Surrey Association of Cricket Officials

Howard has been an umpire for nearly 40 years, standing at County 2nd XI, Minor County, Premier League and MCC matches. He currently is a Surrey Championship Umpire but also stands in other leagues and competitions within and outside of Surrey. He has happily stood in recent years with new umpires offering assistance in their development. He serves as County and Regional Education Officer for the Surrey Association of Cricket Officials and ECB Association of Cricket Officials in which he coordinates training of new match officials. He has worked tirelessly to promote new ideas about the way umpires and scorers are trained and supported, and is a great servant of the game. He has also coached many

young players and the Surrey Association of Cricket Officials believe is worthy of consideration for this award

#### Paul Bridge

Reigate Priory CC

Paul Bridge has been Reigate Priory CC's 1st XI scorer for eight seasons. Not only an excellent scorer, typically committing both weekend days, he supports the team in many other ways on his own initiative. At the start of each season Paul highlights changes to playing regulations and analyses the impact on the previous year's results and on future tactics e.g. how an altered bonus points system would affect plans to bat or bowl. Every week, without exception, Paul writes a highly professional game report, which reaches the Captain by Saturday evening! It is published in the Surrey Mirror and RPCC Newsletter. Paul writes match day programmes including introductions to opposition players. When a Reigate Priory CC player performs well, Paul will publish data on where the performance sits in the rankings at both Reigate Priory CC and in the league.





This award is given to those who show significant dedication of time and commitment to their club including performing several roles on matchdays. They show willingness to go beyond the call of duty to ensure that all matches are played and motivate players to uphold the spirit of cricket.

#### Robin Hudson

Brook CC

Robin Hudson, a Brook Cricket Committee member and Juniors Manager, has been the frontline driving force behind establishing the juniors section since 2013. He has the built up junior numbers in the club from an initial 15 in 2013 to roughly 70 today. He ensures teams are included in the Two Counties League (from U9 to U13). The older players will soon form the backbone of a 2nd XI in the l'Anson League. 4 U13s are now playing senior cricket and this number will increase in the years ahead ensuring team rejuvenation and the sustainability of cricket. Robin set up a professional coaching programme for each age group (13 weeks in the summer plus winter nets). He is a strong advocate of the Get the Game On campaign with volunteers and players within club and league. He has recruited parents to match manage each year group and to support him in a range of roles. He makes every effort to ensure all matches are played and fills in any gaps personally. He always upholds the spirit of cricket both in his junior manager capacity but in his senior playing role. An invaluable club asset!

#### **Alister Gregson**

Reigate Priory CC

Alister Gregson, Deputy Director of the 500 strong Junior Section of Reigate Priory CC, supervises 3 major training sessions a week, spending many hours at the club. He oversees 50+ qualified coaches and helpers to fully service each age group from U6 to U15. Alister keeps the Junior Section under appropriate control the children and parents are content and waiting lists are strong. Alister produces the fixture lists, organising complex ground arrangements preseason to permit 150 home matches; he ensures weekly that pitches are ready for concurrent league games. He runs the weekly BBQ after training with his wife, and attends Youth Section committee meetings. Alister sensitively leads the transition process for junior players into senior teams, stressing the 'Spirit of Cricket' inculcated at junior level. At least 10 of Alister's original U8 junior team (now U18s) have played senior cricket, due to the positive and mature climate Alistair has created and the player commitment he has earned. Alister is well regarded within the senior section for the breadth and vitality of his contribution. He is always available to advise

#### Vicki Howard

Reigate Priory CC

Vicki Howard has had an important impact on Reigate Priory CC for ten years, driving the rise of the female game. She is the women's team captain, a skilful player and committed coach. There are about 20 players in the squad who play 12 matches a season. Vicki is Head Coach and role model for girl players and ensures we have a strong supply of talent for junior teams. There are 108 female juniors, comprising 4 squads (U9s, U11s, U14s, U15s) and 5 teams, playing 40 matches a season.

Vicki is an excellent communicator and ensures a vital flow of information about the female game across this large club, winning support from all quarters. On women's match days she will play, organise transport and refreshments, uphold safety, umpire, and submit match reports.

Vicki demonstrates maturity to defuse difficult situations; she upholds the 'spirit of cricket' and is a key ambassador for Reigate Priory CC in Surrey. Over a long period of loyal service, Vicki has had a significant impact on the number of players (male and female) recruited and retained by Reigate Priory CC for the greater good of the game. Furthermore, she is a torch-bearer for a growing minority sport, accepting responsibility with energy and determination.

#### Stephen Marshall

Hindhead CC

Stephen has been a member of Hindhead cricket club for 48 years, starting as a youth player, playing in several leagues including the l'Anson at present. He has been the club's groundsman for 35 years, and spends many a working hour at the ground tending the pitch and ensuring that

the outfield is cut down regularly. Steve has been a committee member for a similar length of time and Chairman of the club for the last 20 years. As well as these roles Steve is happy to lend his hand to any chore across the club, including BBQ chef, bar man, and occasional tea lady, and is one of those stalwarts which keep clubs like ours going. Steve is a worthy nominee and Hindhead CC would love for him to be considered for the above award.

#### Guruparan Ganeshathasah

British Tamils Cricket League

Guru is British Tamils Cricket League's umpire Co-ordinator responsible for organising umpires for entire league matches (24) held within London area every Sunday. This is the main driving force behind the success of British Tamils Cricket League, Logistically it is very challenging task when British Tamils Cricket League find themselves with a lower number of umpires with increasing number of teams. Guru also British Tamils Cricket League Cricket Academy co-ordinator in Surrey. He liaises with parents and organises indoor and outdoor sessions. He successfully organised 28 children as flag and anthem kids for the ICC Champions Trophy opening match at Kia Oval when requested by the Surrey Cricket Foundation. #### Steve Frise

Cobham Avorians CC

To summarise what Steve Frise does for the Avorians is impossible. He formal role is "Facilities Manager" - broad enough for us all to cry at virtually any situation "Well I'm sure Steve can pick that one up!" Whether he's up to his elbows trying to make a mower work, or doing the teas on a Sunday, or taking time to develop a new colts square or even building us a new sightscreen - Steve has become an ever-present fixture at the club and is one of those "behind the scenes people" without whom the club simply wouldn't function. Steve joined the Avorians in 2000. He started as a volunteer and then acquired his Level 2 qualification to become an Academy Coach in 2008 and became Academy Director for the period of 2010 - 2015. In this time, the academy grew by over 20%, and we see the benefits of his work now appearing in the Avorian adult teams. 2015 didn't mean retirement by any means - as Steve then picked up the catchall role of "facilities manager" and as such turns his hand to most things over the summer and the winter that need to get done. His latest project has involved him taking the two level 1 groundsman's courses in preparation to takeover that role when our long serving current groundsman leaves us. The esteem he is held in by us all is high as was demonstrated when he was inaugural winner of the John Grimwood Cup – given to the Avorian of the Year – in 2015. He is without a doubt the heartbeat of Cobham Avorians CC.

#### Simon Dibdin

Frensham CC

For over 20 years, Simon has served as Secretary of the Youth section at Frensham. He ensures young players get properly registered, working tirelessly with the parents to recruit kids and keep them playing cricket through the difficult teenage years. His dedication in this role has enabled a small village club to continue running 4 adult league sides on a Saturday, and a Sunday social side. Currently, at least half of the current senior membership has been through the Youth section in which Simon has played the pivotal role. Simply put, the club could not survive in its current shape

without Simon. Last year, Frensham were unable to find a new youth Chairman, and Simon nobly decided to take on that role in addition to his secretarial duties. Now, in addition to managing the database of some 250 Youth members, he organises coaching, oversees fixtures and has proved an invaluable new member of the senior Club Committee. Simon achieves all this, despite having a demanding job as a British Airways Purser, which requires him to spend considerable time travelling. His contribution to Frensham and West Surrey cricket is immense; he would be a worthy recipient of this award

#### Jon Vocking

Bramley CC

Bramley CC are nominating Jon for his tireless commitment and enthusiasm for bring life back into Bramley CC. As Chairman of the cricket club Jon has been the driving force behind the rejuvenating the club. Success include growing the numbers of players in senior teams, securing new sponsorship, refresh and invigorate governance structures, bridges with local community and getting them involved with the club, securing grant funding for the improvement of facilities, training and equipment and establishing and growing a new colts squad which has grown from 12 in 2015 to over 40 in 2017 with a particular focus on girls which has bought new players to the club, a much needed income stream and an increased sense of community engagement. Without Jon's vision and commitment over the last 3 years. Bramley CC would probably not exist anymore.

#### **Eleanor Deighton**

Ashtead CC

Eleanor has been part of Ashtead for at least 20 years, initially becoming involved when her son started to play as a junior. Over the years she has taken on numerous responsibilities, all of which she executes with calm, precision, common

sense, good humour & boundless energy. She has been one of Ashtead Welfare Officers for at least 10 years, bringing wisdom from her years as head of sport at a local school. Eleanor has, for the last nine years, been pivotal in managing and improving the bar facilities in the Club's "new" pavilion. Her patience in training new staff is boundless. As the pavilion has become established as the must-book venue in the village for birthday parties, retirements, wakes, celebrations, fitness classes and numerous other activities. Eleanor manages and stewards the lettings, warmly welcoming hirers if appropriate and usually gaining extra bookings for the Club as a result. Eleanor also assists with cricket teas, 1st XI lunches, pint pulling, BBQ flipping, additional catering, social events and ensuring that the Club's overseas player, living next door, is nurtured, comfortable and fed! She is absolutely vital to the smooth running of the Club, its non-cricket income and status in the village.

#### Oliver Clarke

Walton-on-Thames CC

Oliver Clarke is a life-long member at Waltonon-Thames cricket club. Whilst for a 28 year old this may not seem uncommon, Oliver's outstanding contribution is that he has and increasingly continues to contribute both on and off the field at a level over and above that of his contemporaries and other more senior members of the Club. Like so many other cricket clubs. we lack the required number of volunteers and financial strength to achieve all that we would wish, so the outstanding behind the scenes contribution of Oliver Clarke has been invaluable in our survival. We are predominately a young club, hence the only contribution of the majority of playing members is to simply play for the club. as and when available, which makes Oliver's contribution all the more significant. Oliver formed the 4th XI in 2013 and captained them, via successive promotions, to the Premier League in 2016. He only left that pivotal role, which was a vital pathway for so many of our younger players, to take on the newly formed role of Head of

Kingstonian CC

Neel has gone well beyond his role as 3rd XI captain in recent years. He has taken the lead in using social media and advertising to recruit new players to help the club expand to 6 regular teams. Neel has taken the initiative in researching suppliers and funding and has obtained grants towards two sets of mobile covers, and a mobile batting cage. He has organised pre-season task forces to carry out repairs at the ground, such as fixing fences and replacing the shed. He was the force behind the success of the club first colts section, as he worked with local schools to recruit colts, organised the training for players on coaching and support workers' courses. He has also been persistent in chasing the local council for improved road signs to the ground. He negotiated with Elmbridge Council to give us use of their recreational ground for 2017. He is now actively working toward getting the club up to Clubmark status. So, in summary it is through Neel's initiative and efforts that the club has expanded it playing strength, started a colt's section and have much better facilities at the ground.

#### Philippa Elburn

Ashtead CC

Pip has volunteered since 2002, initially as admin for her son's age group, ensuring all the families felt included whilst also being kit liaison. For the last 10 years Pip has masterminded adult teas, making them or managing deputies which includes inducting teenage girls into the catering fold. The quality is superb and she receives numerous plaudits and job offers from the opposition! She also regularly supplies delicious snacks after 1st XI matches, encouraging all teams, families and supporters to return and munch their way through their glories or sorrows. Over the last two seasons she has organised and BBQ-catered for the growing band of Minis (150 aged 5-9) and their families, helping create a welcoming atmosphere and making Ashtead CC the go-to place on a Friday evening. She cajoles the parents into volunteering too, helping make the Club sustainable. She is instrumental on the Club's Social Sub Committee, seizing the opportunity to organise events, inevitably with superb catering and President's Day each year would not be the same without her stunning cuisine. #### Matthew Camp

South West Surrey Midweek Cup

Oakwood Hill CC would like to nominate Matthew as a result of his great work in developing a vibrant and exciting T20 competition in Surrey over the past 3 years. Matt took over the administration of the South West Surrey Midweek Cup in 2014 and has gone about driving exponential growth from 6 teams to 16 in the space of 3 years. He is passionate about providing opportunities to play and has focussed on keeping bureaucracy and red tape to a minimum in order to encourage participation. This is seen by how he administers the league using technology for things like rule change votes and the like. Working with a truly positive mindset the focus is always on looking at how to make the experiences better for the players and the fact the league continues to grow is a reflection on the work he puts in.

#### **Helen Ross**

Travelbag Surrey Championship

The Championship owes much to Helen who exemplifies the old saying "if you want something done ask a busy person", combining the work she does for the League with the role of chair of Godalming CC. Helen joined the Championship Executive Committee in 2013, primarily to take on

the task of setting up and updating the league's website. Since then she has led the work that we have done to utilise technology in the collection and dissemination of scores, results, news and guidance, as well as upping the League's game in terms of the quality and regularity of its interaction with clubs and players. Technology and the internet are now at the heart of how the League conducts much of its business. The work Helen has put into this change has greatly reduced the workload that was previously placed on others by the use of paper, post and telephone. As well as overseeing the introduction of Play-Cricket as the means by which results are collected and league tables posted, Helen has also taken an advisory role on a key ECB working group charged with improving the quality and functionality of Play-Cricket as a resource for leagues.

#### **David Ackland**

East Surrey Colts League

David is Fixtures Secretary for the East Surrey Colts League and has undertaken the role with great efficiency for a number of years. His attitude to creating fixtures is to give clubs as many games as can be crammed into the weeks available and he uses various techniques to achieve that aim, perhaps creating two divisions with play-offs or using public holidays. He also maintains a flexible



approach within the league's rules to fixture rescheduling provided no unfair advantage is created, in an effort to get as many matches as possible played. David has also encouraged the league's drive towards on-line scoring, which leads to more full scorecards being uploaded (in good time) to Play-Cricket.

David also keeps a close eye on the League Cup competitions to ensure clubs keep up with the schedule to avoid over-run and the potential difficulties with finals being played outside the league's boundary dates. David also tends to be the contact point for almost any query that the league's clubs have and, with others, will take sensible and practical views on matters of dispute or rule interpretation. He deals very efficiently with heavy 'email traffic'. He is the mainstay of the league committee and maintains a very positive approach to the main objective of the league - to provide a conduit for clubs to play a large number of games.

#### Mantrulaady Thushaarah

British Tamils Cricket League

British Tamils Cricket League (BTCL) have been conducting cricket league matches since 2006 among British Tamils. Since inception in 2005, organisers of BTCL have been duty-bound to ensure its future growth and continuity. They also work very hard to make BTCL's effective service continue year after year to our British Tamils and the diaspora. BTCL started its cricket academy program for community kids in 2015/16. This is with the help of Surrey Cricket Foundation to introduce cricket among community kids. This was well received within the community and now we have 40 kids and 4 volunteers to run the academy. This was instrumental to start the sessions in other counties as well. The number of teams within BTCL has increased by 6 this year. To top it all off, a BTCL selected team won the Surrey Interleague Championship in 2016.







Nominees create a legacy for their club. not just a short-term effect but also leaving a base for future stability and growth. They use initiatives in gathering support of local and national businesses and recruit a significant number of volunteers from the local community to help out.

#### David Brown

Streatham & Marlborough CC

David became a social playing member of the club a few years ago when he enrolled his daughter with our junior section. When we were selected as a national showcase club for CricketForce -David was approached to see if he could assist. What he's done has far surpassed what any of us could imagine. Using his array of contacts and twisting a few arms along the way, he negotiated discounts and freebies for materials, produced a 30-page project plan and arrange for all the materials on the day. What's more, is he has personally donated 3 weeks of his time to the project and continues to do so at the expense of managing his own firm. A truly fantastic effort which made a substantial difference to what we could achieve when on the national stage.

Jon works tirelessly coming up with innovative concepts and games to increase participation in the U8 age groups specifically. Through his creation of Mini Crickets in 2010 he now coaches over 300 children weekly along with his work at Ashtead Cricket Club and Downsend School. Mini Crickets fun, child friendly characters and games now offer after school sessions at over 10 Surrey primary schools and offer holiday clubs also. Jon has a unique manner with children which many parents have not seen elsewhere. He has inspired an endless number of children to fall in love with cricket and displays phenomenal hard work and dedication.

#### Asad Butt

Thornton Heath CC

In just under 9 months, we already have 50 members because of his excellent work and we continue to grow largely due to his stewardship as head coach. We now boast having students from a variety of backgrounds, many of whom had no knowledge of the game and are now regulars at the club. This can be largely attributed to his passion for the game and spreading his

knowledge gained from 20 years of playing and coaching. Thornton Heath CC are proud to have Asad as an integral part of the coaching structure at the club which Thornton Heath CC hope will continue for a long time.

Frimley CC

Frimley wanted to start a girl's section and although there were some people willing to help. Frimley CC quickly realised coaching girls was very different from boys. The hunt for help began and the club came across Stuart who had been coaching girls at a local Hampshire club. Trying the usual "could you come over for a session and give us some advice" worked well, all the girls were enthusiastic meaning one week turned into two, then a month, and Stuart has now been with Frimley for two years. This year Stuart led Frimley's Chance to Shine scheme specifically aimed at introducing girls to cricket in school and for 2018 has devised a programme of trials aimed at bringing in 32 new children into Frimley CC each year. This would take anyone a considerable amount of dedication, but for Stuart, it is even more inspiring as he is visually impaired. As someone who is visually impaired, Stuart can't drive, so has to rely on buses and walking to the schools across Surrey Heath, Taking inclusivity to a new level all the children are interested, excited and enthusiastic, enjoying the benefits of having a coach demonstrating that cricket is for all and cricket has no boundaries. Stuart is also captain of the hugely successful Surrey Visually Impaired side who won an unprecedented treble last year. However, in coaching, the most important people are the children, and Frimley CC would like to leave the final piece to the PE Head of Cordwalles School, a school that only introduced girls cricket two years ago in which they said "I thought I would let you know that the Cordwalles Girls Cricket team were finalists this afternoon at the Year 5 and 6 competitions. The Year 5 girls all agreed that they used some of the skills they learnt during their sessions with you. I am really proud of them - last year we came 6th out 8! Thank you for your time with our children."

#### **Margaret Greig**

Englefield Green CC

Englefield Green started junior cricket in 2013. Maggie, a level 2 coach and ex-player, has been integral to this development through her commitment to coaching twice a week and leading a junior development team in the West Surrey Youth Cricket League. She also manages team availability and communications with parents. Maggie is committed, enthusiastic and integral to the success of the club's junior section. She has made particular contributions to the coaching of girls; her approach, ideas and techniques have significantly helped expand the number of girls participating in cricket at the club. She is an engaging and fun coach, but demanding and uses her first-hand playing experience of the



game in her coaching toolkit – the girls respond well to her. The club has supported Runnymede's girls cricket team in the Surrey Youth Games for 2016 and 2017. Maggie helps manage the team and has led taster coaching sessions for the local Beavers and Girl Guides groups. 

#### **Brian Turner**



As a player in the 1970's and 1980's, Brian was an accomplished wicket-keeper and a loval servant but it was his contribution after his playing days finished that merits such special recognition. Brian became Chairman of the Club in 1992 at a time when it is fair to say things weren't going particularly well. Membership was dwindling, numerous administrative roles within the Club remained vacant and the Junior Section. was weak. Over the course of the next decade. this was all to change due entirely to his focus, diligence and, most importantly, his inspirational leadership: this in addition to being Head of Security for Next, based in Leicester! In February 1997, the Club's pavilion was completely destroyed by fire. Almost singlehandedly, Brian managed the relief effort by securing funding from a variety of sources and overseeing the construction of a new building whilst still ensuring that cricket continued to be played in what were obviously very difficult circumstances. His legacy lives on and the Club continues to benefit from the work he started: the premises are impressive. the Junior Section is thriving and the Club now ranks with the best in Surrey. However, none of this would have been possible without Brian's drive and determination over the ten-year period of his stewardship of the Club. He continues to do sterling work for the Club behind the scenes and next year it is hoped that he will, deservedly, become the Club's President. A Lifetime Achiever Award would certainly be a fitting reward for his unparalleled contribution to our Club.
