
100 BALL COUNTDOWN CRICKET

Equipment

Balls

Stumps

Boundary and fielding circle markers

Aim

Whoever scores the most runs wins

Organisation

Age and stage appropriate pitch, fielding circle and boundary - see ECB Junior Format Recommendations for more information

100 balls per innings

25 ball powerplay - only 2 fielders allowed outside of the fielding circle - for the remainder of the innings: no more than five fielders (Men's Hundred) and four fielders (Women's Hundred) are allowed to be outside of the fielding circle

Fielding team change ends after 10 balls

Bowlers deliver either 5 or 10 consecutive balls - umpires call 'five'

Each bowler can deliver a maximum of 20 balls

Each fielding team gets a strategic time out of up two minutes - coaches can enter the field of play to discuss tactics and plans

If a batter is out caught and the batters crossed while the ball was in the air then the non-striker cannot take strike

2 runs are awarded for a no ball. The delivery after a no ball shall be a free hit except a no ball called for a short pitched delivery clearly passing over the head height of the batter

Adaptation/variation

50 balls per innings

Pairs 100 ball cricket
