

EASTERN COUNTIES WANDERERS RETURN!

Next season will see the return of the Eastern Counties Wanderers XV following a decision by the Eastern Counties Management Committee at its meeting in April.

The idea of the Wanderers is to offer a route to representative rugby that bridges the gap between the current Eastern Counties men's team and the three county representative sides - its revival is part of a broader review of representative rugby in the Cambridgeshire, Norfolk and Suffolk and will offer players who are currently turning out for lower level clubs the opportunity to play at a higher level and to compete for places in the senior squad which is largely made up of players from clubs at levels 3 to 5.

"There are many players at local clubs who for work, family or other reasons cannot commit the amount of time necessary to play in National League 1 or similar but who still have the talent and ambition to play higher levels of rugby", says CB Chair Alasdair Bovaird, "the Wanderers concept will give them an outlet for that talent."

Planning is now underway under the leadership of Eastern Counties President, Ian Forton, to schedule fixtures for the 2018-19 season, and to appoint a coaching/management team. Coaches at club and county level will be involved in the planning to support the new team without interfering with the needs of clubs through the season.



With Steph scoring 62 of the 102 points scored be England Women throughout the competition!

The women's squad played their first ever international fixture against another rugby Deaf nation. They played a five-game series against Australia women's Deaf team winning the series 5-0 in five extremely close games. Therefore, becoming the official world Deaf women's champions.

AND if that wasn't achievement enough, Steph has been made vice-captain of the England Women's Deaf XV with a view to her taking over the captaincy in 2-3 years!

Having missed the first EC Women's game against Oxfordshire for obvious reasons, Steph returns to the squad for the game against Buckinghamshire on Sunday 13th May, where we hope she will keep her high scoring form going! Well done Steph, you are a true inspiration to us all and especially Women's Rugby.









COLCHESTER RFC RFU ACCREDITATION PRESENTATION

All clubs will be aware that the objective of the RFU's Accreditation Scheme is to encourage clubs to become stronger, more efficient and effective and more enjoyable places in which to play rugby.

One of the key drivers here relates to integration with the local community. Colchester RFC heeded this advice to the full before the last game of the season at their Mill Road ground when President, Brian Borges, was delighted to accept the plaque acknowledging the Club has successfully navigated through the re-accreditation procedure.

The presentation was made during a luncheon for 180 members and sponsors including the Right Reverend Roger Morris, Bishop of Colchester and Will Quince the local MP.

The day was successfully completed when the 1st Team went on to maintain their unbeaten home record scoring the thousandth point of the season in the process.



DISS FLOODLIGHTS

The ECRU Funding & Facilities Group identified the provision of floodlights at the Diss Club as a priority project within the CB and the scheme was subsequently included in the RFU's Facility Fund Programme.

This action resulted in the award of a £25k grant by the RFU that has helped the Club realise it's dream of providing new floodlights in this its 60th anniversary year.

In recognition of his efforts the official switch on was performed by Brian Bale the Club Treasurer.

He said "the ambition is to continue to grow the club in terms of membership, standard of rugby played and continued improvement of facilities. It's all part of a continuing development."

TWO EXCITING OPPORTUNITIES TO LEAD EASTERN COUNTIES RUGBY INTO THE FUTURE

Eastern Counties are looking to appoint two key volunteers for the 2018-19 season to lead key aspects of the game from next season:

Honorary Director of Representative Rugby - this volunteer will lead and co-ordinate all the Eastern Counties representative rugby programmes - male and female, youth, under 20s and adults. Our vision is "to play at the highest level while maintaining and growing our connection with the community of clubs and players across Eastern Counties" and the Director of Representative Rugby will need to pull together a team of people to help us deliver that vision. They will also be expected to work closely with those leading the representative squads in the three counties - Cambridgeshire, Norfolk and Suffolk - to ensure that a consistent and quality experience is available to all involved.



Chair of Community Game Growth - a volunteer is required to Chair this new group tasked with ensuring that more 15-a-side rugby is being played across the three counties. Our objective is that no player who is available and wishes to play a game of rugby should be unable to find one to play, and our view is that this will require new approaches to support clubs and players in providing those playing opportunities. Coach development, youth rugby and adult competitions will fall under the remit of this group and the post holder will be a member of the Eastern Counties Management Committee. They will also have responsibility for alternative forms of the game - touch, sevens, etc - as pathways to the fifteen-a-side game.

Full details of these roles and the appointment process will appear in social media and on the Eastern Counties website during the week beginning 14 May - please take a look and think about putting yourself forward if you are interested.
