PRESIDENT'S INTRODUCTION

The 2024 season will have a new feel to it. New sponsors and new teams, but before I talk about that I want to look back at the 2023 season. Heysham have been the nearly men for a while, challenging both Carnforth and Westgate in recent years. They were unbeaten in the League which they finally won for the first time since 1961 and their first team will play in the Palace Shield in 2024. Phil Bovis was a shrewd signing, and Jamie Cassidy's late decision not to transfer to Morecambe a bonus. Heysham go with our best wishes as they seek a higher level of competition. Adam Richardson beat the Division 1 highest score previously held by a diminutive all-rounder with 195* from 139 balls with 31 fours and 3 sixes. The same diminutive all-rounder is also no longer the last player to do the double of 1000 runs and 50 wickets in Division 1 and cup games, with Ethan Elwood taking that mantle.

In Division 2, Silverdale won the League by a canter and will be welcomed back into Division 1. Division 3 was a herculean tussle between Ingleton, Burneside 2nds and Trimpell; and Leven Valley and Windermere. Windermere were pipped on the last day on number of games won. In Division 4, we welcomed Appleby Eden 3rds, Heysham 3rds and Shireshead 4ths into the League and welcomed back Burneside 3rds. Morecambe 4ths beat Ulverston 3rds in the Play-off final.

Our Cup finals were disrupted by the weather. Congratulations to Burneside who retained the Hackney & Leigh Trophy, Shireshead 2nds who did the same with the British Rose Cricket Trophy, Ingleton who won the Kendal Sports Trophies Cup and Morecambe 4ths who were again winners of the Moon & Coxhill Cup. Thanks are due to our sponsors and to the grounds who hosted the finals – Netherfield, Warton, Heysham and Westgate.

Off the field it was a very sad year as we lost a large number of people who are real legends of the game. An XI picked from Paul Antcliffe (Heysham), Stuart Lord (Holme), Tony Jones (Warton), Steve Parkinson (Shireshead), Ronnie Boyd (Warton), David Rucastle (Warton), Ken Shepherd (Arnside), Brian Gudgeon (Lancaster), David Oates (Burneside), Graham Barnes (Holme), Gordon Howarth (Arnside), Joe Tomlinson (Kirkby Lonsdale),

would take some beating. Perhaps a bit light on batting but with that bowling attack I'd back them to defend almost any score and enjoy reflecting at length on the game in the clubhouse later. We continue to post John Glaister's tributes on the WCL Pitchero site and on the Facebook site https://www.facebook.com/ WestmorlandCricketLeague/ where we update news throughout the year. We awarded Tony Jones Life Membership of the League last year as recognition for his long service as a highly respected umpire and as a member of the Management Committee. At the AGM we announced that Derrick Hackney, a long-term sponsor of the League's main cup competition and former player and current umpire had been awarded Life Membership.

The rule changes brought in for 2023 remain in place including the right of clubs to request later start times than the default 1 pm. Fixtures in the handbook and on Play Cricket indicate the start time so please do check. There are fewer rule changes this season, but there are changes to who pays umpires' expenses in Division 2 games and the pool player system.

We have ten new teams in 2024. Appleby Eden (firsts and seconds), Kirkby Stephen (firsts and seconds), Lindal Moor (firsts & seconds), Millom (thirds), Penrith (seconds), Settle (seconds and thirds). To accommodate teams at the right level and to recognise the changes that Pyramid structures in Cumbria and Lancashire bring we have changed the rules about promotion.

At the end of the 2024 season, the top 2 in the WCL can opt to move to the Palace Shield (with the third and/or fourth place team getting the choice if one or both of the top two decline the choice). We are expecting the option of transfer to the Cumbria League to remain in place but at the time of writing that hasn't been confirmed. We have accommodated the new teams in the division that we believe best fits with their playing standard. One sided games benefit no one. This means a 14 team Division 1, 16 teams in Division 2 and 14 teams in Division 3. It has been a nightmare to do the fixtures and we will revert to 12 teams or as near as we can get for 2025.

This means that if two teams move to the Palace Shield at the end of this season, then two teams will be relegated to Division 2, as long as the top two teams in the Division are eligible for

promotion (at the end of the 2024 season there is no relegation from the Palace Shield, because they are contributing teams to the restructure of the Northern League).

This means that a minimum of 5 teams will be relegated from the 16 team Division 2 (it could be up to 7 if no teams opts to leave the League).

It has been agreed that only the winners of Division 3 will have the option of promotion. This is because with so many teams being relegated into Division 3 that it would be too big a jump otherwise. There is the possibility of more teams in 2025 and if so we will accommodate them at the right level in the structure.

I want to reiterate the importance of all of our clubs. Not just those who have ambitions to play at a higher level. Cricket is a social game at the heart of our communities, and it is vitally important that we all do what we can so that the game can move from survival to flourishing in villages where the challenges of smaller resident populations have to be recognised. It is 130 years this year since the WCL was formed with Gatebeck the champions of the new 8 team League. Gatebeck CC is long gone, but their competitors in that season included 5 clubs still very much in evidence - Arnside, Holme, Milnthorpe, Netherfield and Sedawick. It is also 100 years this year since the WCL reformed after World War 1 when Kirkby Lonsdale CC joined for the first time at their new ground at Lunefield Park. Windermere the pre-war champions couldn't raise a team and Burneside were the first team to win the League in the inter-war period with Holme runners-up. George Hall (Holme) topped the batting averages with 266 runs at 26.18 whilst Jack Barnes won the bowling with 26 wickets at 2.65. Fourth in the bowling was Holme's Tommy Hunter. Any relation to Stuart and Kieran? The point of this paragraph is to emphasise the rich legacy and historical continuity and the central point that our game played in the leisure time of so many generations of our forefathers.

Finally I am delighted to be able to announce that we have a new League sponsor. For the next three years we will be the ICS Accounting Westmorland League. We also have new sponsors in the junior section.

LEAGUE RULES AS UPDATED FOLLOWING SENIOR AND JUNIOR AGMs; ALTERATIONS AND NEW RULES HIGHLIGHTED IN ROLD ITALICS

THE ICS WESTMORLAND LEAGUE RULES

SECTION 1 Constitution and Management

1 The League shall be called "The Readers Westmorland Cricket League" (hereafter referred to as 'The League").

The aims and objectives of the league shall be:

To offer competitive opportunities in the name of cricket

To promote the League within the local community in the name of cricket

To ensure a duty of care to all members of the League

To provide all of its services in a way that is fair to everyone

To ensure that all present and future members receive fair and equal treatment

2 The Officials of the League shall be President, Vice President, Hon Secretary, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Fixtures Secretary, Hon. Results Secretary, Hon. Registration, Records & Statistics Secretary, League Safeguarding Officer and Hon Umpires Secretary, all of whom shall retire annually at the AGM but will be eligible for re-election.

The Officials of the Junior Section of the League shall be the Chairman, Vice Chairman, Hon Secretary, Hon Results Secretary and Junior Representative to the Management Committee, all of whom shall retire annually at the Junior Section AGM but will be eliqible for re-election.

Each of the League Officials, the Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee and the Junior Section Administration may be paid an honorarium which shall be decided by the members clubs at the Senior Annual General Meeting.

- 3 a The Affairs of the Senior & Junior Leagues shall be controlled by the Management Committee which shall meet at least three times in each year and shall consist of President, Vice President, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer, and Hon League Safeguarding Officer, representative of the local branch of the ECBACO and Representative from the Junior Section, together with nine elected representatives to be nominated from the clubs in membership of the League. These representatives shall be elected for a one year period and will retire annually, but will be eligible for re-election.
 - iii A member of the LMC committee will be appointed to represent the League at LCF Recreational Cricket Group and Cumbria Cricket meetings as needed.
 - iii A member of the LMC committee will be appointed as Communications/Social Media Officer
 - b Elections will take place at the Annual General Meeting. Each committee member shall be proposed by a member club and such nomination shall be in the hands of the Hon. Secretary by 30 September in each year. No club may propose more than two of the nine elected representatives.

If for any reason an elected representative is unable to fulfil his/her commitment to the Management Committee, it shall have the power to co-opt a replacement, until the next AGM, at which time an election will take place.

Five members. including Chairman or Secretary shall constitute a quorum. The minutes of all Management Meetings shall be circulated to all members of the committee, Club Secretaries and Umpires' Secretary before the following meeting.

- c i The Management Committee (or a sub-committee of members where appropriate) shall deal with all matters concerning the League in accordance with these rules, precedent and policies confirmed or amended by member clubs at an AGM or EGM. Notice of Appeal against a decision of a sub-committee, or against the imposition of any fixed penalty specified within these rules, setting out the grounds for appeal, must be given in writing to the Secretary within seven days of the notification of the decision, or imposition, together with a deposit of £100 which shall be forfeited if the appeal is not upheld. Any fine imposed under the original penalty must also be paid with the deposit and this will be refunded if the appeal is successful. The appeal will be heard by the full Management Committee whose decision will be final.
 - In addition, the Management Committee shall deal with all matters not covered in these rules or any matters which arise that render these rules unworkable. Any such actions to be reported to, and approved by, the next AGM.
 - ii Whenever a Committee Member has a personal interest in a matter to be discussed, he or she must declare it, withdraw from that part of the meeting (unless asked to stay by the Chair of the meeting), withdraw during any vote and have no vote on the matter concerned. Such conflicts of interest must be recorded and minuted.
- d The ruling of the Management Committee shall be final with regard to matters arising from all competitions, except as provided for under rule 3(d) and (e).
- e All disciplinary matters in any way connected with the League or the conduct of matches or Tournaments played under the auspices of the League shall be dealt with in accordance with the Westmorland Cricket League Disciplinary Procedure, which will follow the ECB's General Conduct Regulations (available on the League website or by request from the Secretary) and which shall be deemed to be incorporated within and form part of these rules and which shall prevail over any of the League Rules which may overlap or be in conflict with the provisions of the Disciplinary Procedure.
- f The League shall adopt and practice "Safe Hands Policy". It is a club's responsibility to ensure that captains, scorers, club umpires and other officials designated by the ECB have a current DBS certificate.
- g Any appeals from clubs regarding the result of a match must be submitted within 14 days from midnight on the day the match was played
- 4 a The Secretary shall convene the Annual General Meeting not later than the second Saturday in December each year. He shall convene an EGM at any time, within 28 days, at the request of the

Management Committee or at the request of seven clubs, in writing, stating the business to be discussed.

The League Treasurer shall forward a copy of the League balance sheet to all clubs at least one week before the AGM

Likewise the Junior Section Secretary shall convene the Junior Section AGM not later than the last Saturday in January each year and a Junior Section EGM at any time, within 28 days, at the request of the Management Committee, Junior Section Committee or at the request of four clubs, in writing, stating the business to be discussed.

Not less than 14 days notice shall be given to Member Clubs of any AGM or EGM.

- b One third of the clubs in membership, plus four League Officials, shall constitute a quorum at either an AGM or EGM.
- c Any club not sending a representative to an Annual General Meeting or Extra-Ordinary General Meeting and captains/senior players for each team to the captains meeting shall be fined the sum of £25.
- 5 The Chairman for all meetings shall be the President of the League or in his/her absence such person as the meeting elects.
- 6 a Where the Management Committee deems that a proposed rule change does not have direct implications for all divisions, then only those teams who will be directly affected in the following season shall have a vote. These rule changes shall be carried on a simple majority basis of votes cast by the teams. In the event of a tie then the Management Committee representative shall have the casting vote.
 - b At General meetings, The Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Fixtures Secretary, a nominated LMC Representative with a mandate from the committee, the ECBACO Representative and each member club shall be entitled to one vote. The Chairman of the meeting shall have a casting vote.

SECTION II Membership of the League

7 a The League Divisional Championship shall be open to such number of Clubs as the Annual General Meeting may admit. Unless a Club is re-applying under rule 7g, admittance shall be determined purely on acceptable ground and facilities, and no Club may be excluded on the basis of race, sex, religion or colour.

In addition, any club admitted which meets the ground and facilities criteria should also normally either have been a member of the WCL at some time within the League's history; or be located within a circle which encompasses all member clubs as at 30 September 2023, draws the southern boundary at Forton and incorporates the Furness and Westmorland Council area.

The exception to this geographical criteria is where a club or team is in danger of being denied competitive cricket. In these exceptions, admission will be subject to a majority vote of clubs with teams in the Division to which the applying team's

- club would be admitted. A copy of the map will be made available on the League website or on request from the League Secretary.
- b The divisional status of all teams shall be subject to approval of clubs' ground and facilities by the Management Committee. In the event of a club having access to more than one ground, (for example where first and second teams play on different grounds), the fixtures will be prepared and published on information provided to the Fixtures Secretary by the relevant club as to which team will play on which ground. Any changes to venue must be notified to, and approved by a quorum of the Management Committee at least seven days before the scheduled fixture. In exceptional circumstances the Management Committee may dispense with the full notice requirement
- c All teams in Divisions 1 and 2 shall provide not only satisfactory playing areas but also a clean and bright payilion (or clubhouse) and ladies and gents flush toilets.
- d All Clubs with a team playing in Divisions 1 and 2 must provide either roll-on covers or a flat sheet adequate to cover one pitch.
- e All Clubs with a team in Divisions 1 and 2 must provide sightscreens at each end of their ground, such sightscreens to be used in all circumstances, unless weather conditions make it impossible to do so, when their use will be at the discretion of the umpires. Any application for exemption from this provision must be made to the Management Committee who will determine divisional status under rule 7 b
- f In the case of a new club applying for membership to the League, their facilities should include a clean and bright pavilion (or clubhouse) with ladies and gents flush toilets.
- g If any team forfeits two or more games in any one season, in addition to any other penalties, that team will have to re-apply to join the League at the next AGM.
- h The ECBACO, North Lancashire and South Lakeland Branch, shall be Associate Members
- i All Clubs shall have adequate Public Liability Insurance. A copy of the insurance policy shall be provided to the League Treasurer not later than the 20th April of each season

SECTION III Competitions

- 8 The following competitions, to be played for annually, shall be organised by the League.
 - a The League Championship.
 - b Divisional cup competitions for each of the Divisions of the League.
 - d Junior League Championship and Junior Cup competitions.
 - e Any special competition of which the rules will be published separately.
 - f The format and playing conditions for each of the Senior cup competitions will be decided by the Management Committee, taking into account the expressed views of member clubs. Details of the playing conditions will be published in the

league handbook Entry fees for all competitions to be determined at the Annual General Meeting, Failure to pay such fees by 31 May in each year shall result in all points gained in League Championship games being forfeited from that date until payment is received. Clubs will also be excluded from cup competitions for that year.

g In the event of disputes arising when clashes of fixtures occur to meet play by dates in Senior Cup competitions, priority is to be given in the following order: Division 1

Division 2

Division 3

Division 4

Any disagreements between clubs as to the date on which a cup match will be played must be referred to the Fixtures Secretary

- 9 There shall be promotion and relegation throughout all divisions, but no club shall be permitted to have two teams in the same division except for the bottom division
 - a At the end of each season teams will be able to choose to transfer to the Cumbria League Division 1 or the Palace Shield Division 1 for the following season. The Cumbria League and the Palace Shield will set out before the start of the season. how many teams can be transferred and the criteria for transfer. The decision on these options must reach the League Secretary in writing by 30th September.
 - b. Teams from the Cumbria League and Palace Shield may also be relegated from the respective Division 1s to the Westmorland League for the following season. These teams will be admitted to Division 1
 - c. After the end of the season, the League Secretary will advise all clubs of the likely Divisional composition for the following season by 31st October, subject to confirmation at the AGM. After taking account of promotion from and relegation to the WCL, in normal seasons it is intended that the strongest 12 teams based on the previous season's finishing positions will comprise Division 1 for the following season; the next strongest 12 teams comprising Division 2 and so on through the Divisions.*
 - d At the end of each season the top two teams in all Divisions except Division 1 may be promoted to play in the immediately higher division in the following season, with the exception of 'A' teams which have senior sides either already in the higher division or due to be relegated to that same higher division under Rule 9(b). For 2024 season, only the winners of Division 3 will have the option of promotion to Division 2. This recognises that as many as 5, 6 or 7 Division 2 teams could be relegated at the end of the 2024 season. Teams to be relegated in order of precedence:
 - i 'A' teams making way for their senior sides relegated from the immediately higher division
 - ii The bottom team, unless it is a senior team with an 'A' team due for promotion from the immediately lower division, but for the exclusion under rule 9a,
 - iii The next to bottom team, unless it is a senior team with an 'A' team due for promotion from the immediately lower division, but for the exclusion under Rule 9(a).
 - e In the event that two or more teams finish with equal points, it shall be resolved as follows:

- i Promotion/Division Winners/Runners up.
 - The team with the most wins shall be promoted, if this is tied then the team with the most wins shall be promoted, if this is tied you work along the points table until they can be separated. The divisional championship shall be decided under the same criteria.
- ii Relegation
 - The team with the least wins shall be relegated, if this is tied, the team with the least wins shall be relegated, if this is tied you work along the points table until they can be separated. Should promotion or relegation still be unresolved then it shall be decided by a play-off match. The choice of grounds shall be decided by the toss of a coin and the Leaque will provide neutral umpires.
- f. In addition to the Saturday divisions, there will be one or more Sunday divisions. Clubs are able to apply by 31 October to transfer to or from the Sunday division for the following season by notifying the League Secretary.
- NB: All promotion/relegation shall be subject to rule 7 b.

 * it may be necessary to operate one or more larger divisions for the 2025 season if
 teams join as an outcome of the pyramid reconfiguration. Teams will be placed in the
 division which the LMC judges best meets their playing strength.

SECTION IV Oualification of Players

Advisory notes for section IV

Where the Westmorland Rules refer to under or over 19 (16) (13) (11) (9), this shall be taken as per league rule 17.

Throughout section IV, where there is any reference to qualification of players for 2nd teams, this shall also apply in the same manner to 3rd & 4th teams

- a i Each club shall be responsible for the registration of its players. Registration details must be in the League's possession prior to the first Saturday of the League season. Failure to comply will incur a fine of £25. No player may be registered with more than one club in the Westmorland League and a player will not be formally registered until they have played their first game for a club. Captains must advise their opposition prior to the match is they are playing a player who needs to be registered and note this in the match comments on play-cricket. All on the day player registrations must be submitted by email to the Results Secretary by their club within 24 hours from the end of the match. If a club plays a player that they do not register prior to the season, or by email to the Results Secretary within 24 hours, or in exceptional circumstances, within seven days after the day of play: that club shall be fined £25 and the team deducted one point per unregistered player.
 - ii Westmorland League players may apply to the Eligibility Committee for dual registration, seeking permission to play for a 2nd club in another League. Players granted dual registration can only play for one club per week, with week being deemed to start on Saturday (this includes Bank Holidays and midweek matches). Likewise a player from another League may apply to the WCLfor dual registration subject to the approval of both Leaques, the club in the other leaque and the

same playing conditions. No permission will be granted after 31 July. Any player breaking dual registration rules will be treated as an ineligible player.

b Only players who have been resident in the United Kingdom since the 1st April prior to the beginning of the season shall be eligible to play in the Westmorland League unless the prior consent of the Management Committee has been obtained. Application for consent may be made at any time but, no consent will be granted after the third Saturday in August.

This subsection shall not apply to expatriates of the United Kingdom and British Citizen passport holders. Players who are not normally resident in the UK and who do not hold a UK passport must meet the ECB criteria to qualify as "an overseas amateur". Teams shall be limited to one overseas amateur during a season

- c No player shall play for more than one Club in any Weekend Cricket League in the same season, unless by consent of the Management Committee.
- d Only amateur players are eligible to take part in any senior League or Cup Competition.

The League Management Committee instructs all clubs to follow any directive issued by the ECB for young players.

No fielder (except the wicket keeper) under the age of 16 shall be allowed to field nearer than 11 yards measured from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side. In addition, the LMC strongly recommends that any player of any age, shall wear a helmet when fielding nearer than 5 yards in front of the wicket measured from the middle stump.

All clubs will follow any ECB Guidelines regarding young players in open age cricket; however in no circumstances shall a person under the age of 12 on 1 September the preceding year take part in any senior competition unless they are already in a County Representative squad and have prior approval of a Management Sub Committee which will include an ECB Level 2 coach (co-opted if needed) who has assessed the player. Any disputes regarding eligibility and qualification shall be resolved by the Management Committee whose decision shall be final. Any club found guilty of fielding an under age player will be fined £25 for a first offence.

e All transfer requests from within the Westmorland and Northern Leagues must be made by completing a transfer request form available from League Secretary or President or online. The original form must be received by the Chairman of the Eligibility sub-committee. by midnight on 31 st July.

Players re-locating from different parts of the United Kingdom may apply for a transfer after this deadline but, no consent will be granted after the third Saturday in August.

All players who have played for a different Club (unless playing under 10g or i) are subject to transfer and, all transfers are subject to the approval of the Management Committee

f Teams must normally field players that are recognised players in that particular team and if clubs have games spread over a weekend no player should play for more than one team without permission from the Eligibility Committee. In general if a player is to be dropped, the club must prove the player has suffered a drop in form or personal circumstances necessitates the drop, and that by dropping the player there is no intention of seeking an advantage. Personal circumstances include family, work and social commitments, returning after an injury, may be deemed acceptable reasons for dropping a player. In ALL cases the club <u>MUST</u> seek prior approval of the Eligibility sub-committee. The onus of proof of eligibility will lie with the club.

Clubs can seek permission by email to the Chairman of the Eligibility Committee for pre-approved players that may play in more than one team per weekend. In general approval shall be given for U18s and Over 60s however this will not be automatic for anyone playing in any other league or regularly in Division 1 of the Westmorland League.

NOTE: In ANY dispute the burden of proof will rest with the club and due to the relaxation of rules any abuse will be dealt with severely.

Note to 10 f - if a Club selects a player for the 2nd/3rd/4th team at their selection meeting who, if the senior team match is called off, would then appear not to be eligible for the 2nd/3rd/4th team, they should inform the Chairman of the Eligibility Sub-committee, Kevin Demain, in writing by email at the earliest opportunity, and no later than 72 hours prior to the game: likewise any queries regarding eligibility should be put in writing to the Chairman at the same email, The decision of the eligibility sub committee shall be final.

g i Members of clubs who are away from home for some part of the season, and play elsewhere at any standard during this time, will be permitted to play for their clubs on their return (e.g. University undergraduates)

ii Players who reside permanently elsewhere and play their cricket elsewhere will be permitted to play for a Westmorland League club provided that:

They are a paid up playing member of that club

They play their cricket in a similar or lower standard league.

NOTE: In ANY dispute the burden of proof will rest with the club

- h A player who has been suspended or fined by any other recognised cricket league shall not be allowed to play in any matches under the jurisdiction of the Westmorland League until the end of such suspension or until such fine has been paid.
- i A player may play for a club other than the one holding their registration without formal transfer subject to the prior consent of a quorum of the League Management Committee and the club holding their registration. The rules regarding the arrangements for pool players will be set out in a section in the League Handbook and on the League website.

The registered club will always take priority in selection issues. A player may only play for their registered club in any cup competition. Any formal transfer under rule 10e would override this rule.

- j In the event of any team fielding an ineligible player for any reason the team they play against shall automatically receive the maximum points. In addition, any points gained by a team fielding an ineligible player in any match shall be forfeited and the offending club shall be liable to pay such fine as the Management Sub-Committee considers appropriate
- k Where a player is selected to play for a representative team they may then continue to play for their adopted club with no penalties.
- I Where there is any reference to "season" this shall be taken as from the date of the first League match played by a Club in any League regardless of which of its teams play in the Westmorland League.
- 11 a A player may play for only one club in any WCL Cup Competition in any one season. If a player has played in any other League they may play in a Westmorland League Cup competition providing they have been transferred under rule 10 or they meet the qualification rules under 11b or meet the specific rules of an individual Cup. (Midweek Leagues are exempt)
 - b Teams must field players that are recognised players in that particular team.
 A player may play in a 2nd/3rd/4th team cup competition, provided that
 - i A minimum of 50% of his League games (Westmorland League) have been in that team during the current season.
 - ii The player's last three consecutive league games have been in that team
 - iii For cup matches, Clubs may apply to the League Management Committee not later than 72 hours prior to the start of the match if they feel that GENUINE 2nd/3rd/4th XI players should be selected to play who do not meet the criteria under i or ii. The application should be made by email to the Chairman of the Eligibility Committee and the decision will be made by the Eligibility Committee. or
 - iv In the event of a Club having more than one 1st/2nd/3rd or 4th team cup match in the WCL on the same day at the same time, players will be eligible to play in any team but must follow the procedure specified in the note to Rule 10 (f)

NOTE: In ANY dispute the burden of proof will rest with the club and due to the relaxation of these rules any abuse will be dealt with severely.

(Note to 11 b - if a Club selects a player for the 2nd/3rd/4th team at their selection meeting who, if the senior team match is called off, would then appear not to be eligible for the 2nd/3rd/4th team, they should inform the Chairman of the Eligibility Sub-Committee, Rob Hunt, in writing by email or text at the earliest opportunity, and no later than 72 hours prior to the game: likewise any queries regarding eligibility should be put in writing to the Chairman no later than 72 hours prior to the game. The decision of the Eligibility Sub Committee shall be final)

c Any team playing an ineligible player in a cup match will be disqualified from the next round of that competition if a knock out competition and receive the penalty specified in the individual cup in the case of round robin matches. If any team plays an ineligible player in a cup final, that team will be disqualified from taking part in the equivalent competition in the following season. A Management Sub-Committee will have the discretion to impose penalties over and above these disqualifications as it thinks appropriate.

For the purpose of the whole of rule 11, "played" shall be defined as a match in which any play takes place.

SECTION V

Rules governing the conduct of play in games played under League Auspices

The following rules shall apply to all games under League auspices:

- 12 a All games shall be played under MCC Code of Laws, with certain reservations hereinafter written
 - b Boundaries shall be clearly defined.
 - c Dress for all matches shall be whites, or in cup matches a team may wear coloured kit. No player may bowl who is not wearing white trousers and a white shirt or sweater, or where a team has chosen to play in coloured kit, his team's recognised kit
 - d A regulation quartered ball shall be provided by the fielding side. The balls and substitute quartered balls of good quality will be handed to the umpires for approval before the start of the match. ALL clubs in Divisions 1 & 2 are to use a ball purchased through the League.
 - e If due to ground condition or weather, the home club is of the opinion that their ground is unfit for play, they shall be afforded the opportunity of contacting the visiting club, in an effort to agree to a cancellation or postponement of the fixture but no earlier than 11.30a.m (11am as from and including August Bank Holiday Saturday) on the day of play. However when no such agreement can be reached, either club can ask a panel umpire (not directly associated with either club) to inspect and make a decision for a fee of £10. The latest time for such an inspection is 2 hours before the scheduled start of play. If an umpire cannot be found, the visiting club shall travel and the normal rules appertaining to inspection and fitness of grounds shall apply, If the visiting club exercises their right to travel and no play takes place, the visiting club shall be responsible for payment of 100% of the umpires fees, (Division 1), plus 50% of teas in all divisions
 - f Covers must be used at any point in the match when the umpires request them.
 - g Any club failing to fulfil a fixture for any reason other than on account of weather shall:
 - i be fined £25.
 - ii forfeit 15 points to the opposing club (league matches only) or the tie in respect of knock out matches. Subject to appeal to the management committee, who shall have the authority to require the game to be replayed or for the points to be shared in exceptional circumstances.
 - iii be deducted 15 points in League games only.

- iv Any away team unable to fulfil a fixture for any reason other than on account of weather; shall inform the home team and Results Secretary by 11.30am (11am as from and including August Bank Holiday Saturday). Failure to do so will result in a fine of £30 imposed and collected by the League and forwarded to the home team to compensate for costs incurred.
- v In the event that any club with two teams in the League find themselves in a situation where they are able to provide only sufficient players for one/two teams, then such team/s must fulfil the fixture for the Club's senior team/teams and that team/s must contain 11 players. If a senior team play without 11 players, the club must demonstrate that unforeseen circumstances intervened on the day otherwise a Management Sub Committee will apply the following to the team that is deemed to have gained an advantage
 - i be fined £10.
 - ii forfeit all points available from the match to the opposing club
 - iii be deducted 15 points in League games only.

In all matches a minimum number of seven players is required to constitute a team; failure to do so will invoke rule 12 G (i), (ii) & (iii).

The following rules shall apply to games in the League Championship competition:

NOTE: WHERE 2 SETS OF FIGURES ARE SHOWN, THE LOWER FIGURE/S WILL APPLY TO DIVISION 4

13 a All League games in Divisions 1, 2 and 3 shall be played on Saturdays. The exceptions shall be Bank Holidays, (only when the Fixtures Secretary deems it necessary) and for 3rd or 4th teams, where a club has only one ground and therefore these teams need to play their home games on a Sunday.

On Saturdays games shall commence at 1.00pm, with a thirty minute interval between innings for tea. Clubs are able to request in writing to the League Secretary by 28 February that all their fixtures or one or more specific fixtures start at 1.30 or 2pm. All requests will be granted. Where a club opts to start their games at 2pm the exceptions shall be from and including August Bank Holiday Saturday when games shall commence at 1.30p.m.

After 28 February, if mutually agreed between clubs and umpires, a start may be made up to one hour earlier or later than the scheduled start time if mutually agreed between clubs and umpires at least 24 hours before play would normally have started.

On Sundays games shall commence at 1.00pm, with a thirty minute interval between innings for tea. Clubs are able to request in writing to the League Secretary by 28 February that all their fixtures or one or more specific fixtures start at 1.30 or 2pm. All requests will be granted. A start may be made up to two hours earlier than the scheduled start time if mutually agreed between clubs and umpires at least 24 hours before play would normally have started. Clubs are required to provide cricket club teas for all players, umpires and scorers. This will normally be taken between innings, unless agreed otherwise by captains and

umpires.

- b In order to effect prompt starts, the toss shall take place NOT LESS THAN 15 minutes before the agreed start of play and all practice shall cease ten minutes before the agreed start of play. Any team arriving late shall forfeit the right to practise.
- c If commencement of any game is delayed for more than the 15 minutes after the appointed time then the offending team shall forfeit the right to toss for choice of innings. (Note: if both teams are ready to play within 15 minutes of the appointed start time, both shall retain the right to toss for choice of innings)
- d The duration of a game shall be 90 overs of six balls. The side batting first shall not occupy the wicket for more than 45 overs. The duration of a game in the bottom 2 divisions shall be 80 overs of six balls. The side batting first shall not occupy the wicket for more than 40 overs.
 - In all divisions no player may bowl more than 25% of the overs scheduled to be bowled at the start of the innings (the figure to be rounded UP to the nearest full over). However, if there are any overs still to be bowled when 45(40) overs have been completed, the side bowling second may use any bowler who has previously completed his maximum allowance without further limit.
- e Should the side batting first declare their innings or be dismissed in under 45 overs (40 overs in the bottom 2 divisions) the balance of completed overs otherwise available to them shall be added to the 45 (40) overs available to the side batting second except that:

Matches delayed at the start

If the umpires determine that play cannot start on time because of ground, weather or light issues then two overs will be lost for every full seven minutes that the game has been delayed from the start time and the side battling first shall not occupy the wicket for more than half the reduced overs available when play commences. The shortest game which can be played is a 46 (40) over game, which, if an early tea has been taken, must start by 3 hours (2h 46m) after the appointed start time.

i.e. In a game where play was due to start at 1pm, in Divisions 1 and 2, the latest time that a game can start is 4pm (if tea has been taken) and in Divisions 3 and 4 (if tea has been taken) 3.46pm. NOTE: there is NO 15 minute waiting time at the start of a match and overs will be lost from when play was due to commence.

Matches interrupted after the start

If the game is interrupted by rain or bad light after the start of play, there is no reduction in overs until 15 minutes of playing time has been lost. Thereafter, the maximum number of overs available shall be reduced at the rate of two for every full seven minutes time lost. Note – that means overs are reduced after 22 minutes time is lost.

Time lost is cumulative – after the first 15 minutes has been discounted, the total time lost is divided by 7 to determine the numbers of overs lost

Umpires are responsible for keeping a record of time lost. They must inform captains of the revised number of overs before the resumption of play after any interruption.

If matches are delayed for any other reason, e.g. player injury, then that time is made up and the overs are not reduced.

NOTE: If a match is interrupted by weather AFTER the start, the total number of overs played may be less than 46.(40)

- f A game shall be completed as a fixture when each side has completed a single innings or a definite result has been reached.
 Further play will not be included in League records.
- g In all matches, it is solely for the umpires together to decide in accordance with MCC Law 2.7 whether either conditions of ground, weather or light or exceptional circumstances mean that it would be dangerous or unreasonable for play to take place. Conditions shall not be regarded as either dangerous or unreasonable merely because they are not ideal. The fact that the grass and ball are wet does not warrant the ground conditions being regarded as dangerous or unreasonable.
- h i In Divisions 1 & 2 the batting side will be awarded 5 penalty runs for each over that is not started by the bowling side in 2 hours 45 minutes. This will include one drinks break. If overs are added to the second innings, the time allowed shall be increased by 3½ minutes per over. If overs are reduced due to weather in either innings, the time allowed shall be reduced by 3½ minutes per over. Umpires MUST keep each other and the captains informed of their progress at 1 and 2 hours, and inform of any alterations to times and shall make allowances for any unforeseen circumstances, and also warn and subsequently award penalty runs against the batting side if they are deemed to be wasting time as per MCC laws

ii At the call of time for the 1st innings both teams will be informed of the start of time of the 2nd innings by the umpires. If either team are not ready to commence play at this time the umpires will impose penalties as appropriate under Law 41.

i In Divisions 1 and 2, two semi-circles shall be drawn on the field of play. The semi-circles shall have as their centre the middle stump at either end of the pitch. The radius of each of the semicircles shall be 30 yards. The semi-circles shall be linked by two parallel straight lines drawn on the field. The fielding restriction areas should be marked by continuous painted white lines or 'dots' at 5 yard intervals, each 'dot' to be covered by a white plastic or rubber (but not metal) disc measuring 7 inches (18 cm) in diameter. At the instant of delivery no more than five fielders shall be permitted outside this fielding restriction area. If this rule is broken, then either umpire should immediately call no ball. This should be treated the same as other no balls as set out in Law 21.

14a Method of scoring-

The points awarded for League Championship matches shall be:

(Note - Figures in brackets are for matches in Divisions 3 and 4.)
15 points for a win by a side batting first or second;
6 points in a drawn game to the side batting first PLUS an additional 1 point to the side batting first pLUS and triung first in a drawn game where the side batting second fails to achieve

50% of the first innings score.

1 point in a drawn game to the side batting second who attain 50% of the first innings score

5 points to each side in the event of a tie plus bonus points gained where the scores are equal and the side batting second has been bowled out.

5 points to each side when a game is declared void. In a match declared void after it has started, then any batting or bowling points will be retained

Batting bonus points for the side batting first:

1 point for scoring 135 (120) runs; 2 points for scoring 158 (140) runs; 3 points for scoring 180 (160) runs.

In a reduced over game batting bonus points for the side batting first shall be calculated as follows: 1 point for reaching the scoring rate of 3 runs per over* 2 points for reaching the scoring rate of 3.5 runs per over* 3 points for reaching the scoring rate of 4 runs per over*

(*These calculations must not be rounded up. The scoring rate shall be calculated by dividing the number of runs scored by the actual number of overs bowled or part thereof)

Batting bonus points for the side batting second:

1 point for scoring 70% of the target score 2 points for scoring 80% of the target score 3 points for scoring 90% of the target score

Bowling Bonus Points for the side bowling first:

Bowling bonus points shall be calculated on the number of wickets taken: 1 point for 5 wickets 2 points for 7 wickets 3 points for 9 wickets.

Bowling Bonus Points for the side bowling second

Bowling bonus points shall be calculated on the number of wickets taken: 1 point for 5 wickets 2 points for 7 wickets 3 points for 9 wickets.

In a reduced over game the number of wickets required for bonus points shall be calculated as follows: number of overs of the reduced game divided by 45 (40) then multiplied by 5, 7 or 9 For example: If the reduced number of overs is 36 the bonus points are: $36/45 \times 5 = 4$ thus 4 wickets are required to obtain 1 bonus point $38/45 \times 7 = 5.91$ thus 6 wickets are required to obtain 2 bonus points $40/45 \times 9 = 8$ thus 8 wickets are required to obtain 3 bonus points.

Bonus points shall NOT be awarded to the winning side. They shall only be awarded in a drawn game including a weather void, a tied game or to the losing side. In all calculations, unless stated otherwise, any calculations resulting in decimal points follow the general convention of being rounded up from .5, and down from .4

14b Target Score Adjustment (Divisions 1 and 2 only)

Where after the start of the game rain affects play during either the 1st or 2nd - innings such that the number of overs to be received by the batting side is reduced then the Target score for the team batting second is adjusted using the Duckworth/Lewis/Stern module of the Play Cricket.com scorer app. The revised Target score calculated by Duckworth/Lewis (Standard) from information provided by the umpires is the number of runs the team batting second require

to win the game and merely replaces the first innings score + 1.

The Target score will also be used in the calculation of batting bonus points for the team batting second. It should be noted that Duckworth/Lewis/Stern will be used solely to calculate the revised Target in circumstances where rain has interrupted the game after it has started such that the number of overs to be received by either side is reduced from that expected at the start of their innings and does not impact the rules regarding draw or tie detailed in 14 (above). This irrelevant in deciding the outcome of the match. Where the team batting second is expected to receive more than their allotted overs at the start of the game due to either a declaration or a side being dismissed in the first innings, then the Duckworth/Lewis/Stern calculation will be based on the number of overs they were expected to receive at the start of the game.

If the team batting second does not receive 20 overs, the match shall be declared void and each team shall be awarded 5 points, unless the new Target score is reached before the 20 overs have been bowled or the team batting second has been bowled out. The revised Target should be agreed after each interruption by the Umpires, Captains and Scorers. Even if the team batting is second has exceeded the 20 over target, they shall only be declared the winner if play is able to resume, even if it is to enable a single ball to be bowled. The umpires are the sole adjudicators of whether it is fit to resume after a break.

Where the umpires determine that it fit to resume but there is insufficient time for 20 overs to be bowled either side shall have the option of resuming play to try to force a result in less than 20 overs. Where the team batting second chooses to play to chase a revised target set under DLS, if they fail to reach the target then the result is a winning draw for the team who has batted first i.e. the team batting second receives 1 point for a losing draw (if they have reached 50% of the DLS target) plus any bonus points. Where the bowling team chooses to resume and fails to bowl out the other team in less than 20 overs, then the game remains a rain draw.

The following rules shall apply to games played in all Cup competitions:

- 15 a The Management Committee shall be responsible for all arrangements regarding Cup competitions including the setting of fixed dates and play by dates.
 - b Rules specific to each Cup shall be published in the handbook.
 - c Any disagreements between clubs as to the date on which a Cup match will be played must be referred to the Fixtures Secretary.
 - d Unless specified in an individual cup rule, any match not completed on the original date for any reason shall be re-arranged and replayed on the first available date, which MUST be prior to the date of the next round. If agreement cannot be reached the fixture must be referred to the Fixtures Secretary immediately.
 - e In all cup competitions, the umpires will apply a strict interpretation to the law relating to wides; in particular, any ball that passes both the batsman and the wickets on the leg side shall be called wide as per the generic ECB rules published for recreational t20 competitions – a link will be available on the WCL website.To assist the consistent interpretation of wides an additional line, a "Wide Guideline"

shall be marked in-between the bowling crease and popping crease and shall be parallel to the return crease. The outside edge of the wide guideline shall be marked 43.18cm (17 inches) from the inside edge of the return crease.

- f Any club in the League unable to fulfil a fixture for its more senior team WCL cup competition shall automatically forfeit all other cup competitions and be fined f25.
- 16 a Final ties shall be played on the dates decided by the Management Committee on a neutral ground.
 - b Competing clubs shall be responsible for their own travelling expenses.
 - c The League will pay for the teas of all participating players, umpires, scorers and invited guests of the League at any final.
 - d The League will pay both umpires for all finals.

The following rules shall apply to games played in the Junior League:

17 A player should be under the age of 19 (16) (13) (11) (9) at midnight on 31 August of the previous year.

Girls who are under 11 on 31st August of the previous year can play in under 9 cricket. Girls who are under 13 on 31st August of the previous year can play in under 11 cricket. Girls who are under 14 on 31st August of the previous year can play in under 16 cricket. Girls who are under 17 on 31st August of the previous year can play in under 16 cricket. Girls who are under 19 on 31st August of the previous year can play in under 19 cricket.

Any player who has played Northern League Division 1 in the current season may only play in the Junior League Championship Final and/or the Junior Knock-Out Cup Final, if they have played in at least 50% of their team's Junior League games in which play has taken place during the current season.

- 18 a League matches will start at 6.30pm on the day stated in the annual fixture list or 6.00pm for all games played in April.
 - b The League and Knock-out finals shall be played on a neutral ground. In the event that a neutral ground cannot be secured and mutual agreement is not reached by the competing clubs, then such competing clubs shall toss a coin to decide upon whose ground the final shall be played.
 - c Each team MUST provide an umpire (not a junior) and a scorer.
- 19 a Normal League and Cup matches will consist of 20 six ball overs per innings with a limitation of four overs per bowler.
 - The League and Cup finals may consist of 30 six ball overs per innings with a limitation of six overs per bowler.
 - b At U-19 level, a batsman shall retire when his score reaches or passes 35, and can not return to the crease when all other wickets have fallen. In 30 over League or Cup finals the score at retirement is 40, but batsmen may return to the crease, if necessary, when all other wickets have fallen, batsmen returning in order of retirement

- c At U-16 level, a batsman shall retire when his score reaches or passes 30, and can not return to the crease when all other wickets have fallen. In 30 over League or Cup finals the score at retirement is 35, but batsmen may return to the crease, if necessary, when all other wickets have fallen, batsmen returning in order of retirement.
- d At U-13 level, a batsman shall retire when his score reaches or passes 25, and can not return to the crease when all other wickets have fallen. In a 30 Over League or Cup finals the score at retirement is 30, but batsmen may return to the crease, if necessary, when all other wickets have fallen, batsmen returning in order of retirement.
- e In Under 13 games Wides and No-Balls will count as two runs, plus the batting side will be awarded any extra runs they score from the wide or no-ball, but the extra ball will not be awarded to the batting side, except in the last over of each innings.
- In Under 19, 16 and 13 junior matches, if the last pair is at the crease, no retirements will occur, The game will continue until either
 - (1) The last wicket has fallen.
 - (2) The allocated overs have been bowled,
- or (3) The side batting second have reached their target.
 - g IN ALL MATCHES, NO FIELDER, except the wicket-keeper, SHALL BE ALLOWED TO FIELD NEARER THAN 11 YARDS, measured from the middle stump at the batsman's end, except behind the wicket on the off-side. Also IN ALL MATCHES HELMETS MUST BE WORN BY ALL BATTERS AND ALSO BY THE WICKET-KEEPER when standing up to the wicket.
 - h The lengths of pitches must be 15 yards for U-9 with a 30m boundary, 17 yards for U-11"Soft Ball" with a 35m boundary, 17 yards for Under -11 "Hard Ball" with a 40m boundary, 19 yards for U-13 with a 50m boundary, and 22 yards for U-16 and U-19, and the surfaces must be prepared to a satisfactory standard with safety in mind. The smaller hard ball of 4 % ounces must be used in all U-13s and U-11 Hard Ball Leaque and Cup matches.
 - In U-11s Soft Ball, the junior size "Incrediball" must be used.
 In U-9s the "Kwik-Cricket" ball or the "All-Stars" ball must be used.
 - i In Under 9s teams will be of 6 players.
 - In Under 11s teams will be of 8 players.
 - In Under 13s teams will be of 11 players.
 - In Under 13s, Under 16s and Under 19s teams will be of 8 players, however Clubs may contact their Opponents, with ample notice to mutually agree to play 9, 10 or 11 aside.
- 20 If the weather delays the start of a match the umpires may reduce the length of each innings, by agreement prior to the start of the match, but no match for League points shall consist of less than 12 overs per innings. In a game less than 20 overs per innings the limitation on the number of overs per bowler shall remain the same as in matches of full length. If a match is curtailed for any reason it shall be regarded as "abandoned" even if the team batting second have

completed more than 12 overs.

- 21 a Points shall be awarded as follows:
 - i Four points for a win.
 - ii Two points for a tie.
 - iii Two points for a match which is abandoned or un-played due to rain
 - b In the event of scores being equal in a league match after 20 overs (or after the agreed number of overs) the result will be a tie irrespective of the number of wickets that have fallen.
 - c. In the event of scores being equal in a Cup match, the team with the fewer wickets down will be declared the winner. If scores and wicket are equal the match will be replayed (venue reversed).
 - d. In under 19 (16) (13) (11) (9) league cricket. All matches are to be played in the allocated week (beginning on Mondays) with venue reversal to be allowed where problems exist, e.g., due to rain or ground availability. It is the home team's responsibility to arrange Under 19, 16, 13, 11 and 9 fixtures. All Clubs are to arrange their home fixtures and provide the Junior Secretary with a complete list of these dates, no later than 14th April. Failure to do so will result in a £25,00 fine. The game can only then be altered by mutual agreement. In the event of the game not being played during the allocated week, the result must be sent to the Junior Results Secretary as a drawn match.
 - e. If two or more clubs tie on points at the top of the league table in one section at the end of the season the winners will be decide in the following order.
 - (a) Head to Head record.
 - (b)If more than two teams are tied and the head to head record does not provide an outright winner, the team with the most wins will be top. If the number of wins are equal between two or more teams the team with the least losses will be declared the winner. Should these all be equal the two teams with the best records following the above criteria will play off.
 - (c) If two teams are tied and the head to head match was rain affected or tied, and the records are identical. A play-off will take place in the form of a replay of the original league fixture.
 - f. The league championship will be decided by playing a Final match between the winners of the northern and southern sections.
 - g. Under 19, 16, 13 and 11's Junior Results should be posted by the home club onto westmorlandcricketleague.play-cricket.com no later than Tuesday noon following the play by week.

If no result is received within the allotted time, (as per senior rules) a £10 fine will be issued and the Results Secretary will award 0 points to the HOME TEAM and the MAXIMUM POINTS to the AWAY TEAM and publish the fact. Any objections to

the decision must reach the Result Secretary within 14 days (as in senior rules), or the points recorded will stand.

- 22 a Players may not represent more than one junior team in the competition in any one season. Clubs must not use players between A and B teams without prior agreement from the Junior League Secretary. Failure to comply will result in any points gained in such matches being deducted and awarded to the opponents.
 - b When junior players are also representing adult teams they must play for the junior and adult team of the same club. The only exceptions to this rule will be in the following cases

Where a club do not have junior teams, but which do have playing members under 19 years of age. In such a case, the young player can take part in Junior cricket elsewhere and play for the senior team of his own club. Under 19's may, therefore join another team in the League for the purpose of playing junior cricket. When a Junior Club does not have a senior team in the Westmorland League, Junior members of that club can not play for another Westmorland Club's senior teams, unless granted permission by the Management Committee. Under 19's may then, therefore join another team in the League for the purpose of playing senior cricket.

- c Any junior player representing his club at U-19 level may play for another club at U-16 (13) level if his club does not have an U-16 (13) side or visa- versa.
- d Players are not eligible to represent junior teams in the League if they also play for a different club with a junior team in another league, unless they have been granted permission by the Management Committee.
- When a junior player is transferred under senior rule 10, he must also then only play his junior cricket for the club he has transferred to, providing that club have a junior section.

RULES FOR THE U-11 "SOFT-BALL" and "HARD-BALL" COMPETITION

- i. Teams will be of 8 players. 16 overs per innings.
- The 1st 8 overs will be bowled from one end, and the 2nd 8 overs from the opposite end. The field will rotate around after each pair has batted. Each player will bowl 2 overs.
- ii. Each team will be credited with a score of 200 at the start of the innings. Runs will be added to the score as in other forms of cricket, and 5 runs will be deducted at each fall of a wicket.
- iii. Wides and No-Balls will count as two runs, plus the batting side will be awarded any extra runs they score from the wide or no-ball, but the extra ball will not be awarded to the batting side, except in the last over of each innings.
- iv. Batsmen will appear in pairs and will remain together for a full 4 overs. Batsmen will change ends, upon the fall of a wicket, at the end of an over and if one Batsman faces 3 consecutive "dot balls".
- v. The length of the pitch must be 17 yards with 35 meter boundaries for "Soft-Ball"

- and 40 meter boundaries for "Hard-Ball". It is recommended that stumps of junior size are used (height of each stump is 27 inches, width of 3 stumps when set is 8 inches). This prevents a ball of junior size from passing between the stumps.
- vi. The "Incrediball" of junior size must be used in all "Soft Ball" matches, and the 4 ¾ ounce ball in all "Hard-Ball" matches. In Soft-Ball games, this removes the need for leg protection for batsmen, but they should wear gloves and a box, and the wicket-keeper should wear gloves.
- ix Where Clubs have Under 11 "Hard" and "Soft" Ball teams, Clubs may move players between the "Hard Ball" and "Soft Ball" teams, to find the correct standard of cricket for their Under 11 players. The League expect discretion on selecting which players are moving from Hard Ball to Soft Ball, It is the Clubs responsibility to make sure that all players are of the ability to play at the right level.

RULES FOR THE INFORMAL "Under 9" LEAGUE

- I. Teams will be of 6 players.
- Batsmen will appear in pairs and will remain together for a full four overs. Batsmen will change ends, upon a dismissal, at the end of each over or if they have faced 3 consecutive "dot balls".
- 3. The length of the pitch must be 15 yards, with 30 meter Boundaries.
- 4. The "Kwik-Cricket" ball or the "All Stars" ball must be used in all matches.
- All 6 players will bowl 2 overs each and All 12 overs of the innings will be bowled from the same end. The field will be rotated around after each pair has batted.
- Each team will be credited with a score of 200 at the start of the innings. Runs will be added to the score as in other forms of cricket, and 5 runs will be deducted at each fall of a wicket.
- There will be no "No-Balls" but "Wides" will count as two runs, plus the batting side will be awarded any extra runs they score from the wide, No extra ball will be awarded to the batting side, except in the last over of each innings.
- 8. No results sheets are required and No League Tables will be published.

SECTION VI Umpires and Scorers

- 23 a All league appointed umpires must meet the following criteria:
 - i They must be approved by the Management Committee
 - ii They must have a good working knowledge of the laws of cricket
 - iii They must accept that at any time they can be assessed by an umpire's assessor also appointed by the league.
 - iv They should be able to move around the field of play so as not to compromise the safety of themselves, the other umpire or any of the players. Any concerns at any time by anyone should be immediately referred directly to SLACO.
 - v No umpire who has been suspended from any other league may umpire in

- the Westmorland League until such suspension has expired
- vi No umpire who had been expelled from any other league for misconduct may umpire in the Westmorland League.
- vii All League appointed umpires must be DBS checked and approved
- viii All umpires appointed by the league for any match (League & Cup) will be marked by both team captains. This mark will be confidential but may be used for training and will be used to allocate umpires for semi finals and finals. Failure to mark an umpire within 7 days in the first instance, will result in a formal warning by email. On the second occasion, a final warning by email advising that on the next occasion a 1 point deduction will be applied. On the third, and each subsequent, failure, a further 1 point deduction will be applied.
- b In Division 1 League matches both umpires will be appointed by the Umpires Secretary. Each club shall be responsible for payment of the fee to cover expenses of £50 to one umpire before the toss and this should be made at the same time as handing the teams cards and match balls to the umpires.
 In Division 2, clubs are invited to submit requests to the Umpires Secretary for appointments to be made for all or some of their fixtures. These appointments
- will be filled on a "first come" basis and on the understanding that in the event of a shortage for Division 1, an umpire may be withdrawn from a Division 2 match. Each Division 2 club provided with an umpire by the Umpires Secretary shall be responsible for its own payment to the said umpire.

 c In Division 2, for 2024 clubs are required to arrange for a club umpire to
- c in Division 2, for 2024 clubs are required to arrange for a club umpire to stand in their home games. Where panel umpires are available, the Umpires Appointments Secretary will appoint a second umpire, invited to submit requests to the Umpires Secretary for appointments to be made for all or some of their fixtures. These appointments will be filled on a "first come" basis and on the understanding that in the event of a shortage for Division 1, an umpire may be withdrawn from a Division 2 match. On a first occasion where a home team fails to have a club umpire (and has not been able to arrange for a panel umpire to cover) the team shall receive a first and final warning that subsequent breaches will lead to a 2 point deduction on each occasion. In Division 2 League matches the umpires for the away teams will be appointed by the Umpires' Secretary. The away club shall be responsible for payment of the umpire before the toss and this should be made at the same time as handing the teams cards and match balls to the umpires. If there are two panel umpires then each team is responsible for payment of one of the umpires' expenses.

Except under rule 12(e) (Away Club exercising the right to travel).

- d (i) For WCL divisional games where an umpire is requested/required to stand at both ends the fee paid should be an additional 50%.
 - (ii) If the game is abandoned within 90 minutes of the scheduled start time, 50% of the umpire expenses fee is payable.
 - (iii) If the game is abandoned after 90 minutes from the scheduled start time the

full fee is payable

- (iv) In each of ii & iii above, 150% of the umpire expenses fee is payable if the umpire was scheduled to stand or standing at both ends.
- e Each club, other than those in Divisions 1 & 2, shall provide its own umpires for League matches, one for each team. If only one umpire is available he shall have the right to officiate at both ends if he so wishes.
- f Where required each club shall provide an umpire, up to the semi-final stage, in each Cup competition. Where possible an umpire listed in the Handbook or other qualified umpire must be used
- g The Management Committee/Umpires' Secretary shall appoint neutral umpires for all semi-finals and finals. If an umpire is used for any other match who is not listed in the Handbook it will be the Club's responsibility to make sure that that umpire meets the current "Safe Hands-Welfare of Young People in Cricket" regulations including being DBS checked and approved
- h Umpires appointed by the Management Committee/Umpires Secretary shall be paid a fee of £50. Fees for the subsequent season shall be decided at the AGM and each competing club shall be responsible for payment of one umpire's fee.
- I Each competing club shall provide their own individual off field scorer for League and Cup matches. Should any club be unable to provide a designated scorer, whilst batting, that team must ensure that at all times during its innings a player fulfils the role of scorer. Failure to do so in League matches will result in a penalty of 2 points on the first occasion and five points on any subsequent occasion during the same season. A team shall not be allowed to commence a cup final without providing a designated (non player) scorer.
 - The home team is responsible for making sure that at least one scorer is using a scorebook as opposed to electronic scoring. If the away scorer is using a book it is fine for the home team to use Play Cricket only. Scorers should ideally sit together; if they choose not to then they should confer regularly to ensure that they agree as to the score. This is particularly the case if one team has a player scorer and the other a designated scorer.
 - Deduction of points restricted to Divs 1 & 2 where umpires can report. Or any division if a league official is in attendance, Different players can be used throughout the innings.
- J All panel umpires officiating in all games, must adhere to the "Dress code" recommended in "Tom Smiths New Cricket Umpiring and Scoring".

SECTION VII Miscellaneous

24 Match Results

Scores for ALL League Matches, including those cancelled by weather, shall be posted by the home Club on Play-cricket not later than midnight following the match and the full result (including all catches etc. and fully correct) by 8pm on the Monday for matches played on the Saturday or Sunday or, (where the match is played on the Monday) the Tuesday following the game. Away clubs should

notify the home side of the names of all players and catchers, and ideally should verify the final scorecard before it is finalised. Home clubs should also record the names of umpires and scorers on the scorecard.

Failure to comply with this rule shall result in the offending team being given a 1 point deduction if the scores are not posted by midnight and a further 1 point deduction if the full result is not posted by 8pm as above.

If the correct FULL Result details are not LOADED within 7 days of issue of the notification of deduction of points, this will trigger a further 2 point deduction and a £25 fine. The LMC will govern on a case by case basis

All points not claimed within 14 days of the match will be forfeited

Results for cups will be detailed in specific cup rules

All on the day player registrations must be submitted by email to the Results Secretary by their club within 24 hours from the end of the match

Junior League matches -

All Under 19's, 16's, 13's and 11's results should be posted by the HOME club onto westmorlandcricketleague.play-cricket.com no later than Tuesday noon following the play by week.

If a result is not posted within the allotted time, a £10 fine will be issued and the Results Secretary will award 0 points to the HOME team, and the MAXIMUM points to the AWAY team and publish the fact. Any objections to the decision must reach the Result Secretary within 14 days, or the points recorded will stand.

25 Fines

All fines shall be paid to the Hon.Treasurer. Failure to pay a fine within 28 days of request shall result in ten points being deducted from the points total of such offending team/club

Any club which fails to pay an outstanding account or fine by the AGM shall in addition have ten points deducted from each team at the start of the following season.

26 Trophies

All trophies belonging to the League must be returned to the Hon. Secretary on or before 15th August in each year. Cup trophies to be returned before 1st July.

27 Leading Averages

Statistics will be drawn from Play Cricket Qualification: As decided by the Management Committee at the end of each season taking into account the number of matches played and the number of overs allowed to be bowled.

28 Ground Availability

Any club whose ground is unavailable for cricket because of unavoidable ground sharing on any specific date or dates during the season must inform the Fixtures Secretary in writing stating the reason BEFORE the AGM prior to each season. If the ground is unavailable for reasons other than ground sharing then a request may be made BEFORE the AGM prior to each season but will only be granted if it does not adversely affect fixtures. No free dates will be granted to any club.

29 Alteration to Rules

- a The rules of the League may at any time be amended, repealed or replaced by resolution at a general meeting of the League: provided that any such resolution receives majority of at least two thirds of the votes cast.
 - Any alteration to a rule which has the effect of requiring consequential alterations to other rules will be considered to automatically have that effect
 - Propositions from clubs whose membership and other dues have been fully paid, must reach the League Secretary not later than 30th September in any year, or the Junior League Secretary no later than 31st December for Junior AGM
- b All new rules shall be experimental for 12 months and ratified at the next AGM

30 Life Membership

The Management Committee shall be able to issue at their discretion life membership of the League, where it is felt that the honour should be bestowed.

31 Dissolution of the League

A resolution to dissolve the League can only be passed at a general meeting of the League.

In the event of dissolution:

- i The general meeting shall appoint five trustees: each shall be from a different member Club and shall be from at least two different generations. In the event of death of a trustee, the remaining trustees shall have the power to appoint further trustees: such trustees must be members of a Club who was a member of the League at time of dissolution, and be from a different Club to those represented by existing trustees.
- ii These trustees shall then have the power to manage any remaining assets of the League under the following guidelines:
- A Any material assets (trophies etc.) shall be held in safe keeping and may not be sold. The whereabouts of such assets should be recorded with the governing body of cricket in England.
- B Any financial assets will be returned to the governing body of cricket in England. These assets may then be used for development of cricket in the geographical area covered by the League. If the League is re-formed any assets still held by the governing body shall be returned to the League.
- iii The trustees shall have the power to re-form the League under the current constitution providing that the re-formed League consists of a minimum of one third the same clubs in the league at time of dissolution.
 - Disciplinary Procedures a copy will be emailed to captains and club secretaries before the start of the season. They are available on the websites or on request from the Leaque Secretary

Pool Player - System for 2024

Aims and Objectives

The Ultimate aim of the Pool Player process is to reduce the number of games forfeited and to encourage participation of more players.

The process is in place to enable clubs struggling to fulfil fixtures to have access to approved players from other clubs who potentially aren't playing that weekend.

It also allows players who aren't getting regular cricket at their parent club to help other clubs in need of players.

Summary of changes

Following a mid season and a further end of season review, the following are the proposed rules for the 2024.

The main changes are,

- In line with the ECB, junior cricketers are classed as under 18's (previously under 16's)
- New players can be registered onto the pool list up to 72 hours prior to game being played.
- Categorisation of players has been removed and some simple rules to be followed
- The number of games played for the same club has been increased to 4.

Rules and process starting from 2024 season.

- 1. For a player to be placed onto the pool list.
 - a. They must be registered with their parent club or the WCL.
 - b. The Individual requests they are placed on the pool, and provides all details incl DOB/Contact
 - c. Players can be registered no later than 72 Hours prior to playing (midday Wednesday).
 - d. Only clubs with a Safeguarding Officer, who has completed and is up to date with the mandatory training required by the role, are permitted to use pool players aged under 18.
- The club intending to use a pool player.
 - a. Can only use players on the official approved pool list
 - b. Must request permission from the league in line with Eligibility rules.
 - c. Must register the player prior to the game (in the normal way, with prefix PP before the name).

3. Players who play on the pool

- a. In line with the dual registration process. A player can only play for one club per weekend. (ie can't play for parent club and another, Saturday then Sunday) The parent club should take precedent.
- b. Pool Players can only play for the same club on 4 occasions in any season.
- c. Players can not pool for a club in their own division, with the exception of Division 4.
- d. If a player is under the age of 18 then rule 3a, b and c do not apply, unless they are playing in Division 1 or higher. (if playing in Division 1 then refer to section 4)

- 4. Restrictions placed on players
 - a. If a pool player is playing below their normal level (based on last 3 league games/50% of current season) restrictions as determined by the Eligibilty Committee will be placed.
 - b. If a pool player is playing above their normal level no restrictions will be placed.
 - c. For players classed as Juniors these restrictions will not apply. Unless the last three league games played were in Division 1 or higher, then restrictions as per (a) will be placed.

Failure to follow any element of this process shall deem the player ineligible and the club will be faced with possible loss of points or fines as determined by the league exec.

As with Transfers and Dual Registrations, Pool Player process closes on Aug 1st, after that date no new requests will be accepted.

All of the above should help clubs struggling with player availability to fulfil fixtures. It should also help to maintain the integrity of our league and each division.

Disciplinary Procedures – a copy will be emailed to captains and club secretaries before the start of the season. They are available on the websites or on request from the League Secretary

CUP COMPETITIONS 2024

Introduction

- Existing league rules apply regarding eligibility of players to play in competitions. (see rules 15 and 16).
- The Divisional Cup competitions will all be played as round robins in 2024, with the exception of Division 4 which is a straight knockout.
- 3. In the round robins, the top two teams qualify for the quarter-finals. Group winners will qualify for a home quarter-final. In group games, teams earn two points for a win. In tied games, a super over will be played to determine the result, unless the umpires determine that because of light that it is not safe. In the event of no super over then both teams will earn 1 point. Where two or three teams have the same points after the two group games, then net run rate will be the sole determinant of final placings. In the event of net run rate being the same then the teams involved will play off in an additional fixture.
- Divisional Cup semi-finals and the final will be played on a single day. A
 reserve day has been set in the event of the weather not allowing a result to
 be determined.
- 5. Clubs have been given six days during which the game must be played. The home team must offer their visitors two dates during the six days. The same will apply for the quarter-finals. If a match is rained off, then the two teams should find an alternative date at least seven days before the dates scheduled for the quarter-finals. If this is not possible then the home team should contact the Fixtures Secretary as soon as possible.
- 6. In Division 1 and 2 cup competitions the Umpire Appointments secretary will appoint two umpires for each game. In Divisions 3 and 4, he will appoint one umpire with the home club responsible for arranging the other. In these occasions the away team is responsible for paying the panel umpire a £25 match fee. In all other games, each side is responsible for paying one umpire. In the semi-finals and finals, the League will pay for umpires.
- In all cup games, red balls will be used. The batting side provides the ball for the other team to bowl with. At the loss umpires should ensure the balls are of similar quality.
- Scores for all cup matches, including those cancelled by weather, shall be posted by the winning team on Play Cricket not later than midnight on the day of the match and the full and accurate scorecard within 48 hours of the match. The result should also be texted to 07855 719402 and 07879 458324 within one hour of the game finishing.
- Winning clubs must send a representative to the annual dinner to be formally presented with the Trophy.
- Fixtures for all cup matches are on Play Cricket.

Playing Conditions for Cup Matches

Playing Conditions - 20 overs per side

The Laws of Cricket (2022) shall apply with the following exceptions:

1 Duration

1 innings per side, each limited to a maximum of 20 overs.

2 Hours of Play

- 2.1 Start times, close of play and additional time are to be agreed by teams or directed by the competition organiser.
- 2.2 All sides are expected to be in position to bowl the first ball of the last of their 20 overs within 1 hours 15 minutes playing time.
- 2.3 Interval should be no longer than 15 minutes.
- 2.4 In the event of an interruption or delay during the 1st innings, the calculation of the number of overs to be bowled shall be based upon one over for every 3 minutes 45 seconds in the total time available for play up to the scheduled close of play. In the 2nd innings of the match, overs shall be reduced at a rate of one over for every full 3 minutes 45 seconds lost, unless the 1st innings has finished early or the 2nd innings started early, in which case no overs are lost until the time that has been qained is subsequently lost.

3 Rearrangement of overs due to inclement weather

The objective of rearranging overs is to give the greatest opportunity for a match of equal overs.

4 Over rate penalties

- 4.1 All sides are expected to be in position to bowl the first ball of the last of their 20 overs within 1 hour 15 minutes playing time. In the event of them failing to do so, the full quota of overs will be completed, one fewer fielder shall be permitted outside the fielding restriction area in 5.1, 5.2 & 5.3 than would normally be the case in the over(s) in progress at the time. All penalties in this regard will be imposed immediately the ball first becomes dead after the scheduled or re-scheduled cessation time for the innings.
- 4.2 The Umpire shall inform the fielding team Captain when taking the field for the first time and on every subsequent occasion if play is interrupted by the weather, the scheduled cessation time for that innings. The Umpire at the bowler's end will inform the fielding Captain, the batsman and his fellow Umpire of any time allowances as and when they arise. (This matter will not be subject to retrospective negotiation). In addition, in all reduced overs matches, the fielding team will be given one overs leeway. For the avoidance of doubt, one over's leeway means that the fielding side must be in position to bowl the first ball of the penultimate over by the scheduled or rescheduled cut off time

- 4.3 If the innings is terminated before the scheduled or re-scheduled cut-off time, no over rate penalty shall apply, if the innings is interrupted, the over-rate penalty will apply based on the re-scheduled cessation time for that innings. Over-rate penalties apply only to innings of 10 overs or more duration unless a penalty has been applied before 10 overs have been bowled. In innings of less than 10 overs duration, Umpires shall apply the penalty run Laws for time wasting especially strictly.
- 4.4 Umpires are instructed to apply a strict interpretation of time wasting by the batsman (5 run penalities) specifically; batters are expected to be ready for the start of a new over as soon as the bowler is ready.

5 Fielding restrictions

At the instant of delivery, there may not be more than 5 fielders on the leg side

- 5.1 For the first 6 overs of each innings only two fielders are permitted to be outside the fielding circle at the instant of delivery.
- 5.2 For the remaining overs of each innings only five* fielders are permitted to be outside the fielding circle at the instant of delivery.
- 5.3 In circumstances when the number of overs of the batting team is reduced, the number of Fielding Restriction Overs shall be reduced in accordance with the table below. For the sake of clarity, it should be noted that the table shall apply to both the 1st and 2nd innings of the match.

Total Overs	No. of overs fielding restrictions apply
5-6	1
7-9	2
10-13	3
14-16	4
17-19	5

6 Overs per bowler

6.1 No bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the amount of overs scheduled for the innings. However, in a delayed start, or interrupted match, where the overs are reduced for both sides, or for the side bowling second, no bowler may bowl more than one-fifth of the total overs allowed (unless such a number has been exceeded before the interruption), except that where the total overs are not divisible by five, an additional over shall be allowed to the minimum number of bowlers necessary to make up the balance -e.g. after 8 overs, rain interrupts play and the innings is reduced to 12 overs. Both opening bowlers have bowled 4 overs. Two bowlers can bowl 3 overs and three bowlers can bowl 2 overs. Bowlers 1 and 2 have already exceeded this limit.

- They count as the two bowlers who were allowed the extra over (4 as opposed to 3) and so any other bowlers are limited to 2 overs.
- 6.2 For innings of rescheduled length of between 5 and 9 overs, no bowler may bowl more than two overs. In these circumstances, the one-fifth limit does not apply.
- 6.3 When an interruption occurs mid-over and on resumption the bowler has exceeded the new maximum allocation, they will be allowed to finish the incomplete over.
- 6.4 In the event of a bowler breaking down and being unable to complete an over, another bowler will bowl the remaining balls. Such part of an over will count as a full over only in so far as each bowler's limit is concerned.
- 6.5 The allocation of overs per bowler will not be reduced as a result of the deduction of any penalty overs.

7 The Result

- 7.1 Where there is no interruption after play has commenced and when both sides have completed their innings, the side with the highest actual score or recalculated Duckworth Lewis Stern score shall be delcared the winner. In the event of a tie a super over shall be played, subject to 8.2 below.
- 7.2 For all matches if, due to the suspension of play after the start of the match, the number of overs in the innings of either team has to be revised to a lesser number than that originally allocated (minimum 5 overs), then a revised target score should be set for the number of overs which the team batting second will have the opportunity of facing, this revised method being calculated by the Duckworth/Lewis method (version of DL shall be The Ducksworth/Lewis Stern Tool on the Play Cricket Scorer App). A par score will be set for the second innings. If this is exceeded a win for the team batting second shall result. If the par score is equalled then the scores are tied.
- 7.3 For all matches, if a match is abandoned before it had been played to a conclusion and before the team batting second has received its allocated number of overs (providing that it has received not less than 5 overs), the result shall be decided by the Duckworth/Lewis method.
- 7.4 In the event of the scores being tied in a match when the Duckworth/Lewis method has been used, no account shall be taken of wickets lost and a Super Over shall be used to find a winner.

8 Super Over

- 8.1 The teams shall compete in a Super Over to determine the winner. The following procedure will apply should the provision for a Super Over be adopted in any match.
- 8.2 Subject to weather conditions the Super Over will take place at a time to be determined by the umpires. In normal circumstances it shall commence 10 minutes after the conclusion of the match.
- 8.3 The Super Over will take place on the pitch allocated for the match (the designated pitch) unless otherwise determined by the umpires in consultation with the ground authority.
- 8.4 The umpires shall stand at the same end as that in which they finished the match.

- 8.5 In both innings of the Super Over, the fielding side shall choose from which end to bowl.
- 8.6 Only nominated players in the main match may participate in the Super Over. Should any player (including the batters and bowler) be unable to continue to participate in the Super Over due to injury, illness or other wholly acceptable reason, the relevant Laws and Playing Conditions as they apply in the main match shall also apply in the Super Over.
- 8.7 Any penalty time being served in the main match shall be carried forward to the Super Over.
- 8.8 Each team's over is played with the same fielding restrictions as apply for a non-Field Restriction Over in a normal match.
- 8.9 The team batting second in the match will bat first in the Super Over.
- 8.10 The Umpires shall select a ball from the box of spare balls which shall be used for both overs of the Super Over. The ball to be used shall not be a new ball.
- 8.11 The loss of two wickets in the over ends the team's one over innings.
- 8.12 In the event of the teams having the same score after the Super Over has been completed, the team whose batters hit the most number of boundaries in the Super Over shall be the winner.
- 8.13 If still equal, a count-back from the final ball of the Super Over. The team with the higher scoring delivery shall be the winner. If a team loses two wickets during its over, then any unbowled deliveries will be counted as dot balls. Note that for this purpose, the runs scored from a delivery is defined as the total team runs scored since the completion of the previous legitimate ball, i.e including any runs resulting from wides, no ball or penalty runs.

Example:

Runs scored from	Team 1	Team 2
Ball 6	1	1
Ball 5	4	4
Ball 4	2	1
Ball 3	6	2
Ball 2	0	1
Ball 2	2	6

In this example both teams scored an equal number of runs from the 6th and 5th ball of their innings. However team 1 scored 2 runs from its 4th ball while team 2 scored a single so team 1 is the winner.

8.14 If still equal, then another Super Over shall be played.

9 Wide Ball - Judging a Wide

Umpires are instructed to apply a very strict and consistent interpretation in

regard to this Law in order to prevent negative bowling wide of the wicket. Any offside or legside delivery which in the opinion of the umpire does not give the batsman a reasonable opportunity to score shall be called a wide. For guidance purposes, in adult cricket a legside wide shall be called if, irrespective of where the ball pitches, it passes outside the line of the batsman and the leg stump, despite his movement.

10 No Ball

- 10.1 Law 41.6 (Bowling of dangerous and unfair short pitched deliveries) shall apply with the following additions:
- 10.1.1 Regardless of how wide of the striker a delivery is, there shall be no more than one delivery per over that after pitching pass or would have passed clearly over shoulder height of the striker standing upright at the popping crease.
- 10.1.2 The umpire shall make it clear to the bowler (and any bowler called upon to complete an over) and the batsmen at the wicket when a delivery within the limit in 10.1.1 has been bowled. It is unfair if the limit is exceeded and the umpire shall call and signal No ball on each such occasion and consider it as part of the warning sequence in Laws 41.6.3 and 41.6.4.
- 10.1.3 A different signal shall be used to signify a fast short pitched "No Ball". The Umpire shall call and signal "No Ball" then raise the other arm across the chest. If the bowler exceeds his limit of short pitched deliveries in an over not only must the Umpire call "No Ball" but he must invoke the procedures of Law 41.6.3 in regard to cautioning the bowler. If a bowler is "No Balled" a second time in the innings for the same offence the Umpire is to invoke Law 41.6.4 and the bowler shall be removed forthwith and shall not be allowed to bowl again in that innings.

Note: For the avoidance of doubt the warnings detailed in Laws 41.6.1, 41.6.2 and those above in 10.1.1 and 10.1.2 are cumulative.

10.2 Law 41.7 (Bowling of dangerous and unfair non-pitching deliveries) shall apply.

10.3 Free Hit after a No Ball

- 10.3.1 The delivery following a no ball shall be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it.
- **Note:** this applies to all modes of No ball with the exception of a short-pitched delivery that passes or would have passed clearly over head-height of the striker standing upright at the popping crease.
 - 10.3.2 If the delivery for the free hit is not a legitimate delivery (any kind of no ball or a wide ball), then the next delivery shall become a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it.
 - 10.3.3 For any free hit, the striker can be dismissed only under the circumstances that apply for a no ball, even if the delivery for the free hit is called wide ball.
 - 10.3.4 Field changes are not permitted for free hit deliveries unless there is a change of striker or the No Ball was the result of a field restriction breach in which case the field may be changed to the extent of correcting the breach. However, in all circumstances, any fielder within 15 yards of the striker may retreat to a position on the same line no more than 15 yards from the striker.
 - 10.3.5 The umpires shall signal a free hit by (after the normal no ball signal) extending one arm straight upwards and moving it in a circular motion.
