SW Premier League News

New Season - Continual Competitiveness

The SWPL starts on Saturday 9th August 2025 - with some huge local derby games!

PREMIER DIVISION

This season we see an increased number of teams in the Premier Division. With Cardiff Airport and Caerphilly Athletic moving to the Ardal West and East respectively we have 3 teams joining the league. Treharris Athletic Western FC, Pontyclun FC and Bridgend Street FC in what is a hugely competitive division!

Penydarren BGC, Llantwit Fardre will be looking to step up, double cup winners Port Talbot Town will also be looking to bring their end of season form into this season, as will Porthcawl Town Athletic and Pencoed Athletic BGC. Aber Valley, Ely Rangers and FC Cwmaman will be looking to up the pace and all to be joined by promoted Afan United and Clwb Cymric! With the additional teams and with so many of the Premier Division teams doing so well in the respective cups last season we are taking the necessity of playing 2 sets of midweek games in August to kick-start the league games.

CHAMPIONSHIP

The Championship sees 6 new teams in total. Both Tonyrefail BGC and the Ton Pentre Bulldogs will be looking for a swift return to the Premier Division as will their Rhondda rivals AFC Wattstown and FAW Trophy finalists Penygraig United both having an eye on promotion. The 2 Vale of Glamorgan teams Vale United (who are always seem there or thereabouts) and Dinas Powys will be looking to improve. Bettws will be joined by promoted rivals Llangeinor alongside Cardiff teams Cardiff Cosmos and Cardiff Bay Warriors (who did the great escape last season!). Promoted AFC Penrhiwceiber and Tata Steel United will be looking for 2 successive promotions too!

DIVISION ONE WEST

Both Division 1s will be a unknown entity this season with 6 newly promoted teams and 4 relegated down from the Championship. In D1W Caerau All Whites will be looking to go one better and get into the promotion places. The 3 Vale of Glamorgan teams - Sully Sports, Cogan Coronation and Holton Road - all had inconsistent spells throughout last season so will be hoping for more consistency. Grange Albion had a vastly improved season whilst Margam YC had a steady first season and will be aware of the standard to improve. The 3 newly promoted teams Brynna, Cardiff Hibernian and FC Porthcawl are all unknown quantities at this level. Treforest are the only relegated team in the division and will be looking for a quick return to the Championship.

DIVISION ONE EAST

D1E will be interesting with 3 relegated teams Aberdare Town, Cwmbach Royal Stars and Llanrumney United. The former 2 have new coaches whilst Llanrumney will be back on their home ground with a new pitch and facilities. Splott just missed out last season finishing 3rd will be expected as there or thereabouts as will the 3 teams who finished directly below them - Cwm Welfare (who had a strong finish), Cwrt Rawlin and Nelson Cavaliers. Fairwater and Tongwnlais make up the remaining Cardiff contingent along with St Josephs who won't want to be in the final game "must win" situation again! Treorchy BGC, like Llanrumney, will be back on their own ground after a season at Pentre 3G.

This leaves the 3 promoted teams. Pentyrch Rangers, although winners of the Cardiff & Dist League, will be playing at Cambrian United's 3G. Heolgerrig Red Lion Community and Porth Harlequins although both new teams in the SWPL are playing in former SWPL grounds - ICI Rife Field and Dinas Park (Merthyr Saints & AFC Porth)

Treharris Athletic Western FC

Home Ground:
Parc Taf Bargoed (Treharris)

Treharris have a long history with the original club being formed in 1889 as not only one of the earliest association football clubs based in South Wales but also, in 1890, founding members of the South Wales League - a predecessor of the Welsh Football League. Treharris were one of the foremost association football sides in South Wales in the two decades before the First World War, winning the inaugural South Wales League title in 1891, adding further triumphs in 1905 and 1906. They were also winners of the South Wales Senior Cup in 1904, 1906, 1907 and 1911. Treharris Athletic incorporated Western Hotel FC into the club and were renamed Treharris Athletic Western FC



Bridgend Street AFC

Home Ground: Willows Avenue (Cardiff)

Another club with a long history Bridgend Street have been established since 1899. Bridgend Street won multiple trophies under the management of Laurence "Lollar" Marshall and Edward Crawley throughout the 1970s and 1980s before joining the newly formed South Wales Senior League in 1993 where they went on to be record five-time winners of the title until their promotion to The Welsh Football League in 2010.



Pontyclun FC

Home Ground: Ivor Park (Pontyclun)

Pontyclun Football Club was founded in 1896. In its early years, the club played in the Bridgend League and the Cardiff & District League before - in 1922 - Pontyclun were admitted to the Football Association of Wales, one of the few amateur clubs at the time to achieve such status. Within a few years, the FAW adopted Pontyclun's motto 'Gorau chwarae, cyd chwarae' (roughly translated as 'the best players play together') as its own. In 1968, the club was admitted to the Welsh Football League (then the premier league in Wales).



Porth Harlequins BGC

Home Ground:
Dinas Park (Tonypandy)



Porth Harlequins join the SWPL from having won the RCT League undefeated over their 24 games. Quins were automatically promoted to the SWPL as the 3rd ranked team.

They play at Dinas Park the ground they formerly shared with SWAL's AFC Porth.



FC Porthcawl

Home Ground: Rest Bay Sports Ground, Porthcawl



FC Porthcawl qualified after winning the Port Talbot & District League, losing only 2 games in the process.

They entered the SWFA Play-Offs were they overcame AFC Abercynon 2-0



Heolgerrig Red Lion Community FC

Home Ground: ICI Rifle Ground



Heolgerrig Red Lion were automatically promoted as the 2nd ranked team in the SWFA promotion group.

Red Lions won the Merthyr & District League losing just 1 game all season and will play at ICI Rifle Field - the home of former SWPL club Merthyr Saints.



Cardiff Hibernian FC

Home Ground: Cardiff West Community HS 3G (Cardiff)



Former SWAL team Cardiff Hibs return to Tier 6 as the highest ranked team form the local leagues after winning the Cardiff Combination League undefeated winning 15 of their 16 games.

They play at Cardiff West High School's 3G facility.



Pentyrch Rangers Seniors

Home Ground: M&P Group 3G (Tonypandy)



Pentyrch Rangers won the Cardiff & District League win just the single league defeat.

However they qualified through the play-off game Vs st Athan where they came out 4-2 winners.

This season Rangers will be playing - not in Cardiff but at the M&P Group 3G in Tonypandy - the home of Cambrian United.



Brynna FC

Home Ground: Brynna Welfare Ground



Having won the Bridgend & District League
Brynna were the final team coming through the 3
SWFA Promotion Play-Off games - after their
opponents went through a protracted appeal
process - defeating Rhydyfelin 2-0.

FAW CLUB ACCREDITATION

The Club Accreditation program that will be implemented for the upcoming 2025/26 football season.

Due to an independent review of the program we have established that whilst the program drives standards in compliance it would not allow us to meet the objectives outlined within our Enhancing Lives Strategy

Enhancing-Lives-Through-Football-Grassroots-Strategy.pdf

In the next 12 months we will look to re-launch a new program that clubs can use as a development tool to become a sustainable club of the future. With the above in mind we will be introducing a new slimline approach to the auditing process for the 2025/26 session.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF THE NEW AUDITING APPROACH:

- All clubs will need to meet the minimum compliance requirements as mapped out below. Failure to meet these would result in no football for the club, until met.
- Clubs will retain their existing standard from the 2024/25 season. (Please note that clubs will not be able to achieve a higher standard throughout this window)
- Clubs will have from the 1st of June until the 30th of September to meet the requirements.
- Requirements will be audited internally at the FAW via the COMET system.

REQUIREMENTS TO PLAY FOOTBALL

Clubs must have clear evidence that they achieve the following:

- A club committee structure including as minimum a Secretary, Chairperson, Treasurer & Safeguarding Officer (who must hold valid FAW Safeguarding Award and FAW Enhanced Barred DBS Check). No more than 2 roles per person.
- All Coaches have a valid FAW Football Leaders Award or FAW Introduction to Coaching Football and a FAW Enhanced Barred DBS Check.
- All teams have an individual with a valid FAW Football Emergency Aid Award and a FAW Enhanced Barred DBS Check.
- All team helpers, first aiders and coaches must have an in-date FAW Enhanced Barred DBS Check.
- 1 coach per team as a minimum.
- Teams meet NSPCC supervision ratios.
- Agreement to work within FAW Safeguarding policies and procedures, FAW codes of conduct & FAW small-side regs & FAW junior rules.

If clubs meet the compliance standards stated above they remain in the same standard that they achieved for the 2 024/25 season.

HOW TO BECOME ACCREDITED

At affiliation, clubs will be asked to confirm a number of questions, and the Club Developer for the region will then review the details along with the existing data on our COMET and coach education system. We advise all clubs keep these systems up to date to ensure its reflective of the people within the club.

Regional club developer will host an online briefing session in June to walk clubs through the COMET system and the process we will follow for the 25/26 season. Clubs are encouraged to attend.

NATION CYMRU

CLWB CYMRIC LEAD THE WAY WITH THE WELSH LANGUAGE ON & OFF THE PITCH



A Cardiff football team, comprised entirely of Welsh language speakers, is continuing the success of its founders and proving the power of using Welsh in every aspect of daily life, over half a century since it was founded.

Clwb Cymric was established in September 1969, initially as a men's football team which competed in the Cardiff and District League Division 5.

The players who were all Welsh speakers and socialised in the New Ely pub (now called The Vulcan Lounge), Cathays, Cardiff, originally named the club as Clwb Pêl-droed Cymry Caerdydd, however the opposition soon referred to them as "The Cardiff Welsh".

In order to simplify matters and avoid a linguistic division, it was renamed as Clwb Cymric. Cymric is an adjective for Welsh in culture and language, something pivotal to all the team members, and that passion and ethos has remained firmly to the present day.

Green is the dominant colour of Clwb Cymric but the first game in the club's history was played in a red kit. Due to a lack of funding it was probably all they could muster at the time. However, for this first game, the opposition also played in red, which forced the Cymric players to play their first ever competitive game shirtless.

For members of Clwb Cymric, the need and desire to compete and socialise through the medium of Welsh in Cardiff was essential, and this passion has burned since day one.

Fast forward to 2025, with the team continuing to thrive, those original and pioneering players would scarcely believe how the club has developed.

From an original group of some 15 male players, Clwb Cymric now has over 850 registered players. Clwb Cymric has not only grown and widened its horizons numerically, it has also developed to be a truly competitive club with football teams now represented in the Cardiff and District League, South Wales Alliance Premier Division, netball in Division 2 of The Cardiff and District League, and hockey in the South Wales Hockey League Division 2 and won the Welsh Hockey Indoor Competition recently.



The football First team reached the Third Round of the Welsh Cup in 2025 losing 0-3 to Llanelli AFC who have since been promoted to the Welsh Premier. To have over 400 members of the public in attendance and the S4C TV cameras there was a further indication of the club's development.

LAW CHANGES for the coming season were - as usual - part of the agenda.

MIKE HARRIS gave a detailed and honest discussion on his experiences as a referee which included serious injuries, assaults and the subsequent trauma and stigma suffered during his refereeing career.

ROGER WEBB from the FAW SAFEGUARDING team gave an update on Safeguarding changes coming into force this season and how this will effect referees. He also outlined referees responsibilities regarding Safeguarding



SIMON HOOPER – Premier League Referee



The main speaker was Premier League Referee Simon Hooper from Swindon

Simon's presentation included how he started refereeing, his journey to date, support and the preparation & background of a Premier League referee.

His also outlined how being a Premier League effects his private life and family

LAW CHANGES 2025 - 2026

Outline summary of *Main* **Law changes**

Law 3 – The Players

 Competitions have the option of implementing the 'Only the captain' guidelines

Explanation

Competitions are encouraged to use the 'Only the captain' guidelines to improve on-field behaviour and to enhance cooperation

Law 5 – The Referee

• Signal to be used by referees to count down the last five seconds of the eight-second restriction on goalkeepers controlling the ball with their hand(s)/arm(s) - See Law 12 change



Explanation

Countdown for the last five seconds of the eight-second restriction on goalkeepers controlling the ball with their hand(s) / arm(s)

Law 8 – The Start and Restart of Play – Dropped ball

- If, when play was stopped, the ball was:
- inside the penalty area the ball is dropped for the defending team goalkeeper in their penalty area
- outside the penalty area the ball is dropped for a player of the team that has or would have gained possession if this is clear to the referee; otherwise,
- it is dropped for a player of the team that last touched it. The ball is dropped at its position when play was stopped

Explanation

There are times when the ball would clearly have gone to an opponent of the team that last touched the ball. In such instances, it is fairer for the ball to be dropped for the team that would have gained possession, as long as this is clear to the referee. Outside the penalty area, the ball will now be dropped at its position when play was stopped.

Law 9 – The Ball in and out of Play

 Indirect free kick and no disciplinary sanction when a team official, substitute, substituted or sent-off player or player who is temporarily off the field of play touches the ball as it is leaving the field of play and there is no intention to interfere unfairly

Explanation

There are times when a coach, substitute or player who is temporarily off the field of play (among others) touches the ball as it is going out of play with the intention of helping the game restart quickly. In such cases, an indirect free kick will be awarded but there will be no disciplinary sanction, unless such a sanction is to be issued for persistently leaving the technical area.

Law 11 - Offside

• When the goalkeeper throws the ball, the last point of contact should be used for the purpose of determining an offside position

Explanation

The first point of contact with the ball is used when determining whether a player is in an offside position. However, when the ball is thrown by the goalkeeper, the last point of contact should be used, as this provides a clearer and more consistent reference point.

Law 12 - Fouls and Misconduct

 A goalkeeper who controls the ball with their hand(s) / arm(s) for more than eight seconds will be penalised, with a corner kick being awarded to the other team

Explanation

- If a goalkeeper has control of the ball with their hand(s) / arm(s) for more than eight seconds, the referee will now award a corner kick (rather than an indirect free kick) on the side of the field closest to the goalkeeper's position when penalised. There is no disciplinary action unless the goalkeeper repeatedly commits the offence.
- To assist the goalkeeper, the referee will signal the final five seconds using a raised hand.
