

SW REFEREE STEPS UP AFTER MATCH REFEREE IS INJURED AT BLUEBIRDS GAME

WEDNESDAY 1ST JANUARY

When SWPL Referee Dale Randall went to see Cardiff City play Coventry in the Championship, little did he know he would end up officiating the game.

The 32-year-old part-time referee was watching in the stands when a plea went out for a fourth official after the referee left the pitch because of injury.

Despite being more used to the second tier of domestic football, Dale stood up for the biggest game of his life. He was supposed to be refereeing Goytre United and Llantwit Major in the JD Cymru South league, but the match was cancelled because of a waterlogged pitch.

It was, Mr Randall said, "a bit nuts - It was surreal, 19,000 supporters watching you I've never officiated in front of that sort of crowd."

James Durkin, had started the game as fourth official but had to replace injured ref Geoff Eltringham in the first half. Dale, from Tonyrefail, in Rhondda Cynon Taf, then took over Mr Eltringham's original role at the start of the second half.



Dale had a crash course in using the subs board before he was handed an earpiece and set to work.

He said: "Geoff Eltringham was limping around. One of the Cardiff City coaching staff told me to put the board up for added time because he couldn't walk. At half-time they're giving me the communication kit and a quick tutorial on what they want from me. It was nuts really. I don't think I knew the referee's name until I heard it through my earpiece."

Dale added that he had a Football Association of Wales jacket on so had to change into something else.

It was not all smooth sailing. "I probably got the substitutes board wrong once - the ins and the outs were the wrong way round."

The reaction has been "mad". "I've had 400 texts from the refereeing fraternity, friends and family saying 'well done'," he said.

He added that getting to see behind the curtain of a high level match was a "unique experience.... I'm back to normal next week officiating at Tredegar Town. A slightly different world"

After the game, which ended with a 1-1 score, neither manager spoke with Mr Randall but he was invited to the referee's room for a debrief before returning to his wife. "There was a debrief and then I had to go and find my wife who I had abandoned in the first half. "You didn't even say goodbye' - that's how she greeted me."

New FAW Initiative Captains Only Approach Wef 1st February 2025

As many will have seen from UEFA Euro 2024 this summer, UEFA adopted an approach which encouraged only team captains to approach the match referee to avoid mobbing/dissent.

The FAW Referees Committee agreed to adopt the UEFA EURO 24 Captains Only Approach for all FAW National League (Tiers 1-3 Men's & Tiers 1&2 Women's) & FAW Senior Cup competitions for season 2024/25.

THE FAW COMMUNITY GAME BOARD HAVE NOW AGREED THIS WILL BE EXTENDED TO ALL FOOTBALL WITHIN WALES FROM 1st FEBRUARY 2025.

The success of the new approach at UEFA EURO 2024, has been welcomed by public opinion as unquestionable progress for the image of football and boosts our confidence that this is the way forward. Fair play and respect are values that football, the most popular sport in the world, must convey to society at large.

GUIDELINES

- Normal interactions between players and the referee are allowed and remain important (to increase transparency and avoid possible frustration and conflict).
- Any player (including the captain) who shows dissent by word or action will be cautioned (yellow card).
- The referee will, where appropriate, explain important decisions to the captain(s) and/or the player(s) involved in an incident.

TO PREVENT PLAYERS MOBBING OR SURROUNDING THE REFEREE IN MAJOR SITUATIONS AND FOLLOWING KEY INCIDENTS OR DECISIONS:

- only one player from each team usually the captain is allowed to approach the referee and, when doing so, they must always interact in a respectful manner;
- the referee may instruct/encourage players (verbally or with gestures) not to approach them;
- the team captains are responsible for helping to direct their team-mates away from the referee;
- players who approach/surround the referee when they are not permitted to do so may be cautioned (yellow card) or sent to the sin bin (if the system is in operation)
- if appropriate, the referee may delay the restart of play to allow the captain(s) time to speak with their team-mates to explain a decision, demand proper behaviour, etc.
- Interaction with, or an approach by, any player other than the captain is at the discretion of the referee, e.g. if the player has committed an offence, been fouled, and/or is injured.

GUIDELINES WHEN THE CAPTAIN IS THE GOALKEEPER

- Where the goalkeeper is the captain, the referee must be told, no later than at the coin toss before kick-off, which player is nominated to approach the referee instead of the goalkeeper.
- Only the goalkeeper or the nominated player, not both, may approach the referee.
- If the nominated player is substituted or sent off, another player must be nominated.
