



NEW SCORING APP FROM ECB



I have spent some time testing a new development from ECB, a scoring app that will be free to download and will integrate fully with play cricket!

It has been an interesting experience to be involved with this project from its inception and I am hopeful that the finished product will be available for download soon. I have also heard that version 9 of Total Cricket Scorer should be available by mid-March, but as yet this remains unconfirmed. Keep checking for further details.

UMPIRING & SCORING FOR BEGINNERS

An officially accredited 2 hour course run by fully qualified ECBACO tutors.

WHO is this course for?

It is aimed specifically at clubs who use parents of players to assist with umpiring and scoring in junior matches – although there is no restriction on who may attend.

WHAT format does the course take? It is an interactive and enjoyable session with a high quality presentation from experienced ECBACO tutors, who guide all delegates in practical understanding of the basics of umpiring and scoring.

WHEN is this course being run?

A club — or group of clubs — can book a course to be run for them, and arrange a suitable date (subject to availability). Cheshire ECBACO aims to run as many courses as possible to ensure that good numbers of parents have the opportunity to receive some basic training in these vital roles.



Want scoring practice?

If you are trying out a new scoring app, or TCS, and want some pre-season practice, don't forget about the amazing archive' on the CricInfo (www.espncricinfo.com). On the home page, click on 'stats', then 'match & series archive'. From there you can select any year you please, choose a series, and you will see the matches in that series displayed. Select 'scorecard', and then 'commentary', and after a bit of scrolling through you will find ball-by-ball text commentary which is ideal for practising with scoring methods, both electronic and paper. This archive is a fabulous resource for scorers – do use it!
