

Martin McLoone

Martin was a founder member of Foyle Film Festival. For over three decades, Martin McLoone was a frequent contributor to the film festival and also served on the board of Nerve Centre. We owe an enormous debt of gratitude to this warmhearted, generous and humble Derryman who had the vision to establish a film festival that has become an essential part of the vibrant cultural life of Derry.

Stephen Gargan

We also pay tribute to the contribution of Stephen Gargan to Derry's film community. Stephen shared Nerve Centre's vision of using film and digital technologies for community empowerment. In 1996 he was a key member of the Foyle Film Festival team and then formed Gaslight productions which produced the Channel 4 television drama, *Sunday*, which was nominated for an international Emmy and the Epilogues project to explore personal experiences of conflict. Stephen was a dynamic cultural activist who made a real difference to the life of the citizens of Derry.

James Flynn

James Flynn, a giant in the Irish Film & Television industry, passed away in February this year. He was a distinguished and dedicated producer, at the helm of over 80 productions most recently The Banshees of Inic.

James was a good friend of Foyle Film Festival, visiting every November for many years, chairing industry panels on feature film production, always with a focus on emerging Irish and UK talent. He will be missed and fondly remembered by everyone at the festival.

We would like to pay warm tribute to our esteemed colleague, Bernie McLaughlin, director and programmer of Foyle Film Festival, who retires this year after 25 years of hard work and dedication. 

From Ryūsuke Hamaguchi the Oscar® winning director of *Drive My Car, Evil Does Not Exist* follows Takumi and his daughter Hana who live in Mizubiki Village, close to Tokyo. Like generations before them, they live a modest life according to the cycles and order of nature. One day, the village inhabitants become aware of a plan to build a glamping site near Takumi's house offering city residents a comfortable "escape" to nature.

When two company representatives from Tokyo arrive in the village to hold a meeting, it becomes clear that the project will have a negative impact on the local water supply, causing unrest. The agency's mismatched intentions endanger both the ecological balance of the plateau and their way of life, with an aftermath that affects Takumi's life deeply.

Using archival performances, interviews with Bolan, Elton John and Ringo Starr, plus filmed musical interpretations by artists such as Nick Cave, John Cameron Mitchell, Joan Jett, Macy Gray, U2, Lucinda Williams, Father John Misty, and son Rolan Bolan among others.

Angelheaded Hipster does have plenty of actual T. Rex footage. Silverman moves speedily from Bolan's childhood to his hippie Tyrannosaurus Rex era, the seismic glam rock success in the U.K., and a subsequent dip in popularity... Bolan and his work are justifiably celebrated. He is given credit for repeatedly being ahead of the curve and unafraid to embrace new musical trends and movements.







A man (Pedro Pascal — The Mandalorian, The Last of Us) rides a horse across the desert that separates him from Bitter Creek. He comes to visit Sheriff Jake (Ethan Hawke — Before Sunset, Training Day). Twenty-five years earlier, both the sheriff and Silva, the rancher who rides out to meet him, worked together as hired gunmen. Directed by two time Oscar® winner Pedro Almodóvar (All About My Mother, Talk to Her), Strange Way of Life marks only his second English Language work after the 2020 short film The Human Voice.

Strange Way of Life is a queer take on a genre that has historically avoided explicitly centering gay love. There is ardor between Silva and Jake, heavy in each of their interactions, in their way of looking at each other and in their touch."

In an instant, nurse Manuela (Cecilia Roth—Labyrinth of Passion) loses the teenage son she raised on her own. Grief-stricken, she sets out to search for the boy's long-lost father in Barcelona, where she reawakens into a new maternal role, at the head of a surrogate family that includes a pregnant, HIV-positive nun (Penélope Cruz—Parallel Mothers); an illustrious star of the stage (Marisa Paredes—The Skin I Live In); and a transgender sex worker (Antonia San Juan—The Platform).

In a bid to connect with the world, she sends an unconventional message through a fortune cookie. Tinged with Jarmuschian deadpan humour, this sensitive immigrant tale packs a breakout performance by real-life refugee Anaita Wali Zada, joined by a perpetually off-kilter Gregg Turkington and Jeremy Allen White from *The Bear* as a heartthrob mechanic.

In an unlikely friendship, the landlord of an ailing local pub TJ Ballantyne (Dave Turner) meets a curious young Syrian Yara (Ebla Mari) with her camera. Can they find a way for the two communities to understand each other? So unfolds a deeply moving drama about their fragilities and hopes.

Stolen reveals how women who had the misfortune to fall pregnant 'out of wedlock' were treated in an Ireland that was heavily influenced by the Catholic Church. Over 80.000 unmarried mothers were incarcerated in mother and baby institutions run by nuns from 1922 to 1998. Most were cruelly separated from their babies after birth. 

WINGS OF DESIRE

This remastered version of Wim Wenders' heart-breaking Berlin masterpiece is a glorious love letter to a city and a time capsule of a bygone era. Its romantic storyline and heavenly vision of angels walking the earth bears the influence of Powell and Pressburger's masterpiece, A Matter of Life and Death.

Damiel (Bruno Ganz — Downfall, The American Friend) is one of a legion of angels who watches over the lives of residents in a divided city. In particular, he is enraptured by Solveig Dommartin's (No Fear, No Die, Until the End of the World) Marion, an acrobat in a circus. Although it is only children who can see the angels, Marion is faintly aware of Damiel's presence. As is Peter Falk's (Colombo, A Woman Under the Influence) actor, filming on location in the city, who has a past that links him with the otherworldly guardians.

Outside the central romance, the richness of Wenders' film lies in the snapshots of the lives of Berlin's populace — individuals who exist on the periphery of the narrative but who inform Damiel's desire to achieve a human state. Mirroring the shift between colour, and black and white first employed by Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger's 1946 drama A Matter of Life and Death. Wings of Desire matches that film's magical aura — not just in its subject matter, romantic storyline and heavenly vision of angels walking the earth but as a work of transcendent cinema.

MIRROR IMAGES: THE INFLUENCE OF POWELL + PRESSBURGER ON MARTIN SCORSESE

VIRTUAL LECTURE

Professor Ian Christie first came to Foyle Film Festival in November 1995 to deliver a lecture exploring the formative influence of the films of Powell and Pressburger on the cinematic imagination of Martin Scorsese. Almost three decades later, Ian Christie will present an online and updated version of the lecture in which he will examine the umbilical relationship between *The Red Shoes* and *Raging Bull*.

The link to this lecture will be displayed on the Foyle Film Festival website.

Here is a brief extract:

The Red Shoes, with its 14 minute ballet sequence, was the point in their career where Michael Powell and Emeric Pressburger made their boldest bid for a new kind of cinema. Martin Scorsese's reading of the film is interesting. He sees the Red Shoes as a filmic model — as an example of a film that breaks all the rules, goes for bust and pushes unbelievably far in the direction of creating an entirely subjective world. As Scorsese views it, what happens in the Red Shoes is that as soon as the ballet starts, you leave the auditorium, you leave the point of view of the audience, you are entirely within the imaginary subjective world of the dancers and the dance becomes allegorical of the dramatic situation of the characters. And for him therefore this is one of the great pieces of experimental filmmaking, understood as drama, not as a way of filming ballet.

General Candy (Roger Livesey — A Matter of Life and Death, The League of Gentlemen), who's overseeing an English squad in 1943, is a veteran leader who doesn't have the respect of the men he's training and is considered out-of-touch with what's needed to win the war. But it wasn't always this way. Flashing back to his early career in the Boer War and World War I, we see a dashing young officer whose life has been shaped by three different women (all played by Deborah Kerr — Black Narcissus, From Here to Eternity), and by a lasting friendship with a German soldier.

"I'm fascinated by the unusual choices of Powell and Pressburger, and by the storytelling. You could say that it's the epic of an ordinary life. And what you retain from this epic is an overpowering sense of warmth and love and friendship, of shared humor and tenderness, and a lasting impression of the most eloquent sadness."



Juanita directed her second feature film, *Tomato Red*, in 2017 which she adapted for the screen from the Daniel Woodrell novel (writer of *Winter's Bone*, a 2011 Academy Award® Best Picture Nominee) of the same name.



Somewhere Here is inspired by the true life experiences of a group of young Irish people as they grapple with various life events and challenges in their daily lives. Set over twenty-four hours, the film follows them as they face up to some hard truths and awkward realities. Honest, raw and at times darkly funny, the scenes are written and performed by an ensemble of upcoming Irish acting talent including Ella Lily Hyland (Fifteen-Love), Agnes O'Casey (The Miracle Club, Ridley Road, Lies we Tell), Adam Richardson (The Dry) among others The film was devised and directed by Juanita Wilson and features music by renowned Irish songwriter Vyvienne Long and DJ and composer Kormac.


