

## Meeting of the Central Committee Last Night.

The Democratic Central Committee held its regular weekly meeting last night in the Laclede parlors, J. B. S. Lemoine presiding, Thomas Murrin filling his place as Secretary, and nineteen members present. There seemed to be no particular business before the meeting, and for awhile no one appeared disposed to suggest anything.

'At length Daniel Sexton offered a resolution to the effect that members of the committee should hand in a list to the next meeting of such Judges and Clerks as they desired to have selected for the several primaries; that the names submitted should, after being announced, be laid over for two weeks, to give opportunity for protests from the different wards.

On motion, the resolution was referred to the

Committee on Privileges and Elections.

The Chairman here stated that the Subscripseventy-eight committee, numbering members, would meet to-night at the Laclede to perfect organizations and complete a plan for the collecting of funds with which to run the campaign, as it was deemed inadvisable to assess candidates until the subscription scheme had been tested.

The committee then adjourned to next Tues-

day night, same place.
