Twenty-First Ward Protest.

A good deal of worse than irregularity is still being developed as to the conduct of the Democratic primaries. Besides the several instances recorded already, the Twenty-first Ward now comes to the front with a claim of bulldozing by the Boland men to the detriment of John Finn. The respective adherents of Boland and Finn had different colored and shaped tickets—Boland's pink and Finn's white, and styled the "Regular Democratic ticket." There is a rule of the Central Committee, it appears, requiring candidates to pay a certain assessment before the primaries come off. The judges of election in the Twenty-first Ward, strong partisans of Boland, claimed that the Finn men were five minutes too late with their assessment, and in consequence they threw out and stamped upon all the Finn tickets. In this consists the alleged bulldozing. The result of it has been to create disgust with the Democratic management, and Maj. Daniel Sexton and Edward P. Kehoe, Democrats of the Twenty-first Ward, and Finn adherents, openly announce their determination to vote for the Republican nominee. Doubtless many others will do likewise.
