of the best of the thoroughfares, leads to it from the centre of the town, and the Chord Road begins immediately beyond the entrance. West Gate was situated, as the name implies, at the West side, in direct line with St. Laurence Gate, which faces toward the sea. West Street, the chief thoroughfare, begins near the site of the Gate, and for a short distance runs in such narrow limits as to barely permit ordinary vehicles to pass each other. From West Gate, Fair Gate was almost within musket shot. In the immediate vicinity of it the horse fair is held, and Fair Street begins like West Street, also in narrow limits. The Market House and premises are entered from Fair Street, and on market days it is the liveliest place in town. The distance from Fair Street to Sunday's Gate may be travelled on foot in a few minutes. Sunday's Gate was the Northern entrance, and stood in the narrow way, one side of which is wholly occupied by the residence of Mr. John Dolan, T.C. The name was derived from Sunday's Friary, which was near by. It was also known as Cow Gate, for in the immediate vicinity the cattle fairs are held, by virtue of a Charter, granted by William III., in confirmation of time immemorial custom. Near Sunday's Gate were two towers known respectively as Tooting and Boulter's. The gate itself was a square castellated structure. There was likewise St. Catherine's Gate. On the Meath side were Dublin, or St. James's Gate, named from the monastery outside it, Blind Gate, Duleek Gate, St. John's Gate, and Butter Gate. St. James's Gate stood in the vicinity of Ald. Mangan's house. Duleek Gate was within view of the house of Mrs. Moore. John's Gate was named from the priory of St. John of Jerusalem, which formerly stood in the grounds of The Grove, Mr. Frederic St. George Smith's residence. The gate stood in John Street, near Messrs. Finegan's Tannery. About forty feet of the old Butter Gate Tower remains. It is supposed that it was so named because of the fact that the friars took toll of butter there. The land around has been extensively quarried for limestone, utterly obliterating any evidence of a roadway to it which may have existed. The tolls of the gates, so far back as 1658, are on record in the minutes of the Corporation. A barrel of wheat, oats, rye, or barley was taxed one penny, cattle, living or dead, one half-penny each, horses worth £40 and upward, two-pence, hides one half-penny each, calves, goats, pigs, lambs, and kids, living or dead, one farthing each, each load of yarns one penny, each load of bark unground, two-pence, each hundred weight of butter two-pence, each pack of wool 16 stone, fourpence, "every salmon" one farthing.
