to the barracks, is well kept. The most modern and improved part of the town, however, is on the south of the bridge, ascending the hill, on the summit of which a crescent is formed. A newspaper is published here weekly, the "Roscommon Herald." The public buildings, exclusive of those for divine worship, comprise a handsome court house, military and constabulary barracks, and a union workhouse, built in 1841. On one side of the river are tasteful pleasure grounds, in the centre of which is a statue of William III. The Protestant church is a spacious and handsome erection with a square tower; it was built in 1818, when the Board of First Fruits granted a loan of £1,000. The other places of worship are a commodious Catholic church, one for Presbyterians and two for Methodists. The charitable institutions comprise a dispensary, a loan fund and free schools. The market, a well supplied one for provisions, is held on Saturday, and one for butter on Wednesday. Fairs: January 3rd, February 3rd, March 6th, April 3rd, May 9th and 30th, July 9th and 25th, August 16th, October 1st and November 25th. The acreage and population have been included with the township. The area of the township comprises 753 acres; the population in 1891 was 2,464; the area of the parish comprises 19,618 acres; the population in 1891 was 6,134.
