John McLoughlin (c1800-1901), a farmer of Ardmoneen, Leitrim, Ireland lived a very long life. He married twice and had at least 4 children. He probably had more children but baptismal records began in 1841. John was buried at the Kilmakerril Graveyard, Munakil townland, near Manorhamilton, Leitrim.




Image 1 - Family Tree for McLoughlin, O'Hara, and McSharry

In 1901, when John died he left 235£ to Denis Daly, school master. This would be over 30,777£ today.⁴ His death record listed his age at 99 and the 1901 census listed it at 101.⁵ Neither John McLoughlin nor his wife Mary could read and write, yet education must have been important to him to leave such a sum to a school master.

Denis Daly, school master, was the son of Maryanne McLoughlin and James Daly, school master.




Image 3 - Family tree for James Daly and Maryanne McLoughlin

Denis Daly (1851-1922), national school teacher, lived in the Mullaghmore townland, Killargue Roman Catholic Parish, Killagra civil Parish, County Leitrim, Ireland.⁷ The same year of John McLoughlin's death in 1901, Denis Daly lived with his two brothers, Hugh and James, and Mary Waters, his niece. They could all read and write. They lived together in a 3-roomed house made of brick, stone, or concrete with a roof of thatch or wood, 3 windows in front, and 8 out buildings.⁸ Next door lived the family of Philip and Mary Sheridan Waters. Philip was probably another uncle to Mary. Mary Waters (1879-1901) died fourteen days after the 1901 census was recorded.⁹ She was the granddaughter of James Daly (1810-1865)¹⁰ and Maryanne McLoughlin (c1830-1882).¹¹ Mary Waters was born in Derrylustia, Leitrim, the child of Patrick Waters and Mary Daly. Derrylustia is in the Inishmagrath civil parish, Killenummery Roman Catholic Parish, and Manorhamilton civil registration district. Mary's mother was originally from the Killargue Roman Catholic parish as listed on her 1876 marriage record.¹² The three Roman Catholic parishes of Manorhamilton, Killenummery, and Killargue are all in northern Leitrim.

Denis Daly and his father James Daly, taught at the Lugnaskeehan National School that was in the townland that borders Mullaghmore. The proof that James was a national school teacher was listed on his wife's death record, his daughter's marriage record, and even his death record.

School registers, even listed James' grandchildren, Patrick and Denis, 4 who attended this school. 5

To paint a picture of how James Daly lived, in 1857 he leased a house, office, and land from representatives of Margaret Phibb. This included 12 acres, and a building valued at 10 shillings in the townland Mullaghmore. This townland is in the Killagra Civil Parish and Killargue Roman Catholic Parish. At this time a building valued in the Griffith's Valuation of 25£ signified a mansion, 15 shillings a three room house with thatched roof, and 5 shillings a windowless hut so the Daly family probably lived in a 2 room house. So who was Maryanne McLoughin (c1830-1882)

Maryanne McLoughlin's connection to John McLaughlin (c1800-1901) can only be hypothesized.

Maryanne McLoughin married a school teacher, James Daly in 1847¹⁸ and had 8 children.¹⁹ She was from the Cloonclare Roman Catholic Parish [also known as the Manorhamilton Roman Catholic Parish]. So why did John McLoughlin (1800-1901) grant her son, Denis Daly, a school teacher, 235£? Maryanne could be his daughter but note that he baptized a daughter named Mary in 1845. Or maybe Maryanne could be his niece. Or maybe yet another connection. Maryanne moved from her parish to the neighboring Killargue Parish probably after her marriage in 1847. There are no known records to prove where in the Cloonclare Roman Catholic Parish that she lived. Making a hypothesis that she knew John McLoughlin, then she lived in the area of Ardmoneen. John, Thomas, and Francis McLoughlin lived in the area per the 1857 Griffith's Valuations. In 1857, John McLoughlin lived in Ardmoneen and Francis McLoughlin

and Thomas McLoughin lived in the neighboring townland, Laghty. It is possible that they were brothers.




Image 4 - Ordnance Survey Map of residences of Thomas, John, & Francis McLoughlin in 1857²⁰

Thomas's son, Francis McLoughlin (1826-1900)²¹ could read and write per his signature on his naturalization record²² and his 1870 census record.²³ Francis McLoughlin and his wife, Margaret (c1799-1889) had at least one son, James McLoughlin, who was present at her death in Laghty.²⁴ James McLoughlin (c1840-1912)²⁵ married Ann Gordon and they had no children per the 1911

census.²⁶ James granted 179£ to his wife and she granted 132£ to her brother, John Gordon, National School Teacher and Thady Clancy, farmer.

John Gordon was the second school principal at the Loughross National School. The school opened in 1839 on Maguire lands and the first principal was Francis Maguire. It operated for almost 100 years until it closed in 1935. ²⁸ In 1857, the Loughross National School was on Bernard Maguires land in Ardmoneen at the edge to the Tottenham Estated. ²⁹ Loughross is the adjacent townland.




Image 6 - Historic 6" Last Edition B&W Ardmoneen, Leitrim³⁰

So what happened to Mary McSharry McLoughlin (1821-1912)

Mary McSharry McLoughlin, lived out her years with her grandchildren.

Mary McSharry McLoughlin was the second wife of John McLoughlin. Though she was not mentioned in the will, she continued to live in her home, near her step-son Denis McLoughlin. She lived with her step granddaughter and grandson, James and Kate McLoughlin Cullen, and their children.³¹ James Cullen, was present at her death.³² Kate [Catherine], was the daughter of Mary McSharry McLoughlin's step son, Denis McLoughlin.³³

Her natural son, Reverend Patrick McLoughlin, Parish Priest of Glenade, predeceased her in 1909.³⁴ No gravestone was located, but that was not uncommon for this time period.

It can only be assumed from tradition and the few records that exist that Mary McLoughlin was cared for despite not inheriting the money from her husband's will.
