OR. 17P., the mines and minerals of the four Gneeves of Ballydehob (including the said two North Gneeves), situate as aforesaid, held in fee, the lands of Derryvallow, otherwise Derryvaballa, situate as aforesaid, held under lease dated the 1st of October, 1806, for three lives; the lands of Dunmanus with its sub-denominations, Faunmore, Maulassa, Stouke, and Toureen, situate as aforesaid, and held in fee; part of Driminidy North, otherwise Dreeeminidy, otherwise Dromedy, Moyny East, otherwise Meenies, otherwise Moynies, and part of Knockeenbue, Lower (part of) otherwise Knockownboy, otherwise Knockeenbue, situate in the barony of the east division of West Carberry, and county of Cork. All parties objecting to a sale of the said lands are hereby required to take notice of such order; and all parties having claims thereon may file such claims, duly verified, with the Clerk of the Records.

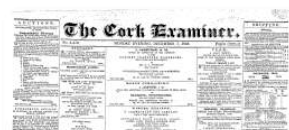
