The Court having ordered a Sale of part of the Lands of BALLYDEHOB with its sub-denominations of Sparagrady, Gurteenulla, and Derreenaclough, situate in the barony of the west division of West Carberry, and County of Cork, held in fee; part of said lands of Ballydchob, known as the two North Gneeves, situate as aforesaid, held under lease dated the 7th day of November, 1785, for term of thre. I'ves and thirty-one years, the whole of said parts contair og 380s. Oz. 17r., the mines and minerals of the four Caceves of Bullydehob (including the said two North Gner 36), situate as aforesaid, held in fee, the lands of Derryve allow, otherwise Derryvaballa, situate as aforesaid, held under lease dated the 1st of October, 1806, for three lives ; the lands of Dunmanus with its sub-denominations, Faunmore, Maulassa, Stouke, and Tourcen, situato as aforesaid, and held in fee; part of Driminidy North, otherwise Dreeminidy, otherwise Dromedy, Moyny East, otherwise Meenies, otherwise Moynies, and part of Knockeenbue, Lower (part of) otherwise Knockownboy, otherwise Knockeenbue, situate in the barony of the east division of West Carberry, and county of Cork. All parties objecting to a sale of the said lands are hereby required to take notice of such order; and all parties having claims thereon may file such claims, duly verified, with the Clerk of the Records.
