When Mary Ward was born on 8 March 1853 in Donegal, her father, James, was 35, and her mother, Eleanor, was 38. She married Thomas Carr and they had eight children together. She then married David Armstrong and they had one daughter together. She died on 5 March 1941 in Ridley Park, Pennsylvania, USA, at the age of 87, and was buried in Chester, Pennsylvania, USA.

When Mary Ward was born on 9 January 1875 in Donegal, Donegal, her father, Jeremiah, was 23, and her mother, Anna, was 30. She married Arthur Curran on 6 December 1902. They had one child during their marriage. She died on 13 April 1949 in Coatbridge, Lanarkshire, at the age of 74.
