
The family boarded the ship the "Star' departing Cork, Ireland May 1825 and arrived at Quebec about the June 19th 1825.

Most of the passengers proceeded from Quebec to Montreal aboard the steam boat Lady Sherbrooke, June 22nd, however the passenger list from that date does not show the Shouldice family.

Records show that they did settle at Victoria County, Emily Township C3 L22 in the fall of 1825

Note yet another way that Shouldice is spelled during this timeframe.

Note: Applicants to Peter Robinson offer could not be over 45 years of age. This ticket indicates Adam Shouldys was born 1781, not 1771 as shown elsewhere. Did he lie on his application?



Questions about George "Adam" Shouldys ancestors:

The genealogy shown in this chart was pulled from earlier researchers and sources from Ancestry.com

I have looked myself for true evidence that it is valid, however have been unable to tie Adam to any of the upstream with birth certificates or other proofs.

It has been suggested by early family researchers that the Shouldice family arrived in London during the 1709 Palentine move. However I was unable to find any Shouldice name on the London List or other lists from 1709.
