School Uniform is as follows:

School Uniform

School Policy

The school policy is to strongly encourage the wearing of the school uniform. The children look very smart and we hope that parents will feel able to support the uniform policy. The school colours are royal blue, white and grey.

Hair

We understand that children want to express their individuality. However extreme styles are to be discouraged and we appreciate parental co-operation in this. Pupils with long hair should have it tied back for health and safety reasons.

Shoes

Children may wear suitable, dark coloured shoes. Max. heel 2 cm, Trainers should not be worn in school. Pupils who walk across the muddy fields should bring a change of shoes.

P.E. & Swimming

P.E.

Children have bare feet for Hall activities as this is much safer when a child is on the PE apparatus as pumps and trainers do not give sufficient grip. For games children may wear trainers or pumps. No child can participate in games without pumps or trainers. They may not wear shoes.

Pump Bags

Children should have a pump bag in which to keep PE Kit. Large sports bags are not to be used as they take up too much hanging space in limited cloakroom facilities.

Goggles and Swimming Caps

Children are not allowed to wear goggles unless they have written parental consent.

All swimmers are required to wear a cap.

Jewellery

Jewellery will constitute a hazard in many school activities especially P.E. For safety reasons only stud earrings may be worn in school—no other jewellery is acceptable. This follows both National and Kirklees guidelines. We ask that children only have ears pierced at the start of the 6 weeks holiday as earrings have to be removed for P.E.

It is preferable that earrings are not worn on the days of swimming or P.E.
Swimmers are not allowed in the water wearing earrings.
