Review of Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2017-2018

Summary of PPG expected spending academic year 2017-2018

Objectives in spending PPG:

Our key objective in using the Pupil Premium Grant was to narrow the gap between pupil groups. As a school we aim to ensure that pupils make good progress, and in the last three years have been successful in bridging the gap in the levels of attainment between FSM and non-FSM pupils. The way we use our Pupil Premium Funding is based on the following principles:

Enrichment of the curriculum – we ensure that all children from disadvantaged backgrounds have equal access to our provision of workshops, visiting writers and visits out of school including working with children from other backgrounds and schools.

Targeted Support – is provided to help children identified who may be finding their learning tricky in the form of intervention strategies in a variety of subjects.

Encouraging parental involvement in child and family learning.

Focus on enrichment beyond the curriculum.

One to one ELSA support – emotional support for children	£700	Individuals needs are identified and addressed	One to one coaching in literacy skills and behaviour support. Helps to promote inclusion in school. No exclusions is aimed for.
Rapid Readers	£300	Resource for interventions with children needing support	Phonics. Children who received extra support here did really well as a result.
