The Purpose of the Policy:

- to agree a policy on school uniform

Aims and Objectives

Our school uniform policy is based on the notion that a school uniform promotes a sense of pride, looks smart, is practical and makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance. We are an inclusive school and we want children to feel happy and confident, irrespective of their gender, religion or beliefs.

Uniform Requirements

The Kingfield Primary School uniform is different for nursery, key stage one and key stage two.

Nursery

Uniform:

Jogging bottoms (royal blue / grey) or trousers, skirt,skort with easy fastenings /pinafore dress
White polo shirt
Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
White or grey socks/white or grey tights
Blue & white checked dress / grey shorts in the summer

Footwear:

Dark (Black or Navy Blue), sturdy, sensible shoes. *(Velcro fastenings are preferable for Nursery children)*
(No boots, trainers, open-toed sandals.)

Reception and Key Stage One

Uniform:

Grey skirt/skort/pinafore dress
Approved style of grey trouser*(or shorts in summer)
Plain white polo shirt.
Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo
White or grey socks/white or grey tights
Blue & white checked dress in the summer term

- *only straight legged plain trousers are permitted.*

Footwear:

Dark (Black or Navy Blue), sturdy, sensible shoes *(If your child has shoes with laces, please ensure that they can do them up. Velcro fastenings are preferable for Reception children.)*
(No boots, trainers, open-toed sandals.)

Key Stage Two

Grey skirt/skort/ pinafore dress on or below the knee.
Approved style of grey trouser*(or shorts in summer)
White cotton shirt with collar (long or short sleeved)
Royal blue V neck jumper/Royal blue cardigan with school logo
Tie
White or grey socks/ navy or grey tights
Blue & white checked dress in the summer term

- *only straight legged plain trousers are permitted.*

Footwear:

Dark (Black or Navy Blue), sturdy, sensible shoes (*If your child has shoes with laces, please ensure that they can do them up. Velcro fastenings are preferable for Reception children.*)
(No boots, trainers, open-toed sandals.)

P.E Kit (Reception – Year 6)

- Trainers
- Royal blue shorts and a white T shirt with / without school logo
- Royal blue jogging bottoms
- Royal blue fleece jacket with school logo
- A P.E bag to hold the P.E kit

Bags

Book Bags: Royal blue book bag with school logo Nursery – Year 2

Backpack: Royal blue backpack with school logo

Pencil Case:

All children in Key Stage 2 are expected to have a pencil case. Year 3 and 4 children must have a clear pencil case. All pencil cases should contain pencil, rubber, ruler, sharpener and gluestick. No felt pens or gel pens are allowed in school.

When is a uniform required?

Children are required to wear school uniform to school and in school, at all times. All children must wear the uniform when representing the school at events off-site. Children must wear the school P.E kit when they are representing Kingfield at inter-school sporting events. Children are at all times ambassadors for the school, and never more so than when larger groups are on school trips. The children should wear the uniform with pride, as it identifies them as pupils of Kingfield Primary School and Nursery.

Jewellery and Make-up

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery in school. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. Ear-ring studs must be plain and not jewelled. All children are welcome to wear a watch and it is encouraged in key stage two. Ear-rings must be removed for PE, in line with Surrey Policy. We suggest that children do not wear ear-rings to school on PE days. Parents are asked that ear piercing should take place at the beginning of the summer holidays in order that children can participate in PE the following term.

Make-up and nail polish are not allowed in school. If children arrive in school wearing make-up they will be asked to remove it. If children arrive in school wearing nail polish they will be asked to remove it that evening.

Haircuts and Hairstyles

We expect all children to take pride in their school uniform and look smart at all times.

- Hair should not be shaved below a grade 2;
- There should be no lines or patterns shaved into the hair;
- Hair should not be dyed in bright colours and should be natural colours only;
- All hair of shoulder length must be tied back;
- Any hair accessories must be small (no large over sized bows) and in plain dark / school colours.

Children with inappropriate hair accessories will be asked to remove them.

Footwear

The school wants all children to grow into healthy adults as well as ensure that all children look smart and take pride and therefore it is school policy that all children wear appropriate school shoes. Children are not allowed to wear boots or trainers during the school day. Trainers are required for PE and playing on the field at lunchtime. Boots can be worn to and from school, if the child changes into school shoes on arrival at school. School shoes must be black or navy blue.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to Kingfield Primary School to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children correctly dressed and ready for learning. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child arrives at school wearing the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair and with their hair appropriate for school.

What if a pupil does not wear a uniform?

The Headteacher will decide what is to be done if a pupil's appearance is judged to be inappropriate. If any pupil arrives at school dressed inappropriately, they will either be asked to change what they are wearing or be given a spare uniform to wear for the rest of day. In the case of an extreme hairstyle, the parent / carer will be spoken to by the school regarding the breach of uniform policy. If the policy continues to be breached, the parent / carer will be asked to collect the child from school. The Headteacher is responsible for enforcing the Kingfield uniform policy and has the full support of the school's governors.

School Uniform Policy and the role of governors

If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should first speak to the Headteacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. The governing body implements the school uniform policy. It works with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the responsibility of the governors to

ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy helps children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hard wearing, safe and practical.

This policy should be read in conjunction with our Inclusion Policy.
