

<p style="text-align: center;">Reading</p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">Suggested timing – 5-10 minutes daily.</p> <p>Please share your child's reading book with them. Use a page in your child's homework log to record any comments when you have done this.</p> <p>These books are at your child's level. They must understand what they are reading as well being able to fluently read the book so ask them questions about what they have read too!</p> <p>Your child might want to write a review of the book they have read in their homework log.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Spellings</p> <p style="text-align: center; color: red;">Suggested timing – 5-10 minutes daily.</p> <p>Practise spelling the words on the list that have been sent out with your child every Friday.</p> <p>You child should look them up in a dictionary so they know what they mean and then write them in a sentence. They can read, cover and write them or speed-write them too.</p> <p>A copy of the Year 5/6 spelling list will be available to access on Showbie. Why not try a hippogriff or even a niffler.</p> 	<p>Photo challenge: – Take a photo of a pet or animal of your choice. Imagine that they are an animagus (a human that can turn into an animal at will) What might that animal look like as a human.</p> <p>Write a description or create a picture.</p>

Could you write a short story to describe the journey you took, or the conversations you had with other wizards on-board.</p> 	<p>Design a new Hogwarts uniform – think about the colours, the patterns and the shape of the costume. You could even think about the material that you would use to create the uniform</p> 	<p>In the third Harry Potter book we are introduced to the patronus charm. Consider what your patronus might look like and describe why you think that your patronus would take the form on this animal.</p> 	<p>Use this grid to support your child by enhancing the curriculum with these extra activities too!
